**PRIVATE TERMS TO CLAIBORNE** The 10-year-old stallion **Private Terms** (Private Account) will be relocated from the Northview Stallion Station in Chesapeake City, Maryland to Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, it was announced yesterday by Northview President Richard Golden. "With the emergence of leading freshman sire **Polish Numbers** (Danzig), we were not sure that both stallions could be done justice at Northview," said Golden, "and moving Private Terms to Claiborne leaves no doubt as to his bright future." Private Terms, winner of the GI Wood Memorial and over \$1.2 million during his racing career, has sired a Grade I winner in each of his first two crops: **Soul Of The Matter** won the Super Derby, while **Afternoon Deelites** took the Hollywood Futurity.

**HICKS NAMED NYRA STEWARD** Dave Hicks will leave his position as Calder Race Course Association Steward to take over as the New York Racing Association Steward, it was announced yesterday. The 66-year-old Hicks has served as a steward in South Florida since 1981, and worked in a similar capacity in New England prior to that time. "Dave is a top racing official and we're happy to have him on board," said NYRA Chairman and President Kenny Noe Jr. "He brings a wealth of experience in the racing industry from hotwalker to steward that he has earned over the past 50 years." Hicks replaces Dick Hamilton, who left the position earlier this year, and will be, in turn, replaced at Calder by Alternate Steward and Starter Charles Camac.

**CHURCHILL DOWNS RAISES RESERVED SEATING PRICES FOR DERBY, OAKS** The Churchill Downs Board of Directors yesterday was updated on the Company's racing and simulcasting operations in Indiana and given a demonstration of in-home wagering technology as part of their quarterly meeting at the Sports Spectrum. Directors also were advised of an aggregate price increase of approximately six percent for grandstand and clubhouse reserved seating on Kentucky Derby and Oaks Days, the first such increase since 1993. The Derby and Oaks price increases, effective beginning 1996, result from some ticket prices being rounded up to an even dollar amount. Other categories of increases were effected to create as much price equity as possible in the various seating areas. General admission prices for the grandstand/infield and clubhouse garden areas will not be affected.

While trainer D. Wayne Lukas won't have to face current Horse of the Year favorite **Cigar** (Palace Music) in the Kentucky Cup, he was the horse on the trainer's mind in the pre-race press conference. "I agonized over it for about 10 days," said Lukas of his decision to run Thunder Gulch here rather than face Cigar in last Saturday's Woodward. "I looked at it and said, 'what is the best thing to do to try to get him Horse of the Year?' In light of everything, I wanted to come here for the Kentucky Cup. Tabasco Cat ran well here last year and ran well in the Breeders' Cup Classic, which was a factor. I want to beat him, but I'm counting on beating him anyway. If we don't, I'll be the first to high-five them all and we'll go down the road to do something else." Thunder Gulch carries highweight of 121 pounds, conceding five to nine pounds to the others.

**INAUGURAL RETAMA MEET ENDS** A total of 420,978 fans attended the inaugural 96-day meeting at Retama Park in San Antonio, Texas, which concluded Sunday, for an average daily attendance of 4,385. A total of \$27,736,734 was wagered on live races at the meeting with another \$17,199,073 on simulcasts for a total of \$44,935,807 in on-track wagering. The average daily handle was \$288,906 for live racing, and \$107,494 for simulcasts. Full-card simulcasting from sites in eight states and from within Texas brought the total handle for the meet to \$75,584,026. "We survived a tough opening meet and we most certainly learned from our growing pains," said Retama Park President Bob Quigley. "We now know our market and Texas racing much better and now we can get to work using real numbers instead of perceived figures to take us into the future." The track's Quarter Horse meeting begins today.
