MILLKOM'S FUTURE IN DOUBT Millkom (GB)

(Cyrano de Bergerac), convincing winner of the GI Man o' War S. at Belmont Saturday, suffered what could be a career-ending injury in the race. Already shipped out of New York, he will definitely miss the Turf Classic October 7. "He has a slight tear of the tendon sheath in his right front leg," said trainer Rodney Rash, who took charge of the bay colt for new owner Gary Tanaka after the Man o' War. Rash added that the four-year-old, last year's Highweight in France from 9.5-11 furlongs after scoring 10 straight victories over two seasons, was headed for California where it was likely he would spend time on the farm while plans for his future are decided. "We need to evaluate the injury," Rash continued. "But we will give him a break; give him a chance to heal."

ILLINOIS RACING DATES ANNOUNCED

Arlington International Racecourse was defeated in its quest for a 144-program Thoroughbred meeting Tuesday when the Illinois Racing Board drafted a Chicago Thoroughbred schedule very similar to that of 1994. The schedule calls for Sportsman's Park to conduct 74 programs from Feb. 16-May 11, Arlington to conduct 134 from May 12-Oct. 13 and Hawthorne Race Course to conduct 76 from Oct. 14-Dec. 31. All three tracks were told to race six days per week. Arlington had sought a five-day week and a meeting beginning May 1 and ending Nov. 17, citing the need for a longer meet to generate more simulcast revenue. The board adopted the 1996 schedule by a 7-1 vote with Chairman Gary Starkman the only opposing voice. Starkman said, "Arlington is the best Thoroughbred facility in Illinois. Arlington is one of the premier tourist attractions in Illinois. Arlington is far and away the biggest revenue producer. Arlington has earned the right to race any days between the Kentucky Derby and the Breeders' Cup." Also awarded Thoroughbred dates was Fairmount Park in Collinsville, Illinois. The Fairmount schedule will be comprised of 125 racing dates from March 30 through October 6.

KENTUCKY CUP CLASSIC H.. \$400,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m Bound By Honor (Woodman), who notched his first victory of the year last out when he took the Turfway Park Championship H. at 1 1/8-miles, breezed five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 at Churchill Downs Tuesday. "It was a good work; I was very happy," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "He's going to run hard." Randy Romero has the return call. Along with Thunder Gulch (Gulch) and Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect), Bound by Honor is expected to face Wildly Joyous (Wild Again), Judge TC (Judge Smells), Powerful Punch (Danzig Connection), Tyus (Bold Ruckus) and Count the Time (Regal Search).

TURFWAY BUDWEISER BREEDERS' CUP H.-GII, \$200,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/16m

Mariah's Storm (Rahy), the probable second choice behind Serena's Song (Rahy) in Saturday's event, breezed an easy five furlongs in 1:01 Tuesday morning at Turfway. Winner of five stakes at ages two and three, the four-year-old filly is a perfect two-for-two in '95 with tallies in an Arlington allowance and the GIII Arlington Matron H. Sept. 4. Also scheduled to go postward are Coffee Springs (Crafty Prospector), Cut the Charm (Cutlass), Halo America (Waquoit) and Plenty of Sugar (Ascot Knight). Considered possible for the race are Alcovy (Salutely), Ma Guerre (Lord At War {Arg}) and Sovereign Kitty (Sovereign Dancer).

Friday, The Meadowlands:

PEGASUS H.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m Da Hoss (Gone West), winner of three graded stakes already this year including the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 4, will travel from his base at the Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland for the Pegasus. "He's super; he's in great form," said Joan Wakefield, assistant to trainer Michael Dickinson. "He will breeze three furlongs (Wednesday) and ship in the day of the race. Jerry Bailey will ride." The consistent Ghostly Moves (Silver Ghost), out of the money only once in nine career starts, will be making his stakes debut after taking a Saratoga allowance by seven last out. "He seemed to blossom at Saratoga and that seems to be continuing into the fall," said trainer Mark Hennig. "The track (at Belmont) was a little muddy (Monday) so he went just a two-minute lick; he went a half in :54 and change. That's all he'll do before the race." Also pointing to the Pegasus are MGSW Mr Purple (Deputy Minister), Flying Chevron (Carson City), Hopkins Forest (Gulch) and New York Derby winner Demon Damon (D'Accord).

EVANSVILLE SLEW, SUPREMO TO MAKE THREE-YEAR-OLD DEBUTS Evansville Slew (Slew City Slew), undefeated in his first five career starts, including tallies in the GII Arlington-Washington Futurity and Mathis Brothers Remington Futurity, before finishing ninth in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile, is slated to make his first start since the Breeders' Cup in Saturday's \$150,000 Kentucky Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs. Scheduled to face him is another two-year-old phenom from last year, Supremo (Gone West), who took the GII Norfolk S, and finished fifth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Owned by The Thoroughbred Corp., Supremo has not raced since his ninth-place effort in the GIII Generous S. at Hollywood Park last November. The two colts will face tough competition in their three-yearold debuts. GIII Riva Ridge S. winner Western Larla (Gone West) prepped for the race vesterday, breezing three furlongs in :35 4/5 at Turfway. Also pointing to the six-furlong event are the talented sprinters Boone's Mill (Carson City), Lord Carson (Carson City), Mr. Greeley (Gone West), Old Tascosa (Gone West), Ft. Stockton (Cure the Blues), Sonic Signal (Topsider), I'm Lucky (Crafty Prospector), Hyroglyphic (High Brite) and Oronero (Big Mukora).

KEENELAND'S TUESDAY RESULTS Colts by Magesterial and Irish Tower each brought \$56,000 to top Tuesday's next-to-last session of the 1995 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Walmac Bloodstock, agent, of Lexington purchased the chestnut colt by Magesterial--Buck's Lady (Alleged), while Paul Bach of West Chester, Ohio bought the bay colt by Irish Tower-Chief's Dame (Fit to Fight). During Tuesday's session, Keeneland sold 293 yearlings for a total of \$3,737,300 and an average of \$12,755. This represented an increase of 6.4 percent over last year's corresponding session, when 244 yearlings averaged \$11,988. Tuesday's median price of \$9,500 was up 5.6 percent from last year's \$9,000. The sale concludes today.


