RECORD-SETTING KEENELAND SALE

CONCLUDES Keeneland's annual September Yearling Sale ended Wednesday, setting new records for total sales, number of head sold, average price and individual high price. Keeneland sold 2,958 yearlings during the 10-day auction for a gross of \$130,121,300 and an average of \$43,990, up 18 percent from a year ago. Previous records for gross sales (\$104,709,900) and average price (\$37,171) were set last year. The old record for number of horses sold was 2,913 in 1990. Tuesday, September 12, Prince Ahmed Salman's Thoroughbred Corporation paid a September Sale record \$1.2 million for a bay colt by Deputy Minister--Bold Lady Anne (Bold Josh). The previous record price for the fall sale was \$1.1 million paid by Darley Stud Management in 1987 for Brush Aside, who went on to be a G3 winner in England. The top price for a filly this year was \$600,000 paid by Clarence Scharbauer of Midland, Texas for a daughter of Seeking the Gold out of MGI winner Dontstop Themusic. During yesterday's 10th and final session, 277 yearlings were sold for a total of \$2,394,200 and an average of \$8,643, up 21.9 percent from last year's final session average of \$7,092. Wednesday's highest price of \$92,000 was paid by Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey for a chestnut colt by Dixie Brass--Super Star Stacy (Diesis {GB}). Wednesday's Top Colts and Fillies, p. 4

CRIST, MEYOCKS NAMED NYRA VICE

PRESIDENTS Steve Crist and Terry Meyocks have both been named Vice Presidents of the New York Racing Association, according to NYRA Chairman of the Board and President Kenny Noe. "With the duties I've taken on, it was time to turn over some more responsibility," said Noe, who assumed the chairman's position last week. "Fortunately, we had two ideal people already with the organization in Steve and Terry. These changes are part of the continuing effort to streamline the NYRA and operate it more efficiently." Crist, 38, who joined the NYRA last December as Director of Communications and Development, will continue to oversee NYRA departments including simulcasting, advertising and promotions and publicity. Meyocks, 44, will continue to supervise the racing department, but will also manage the daily operations of the three NYRA tracks. Noe also announced the appointment of Alexander Ingle, formerly a Vice President of the Santa Anita Operating Co., as the association's Chief Financial Officer.

Working Tuesday at Churchill Downs was Oaklawn Park stakes-winner **Tyus** (Bold Ruckus), who went a half-mile in :48 3/5 in preparation for the \$400,000 Kentucky Cup Classic H.

Prepping for the \$150,000 Kentucky Cup Sprint Wednesday was GSW **Hyroglyphic** (High Brite), who drilled three furlongs in :35 flat over the sloppy Churchill Downs surface. Another Sprint candidate, **Oronero** (Big Mukora), a Woodbine allowance winner in his last, breezed three-eighths yesterday at Turfway. Although not officially clocked, jockey Willie Martinez said he went in about :37 with the dogs up.

REMINGTON TO OPEN SECOND SATELLITE

SITE FRIDAY Remington Park's Oklahoma City satellite wagering network will double Friday when the city's second site opens at the Bowling Green Recreation Center in Midwest City. Bowling Green Recreation Center will bring the total satellite locations for Remington Park to four, with additional sites planned in the near future. Three sites have been on line since Sept. 7, opening day of the Fall Meeting. Response from the three sites has been positive over the first seven days of the meet, with total handle reaching \$527,141 Sunday, for an average of \$75,306 per day or \$175,714 per site. The monies wagered at satellite sites represents 7.95 percent of Remington Park's total handle to date.

CORDERO'S RETURN POSTPONED AGAIN The

return of Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr. has been postponed until Sunday, Oct. 1 at El Commandante Racetrack in Puerto Rico, when he will ride **Bandit Bomber** (Prosperous) in a seven-furlong event, the track has announced. The threat of Hurricane Marilyn this past weekend postponed Cordero's first ride since February, 1992, when he sustained multiple injuries in an accident at Aqueduct. It was then announced that Cordero would ride at El Commandante this coming Sunday, but the ride has again been postponed one week. Cordero won the first race of his career at the Puerto Rican oval in 1960.

SEVENTY ON BLOCK AT GOFFS ARC SALE

Seventy horses have been catalogued for Goffs' September 30 Arc Sale at Saint-Cloud Racecourse in Paris, France. A total of nine yearlings, including a three-quarter brother to MG1 winner **Diminuendo** (Diesis {GB}), will be offered at the one-day sale, as well as four broodmares, one weanling and 56 horses-in-training. Horses coming out of the sale to find success in America in the past have included GI Californian winner **Latin American** (Riverman), GI Yellow Ribbon winners **Aube Indienne** (Bluebird), **Queen to Conquer** (Riyahi {Ire}) and **Kilijaro** (Ire) (African Sky {GB}); and GI Bowling Green H. winner **Sharannpour** (Ire) (Busted {GB}); as well as European champion **Urban Sea** (Miswaki), the winner of the 1993 GI Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.
