THUNDER GULCH SET TO CHALLENGE

CIGAR The long-awaited showdown between Cigar (Palace Music) and Thunder Gulch (Gulch) will take place Saturday in the \$750,000 Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park, trainer D. Wayne Lukas confirmed yesterday. The Kentucky Derby winner worked five furlongs in 1:02 3/5 at Churchill Monday, galloping out the six furlongs in 1:16 3/5. Lukas had earlier intended to pass the race and wait for the Breeders' Cup, but said he felt Thunder Gulch needed another start to be perfectly prepared for the \$3 million Classic, Lukas still believes the Horse of the Year issue will be settled in the Breeders' Cup, no matter the outcome of the mileand-a-quarter Gold Cup. "If he wins the Classic, I don't think they can deny Thunder Gulch Horse of the Year," said Lukas. "How could you deny a horse that won the Kentucky Derby, Belmont Stakes, Travers, Swaps and Breeders' Cup Classic?"

GOFFS IRISH YEARLING SALE BEGINS

TODAY Goffs' 1995 Irish National Yearling Sale in Kildare, Ireland kicks off today with its select session, consisting of Hip Numbers 1-190, beginning at 10:30 a.m. Offerings include a Sadler's Wells half-brother to G1 Italian Derby winner and Arc de Triomphe runner-up White Muzzle (GB) (Dancing Brave); a full-brother to Irish 1000 Guineas winner Kooyonga (Ire) (Persian Bold); a full sister to MGI winner Silver Ending (Silver Hawk); a full-sister to French champion Common Grounds (GB) (Kris {GB}); and a full sister to GI Hollywood Turf H. winner Earl of Barking (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}). At 6 p.m. today the first of three open sessions will be held, with the second and final open sessions taking place Wednesday and Thursday. In all, 752 yearlings are slated to pass through the ring, including several by North American-based sires Alleged (4), Blushing John (2), Chief's Crown (2), Diesis (GB) (2), El Gran Senor (4), Red Ransom (3), Seattle Dancer (3), Silver Hawk (3), St. Jovite (2) and Woodman (7). BOUND For The BREEDERS' CUP

FLORIDA REPORT By Frank Carlson

First they say they will, then they won't...then they say they do, then they say they don't...what can ya do? After winning the Super Derby on Saturday, trainer Manny Tortora said Mecke (Maudlin) wouldn't go in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Now Tortora is looking at the 1 1/2-mile Gl Rothmans International October 15 at Woodbine. What--run Mecke at a mile and a half on the grass, then turn around and go up against Cigar in the Classic? Not exactly. If Mecke does well in the Rothmans, Tortora will consider the Breeders' Cup Turf. Mecke already has a second-place finish in the Gl Secretariat on turf at Arlington. The supplemental fee for Mecke in the Turf is \$240,000, \$120,000 less than the Classic.

First trainer Marty Wolfson says he won't run **Chaposa Springs** (Baldski), winner of the GIII Meadowlands Budweiser Breeders' Cup and the GI Test, in the Sprint. Wolfson's afraid of the Sprint's past history. Now word is Wolfson is rethinking Chaposa Springs' future.

Right after winning the \$350,000 My Dear Girl S. at Calder Saturday, owner Leonard Lavin said he didn't think undefeated two-year-old filly **Effectiveness** (Notebook) would go in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies because of her lack of racing experience; she has just two starts to her credit. But upon second thought, trainer Tom Proctor, who sent out One Dreamer to wire the Breeders' Cup Distaff field last November, said he might just look over his options again.

Three horses are definitely going to the Breeders' Cup from South Florida: Seacliff (Valid Appeal), The Vid (World Appeal) and Turf Star (Bet Twice).

Seacliff, who currently sports a perfect four-for-four record, became only the third horse in its history to take all three legs of the Florida Stallion series when he captured the mile-and-a-sixteenth In Reality S. Saturday.

The Vid is trained by Marty Wolfson and came to life a couple of years back when he was moved from dirt to grass...kind of a Cigar in reverse. He was last seen running a respectable third in the Arlington Million; Wolfson has been pointing for the Breeders' Cup Mile since the end of last year.

Turf Star, who isn't a turf star, hasn't thrown a bad race since Labor Day weekend 1994 for trainer Ron MacKenzie. Mackenzie, who learned his trade at the feet of the master, Woody Stephens, now has Turf Star safely tucked away in Creme Fraiche's stall on Belmont's backside. He will make his next start in the Boojum H. October 9. Kristi Chapman will get her firstever Breeders' Cup mount aboard the colt in the Sprint.

PRICES SKYROCKET AT FASIG-TIPTON

MIDLANTIC Yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling Select Sale posted dramatic increases as the average price soared 62 percent to \$23,674, compared with \$14,573 in 1994. The top price of the session was the \$210,000 bid for Latin Dancer, a bay colt by Citidancer out of Latin Puzzle. Consigned by Chanceland Farm, agent, the colt was purchased by Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel, who campaign the top three-year-old filly Urbane, a daughter of Citidancer who also sold at this sale as a yearling. The second highest price was \$120,000 for Notorious Colony, a filly by Pleasant Colony out of Private Fame; consigned by Buckland Farm, Inc., she was purchased by the Siegels as well. The two top bids are the highest ever for this sale. In all, 103 select yearlings sold for a total of \$2,438,400, up 21 percent from 1994, when 138 hips sold for \$2,011,100.

PIMLICO POSTS GAINS AT SUMMER MEET Pimlico Race Course concluded its 42-day Summer/Fall Meet Sunday, showing a 4.7-percent increase in total in-state handle over 1994. Maryland handle for the year is up 6.3 percent; the total handle has grown 18.2 percent in 1995. "We are very pleased," said Pimlico President Joe De Francis, "especially coming off a record year in 1994." Pimlico recorded a total in-state handle of \$75,020,322 this season as compared to \$71,631,207 for the corresponding meet last year. In addition, out-of-state bettors wagered \$35,620,725 on the Pimlico signal, representing a 26.4 percent gain over 1994. The in-state handle was boosted by wagering on the simulcasting menu; Marylanders wagered more than \$47 million on out-of-state signals, a 32-percent jump over last year. While betting on the live card declined, the increase in simulcast wagering more than compensated for the loss. Trainer King Leatherbury led the standings with 18 victories, while Carlos Garcia topped all conditioners with four stakes wins. Larry Reynolds captured the top spot in the jockey standings with 58 wins; Mark Johnston was the leading stakes rider on the strength of three black-type tallies.

GOFFS ARC SALE RESULTS A total of 39 horses brought a total of \$2,189,480 for an average of \$56,140 during Goffs Arc Sale, held Saturday at Saint-Cloud racecourse in France. The sales topper was the three-year-old colt Irish Wings (Ire). Sold to dissolve a partnership, the son of In The Wings out of the French stakes winner Irish Order (Irish River (Fr)) went for a bid of \$168,115 to Bradley Thoroughbred Brokerage.

LAUREL MEET OPENS TODAY Maryland Thoroughbred racing switches to Laurel Park today for the 68-day Fall/Winter Meet, which offers a 33-race stakes schedule worth \$2,735,000. The opening-day feature is the \$35,000 Chase Me S., a seven-furlong event for three-year-olds and up. Laurel kicks off the meet with free grandstand admission and complimentary programs Tuesday; post time for the 10-race card is 1:00 p.m. The track will be dark Mondays and Wednesdays, with simulcast wagering only on these days; there will be racing Columbus Day, Monday, October 9. The meet ends December 31.
