THUNDER GULCH TOPS KENTUCKY CUP

WORK TAB Thunder Gulch (Gulch), the early favorite for Saturday's Kentucky Cup Classic, breezed an easy half-mile in :50 2/5 at Churchill Downs yesterday. "He's never been dominant in the morning, but I consider his work as excellent," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Lukas also sent out Turfway Budweiser Breeders' Cup choice Serena's Song (Rahy) for a half in :48 Monday. "She was perfect," said jockey Donna Barton, who was on board for the breeze. Team Lukas' Coffee Springs (Crafty Prospector), who will join her stablemate in the gate Saturday, went a half in :50, while the barn's Juvenile hopeful Editor's Note (Forty Niner) went a half in :48 2/5, and their Juvenile Fillies prospect Proper Dance (Nureyev) went the same distance in :49 1/5. Pointing for the Kentucky Cup Classic, Wildly Joyous (Wild Again) went fiveeighths in 1:01 from the Churchill starting gate Monday; Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect) went a half in :48 2/5 at Belmont Park for trainer Nick Zito, who also supervised Kentucky Cup Sprint contender Mr. Greeley's (Gone West) half in :47 2/5. The Zito pair will fly from New York to Kentucky today.Kentucky Cup Juvenile runner Roar (Forty Niner), who went five furlongs in 1:00 at Belmont yesterday, is scheduled to van into Turfway today.

KEENELAND MONDAY A colt by Ogygian topped Monday's session of the September Yearling Sale at Keeneland, drawing a bid of \$95,000 from H & H Equine. Consigned by Bayne and Libby Welker, agents for Jeanne Peterson, the bay, named **Deserved**, is out of the stakes-placed mare Shushin (Wajima) and a half brother to stakes-placed Fifth Business. A total of 308 yearlings went through the ring during Monday's session, bringing in \$4,882,800 for an average of \$15,853; last year, 243 horses sold for \$3,463,300, an average of \$14,252. BOUND For The BREEDERS' CUP

NEW YORK REPORT BREEDERS' CUP CLASSIC:

Realistic but undaunted, trainer Nick Zito will once again take on the brilliant Cigar (Palace Music) with three-year-old Star Standard (Risen Star) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup October 7. The colt was a determined second in the Woodward, running on well even after the 1-10 favorite passed him by on the far turn. "When Cigar made his move and took the lead, my horse still fought to come back," said Zito. "He showed a lot of heart, and he came out of the race very good. They've been calling me 'Mr. Persistent' this year--I just keep on trying them. Cigar is the very, very best--he's all the things people have been saving; he's in the class of the great horses. You just hope he'll have an off day, that you'll get lucky. My horse can handle the distance, he runs well at Belmont...I'm very happy with the success he has achieved this year. We'll just go out there and do the best we can." Cigar came back from his facile victory in fine fettle and will be back for the Gold Cup. "I was tilting in that direction even before the Woodward," said trainer Bill Mott. But trainer H. James Bond will head in another direction with Saratoga Cup winner L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra), who will travel across the George Washington Bridge for the GI Meadowlands Cup October 6. "He's doing very good," said Bond of the consistent New York-bred. "We're still pointing towards the Breeders' Cup, but we'll take it one step at a time." Bond will have to line up a new jockey if he does run in the Classic, as there's little doubt that Jerry Bailey will stick with Cigar. "Do you think so?" laughed Bond. "Actually, my phone has been ringing off the hook with agents calling for the mount. But Jerry has done a great iob on L'Carriere; we'll stick with him for one more race, and then we'll have to make a decision."

BREEDERS' CUP DISTAFF:

With Inside Information (Private Account) and Serena's Song (Rahy) set to make their next starts in Kentucky, it looks like trainer Shug McGaughey will have another easy go of it with Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) in the Beldame October 7. McGaughey has now accounted for no less than five distaff Grade I races in New York this year, with the average margin of victory at 7 1/2 lengths.

