FLORIDA SET FOR SIMULCASTING? Three hours of meetings between representatives of the majority of South Florida's pari-mutuel venues Friday may have cleared the way for full-card simulcasting in the state. State representative Steve Geller (D-Hallandale) said yesterday, "We had a good dialogue between all the pari-mutuels, and we think we are in a good position to okay a six-month simulcasting experiment. If the Thoroughbred owners and breeders agree to what came out of this meeting, I can get the Secretary (of Business and Professional Regulations, Rick Farrell) to sign the order next week." During Friday's meeting, South Florida's three Thoroughbred tracks, one harness track, two jaialai frontons and three dog tracks agreed to lift a simulcasting ban so pari-mutuel facilities can take full cards from out-of-state. Facilities, whether they are offering a live program or not, can offer simulcasting during the day and remain open into the night as well. "If we can make this experiment work, we could have one of the best pari-mutuel states in the country," said Calder President Ken Dunn. Details of the proposal are still to be finalized.

DERBY DRAW MOVED TO WEDNESDAY

NIGHT Beginning in 1996, the Kentucky Derby post position draw will be conducted on the Wednesday evening prior to the race. The draw will be held at the Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum, and the new schedule will allow ESPN to broadcast the event live as a 6:00 p.m. lead-in to the network's Sportscenter show. All entries for the Derby Day and Kentucky Oaks Day races will be taken 72 hours in advance; there will be no designated scratch time for either card. Also beginning next year, ESPN and ESPN2 will present 15 hours of live Derby event coverage over four days, May 1-4, with five hours on ESPN and 10 on ESPN2, ESPN, Inc. and Churchill Downs, Inc. have reached a multi-vear agreement to provide this expanded coverage leading up to the Kentucky Derby, including the post-position draw, the Oaks, and both preview and wrap-up programming.