BREEDERS' CUP SPRINT:

Not Surprising (Medieval Man), undefeated in seven starts at six furlongs, heads the list of New York sprinters--but not by much. The rangy chestnut earned his fourth consecutive graded stakes win in the GI Vosburgh at seven furlongs, outgaming You And I (Kris S.) by a nose, with the late-closing Our Emblem (Mr. Prospector) another nose back in third. The three will meet again in the Sprint. "He's danced every dance and I'd like to give him some time off," said trainer Judson Van Worp of Not Surprising, "I had thought about running him in the Boojum, but with the way he ran (in the Vosburgh), I think we'll wait right here for the Breeders' Cup." You And I, who is now four-for-six at Belmont, was making his first start in two months. "I couldn't be more pleased," said trainer Bobby Frankel of his effort Saturday, "Now it's onward to the Breeders' Cup," One who will not make the Sprint is Lite The Fuse (Buckaroo), who pressed the pace but stopped to finish seventh in the Vosburgh. "He came back alright, but he looks a little tired to me," said his owner/trainer/breeder Dick Dutrow, who added that the Boojum (Oct. 9) is a possibility, but the Breeders' Cup is out. There is a chance that the talented distaffer Twist Afleet (Afleet) could earn an entry in the Sprint. The 4-year-old opened eves with her 10-length win in last Friday's Floral Park H.; trainer John Kimmel will run the speedy miss back in the Gallant Bloom S. October 8. "She has come back to the form we hoped she would," said Kimmel. "If she deserves a shot, we might go that way."

BREEDERS' CUP TURF:

Trainer Dave Donk will saddle Arlington Million winner Awad (Caveat) in the Turf Classic October 7 as he gets ready for the Turf. "He came out of the Million very well," said Donk. "We'll use the Turf Classic as the stepping stone to the Breeders' Cup. We're lucky with this horse--he seems to handle any type of course; the condition of the ground doesn't matter. We just need racing luck and a good pace." The Maryland-bred captured the GI Early Times Manhattan over the Belmont course in June. The Turf Classic will also attract Kaldounevees (Fr) (Kaldoun), the runner-up in Saturday's Man O'War. Trainer Christophe Clement confirmed that Tikkanen (Cozzene), eighth as the favorite in the Man O'War, will run back in the Turf Classic. "I thought he had a very unlucky trip, and he was closer to the pace than usual," said Clement of his race Saturday. "He is usually way out of it and comes up with a run. I also think he needed that race." Signal Tap (Fappiano), third in the Man O'War, is a possible for the Breeders' Cup Turf, but may instead go for the Knickerbocker H. October 27 if he doesn't make the Breeders' Cup cut.

BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE:

Maria's Mon (Wavering Monarch) came back from his victory in the GI Futurity in good shape and will take the next step towards the Juvenile in the GI Champagne October 7. "Everything's perfect," said trainer Rick Schosberg. "He's bright and alert and he can't wait to get back going again. We have a real good horse here." The roan will again face division leader Hennessy (Storm Cat) in the Champagne. That race is also expected to draw Diligence (Miswaki), who broke his maiden in impressive fashion at Saratoga, then suffered a onelength loss in a Belmont allowance September 3. "He couldn't bet better," said his trainer, Nick Zito, who finished second with Louis Quatorze (Sovereign Dancer) in the Futurity. That colt will get the rest of the season off with an eye towards a three-year-old campaign. "He's done a little bit too much," said Zito. "He's highstrung, and most Sovereign Dancers are not as precocious as he has been. But Jerry Bailey said he was on pins and needles going to the gate for the Futurity, and that's not a good sign. He needs to relax." Undefeated Appealing Skier (Baldski), who ran the fastest time ever for a two-year-old at The Meadowlands when taking Friday night's Jonathan Dayton S. in 1:08 2/5, will put his record on the line in the Champagne. "He was amazing (in the Dayton), but we just don't know how good he really is," said trainer Ben Perkins, Sr. The colt will ship to Belmont tomorrow to get ready for the race. "Belmont is a different kind of track..it's wide, and some horses can't handle it. We'll go over there and give him some time to get used to it," said Perkins.

BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES:

Golden Attraction (Mr. Prospector) leads the crop with a record of five wins in six career starts. The filly proved narrowly best over stablemate Cara Rafaela (Quiet American) in Saturday's Matron; she will make her next start in the GI Frizette October 7. Also pointing for that race is Matron third My Flag (Easy Goer), a daughter of Breeders' Cup champion Personal Ensign who trailed early but finished full of run to end up 5 1/2 lengths behind the winner. Said her trainer, Shug McGaughey, "She had been giving us a lot of problems in the paddock, so we schooled her and took the pony with her and that helped. Now I think I can start training her to be sharper, more focused. She will improve off that race." Flat Fleet Feet (Afleet), the winner of the Adirondack S. at Saratoga who came back with a strong second to Golden Attraction in the GI Spinaway, had her first breeze since that race yesterday, going five furlongs in 1:02 2/5. "She's doing fine," said trainer John Kimmel. "She'll come back in six days and breeze threeguarters...she is en route to a start in the Frizette."
