SHEIKH AND CECIL SPLIT Sheikh Mohammed has decided to sever his links with Newmarket-based trainer Henry Cecil. The Sheikh, whose Godolphin operation won Sunday's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with the Saeed bin Suroor-trained Lammtarra (*Nijinsky II), has had horses in the Cecil stable for more than a decade. But the two men have been involved in a somewhat public argument regarding Godolphin's policy of taking their promising juveniles from British yards to spend the winter in the sun of the Middle East, then leaving them with their Dubai trainer for the European racing season. Last year, Cecil lost subsequent Oaks heroine Moonshell (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero Vettori (Ire) (Machiavellian) and St. Leger winner Classic Cliche (Ire) (Salse) to Dubai. It was recently announced that Mark Of Esteem (Ire) (Darshaan (GB)), already named by Cecil as a possible 2000 Guineas colt, would take the same route this year; it has also been alleged by the Sheikh's racing manager, Anthony Stroud, that Mark Of Esteem has soundness problems not revealed to them by the trainer until he was due to join the latest team of Godolphin exports. Said Cecil, "In the circumstances, this is probably for the best. (The Sheikh's) first priority is to Dubai, while mine is to my family, my staff and the rest of my owners."

OAK TREE AT SANTA ANITA OPENS TODAY

Santa Anita's autumn Oak Tree meeting begins its 32day run today. The highlight of the opening-day card is the 27th running of the \$100,000 GIII Autumn Days H. for fillies and mares, the first of eight stakes events scheduled for opening week. The meeting, which runs through November 13, features 28 stakes races worth \$4,050,000. The Oak Tree Racing Association has operated the Oak Tree meetings since their inception in 1969 and is a non-profit entity whose profits are directed toward Thoroughbred enterprises concerned with research, development, care and breeding, with a focus in California. All paid admissions to the track opening day will receive free commemorative steins, ninth in the Oak Tree collectors' series. Hall of Fame trainers Charlie Whittingham and Bobby Frankel are the two all-time leading Oak Tree trainers with 194 and 190 wins respectively. Whittingham, who holds the record for most stakes victories during Oak Tree's 26 years with 66, will be featured on the commemorative steins along with five of his equine superstars. Trainer Gary Jones has decided to send MGISW Lakeway (Seattle Slew) to New York for the Beldame rather than running in Keeneland's Spinster. The four-year-old has started at Belmont just once before, winning the Gl Mother Goose last spring; she looks for her first win since taking the Hollywood Oaks last July.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas shipped a plane full of Preview contenders from Kentucky to New York yesterday. Arriving from Churchill Downs were **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch) (Jockey Club Gold Cup); **Serena's Song** (Rahy) (Beldame); **Hennessy** (Storm Cat) (Moet Champagne) and **Golden Attraction** (Mr. Prospector) (Frizette); the quartet are all rated first or second choice in their respective races. Also landing in New York yesterday was the Andre Fabre-trained **Dernier Empereur** (Trempolino), who is also pointing for the Jockey Club Gold Cup. The four-year-old bested Serena's Song by an impressive 5 ½ lengths in her most recent effort. The filly is set to breeze this morning. Inside Information (Private Account) was scheduled to arrive in Kentucky from New York yesterday for the race.

ALCIBIADES S.-GII, \$200,000a, 2vo, f, 8.5f

Careless Heiress (Runaway Groom), with Craig Perret aboard, worked five furlongs in a bullet :59 3/5 Tuesday over a fast track at Keeneland. The two-year-old filly galloped out three-quarters in 1:13 3/5. "She did it the right way," said trainer Jimmy Croll of the move. "It was a good work." Perret, who was in the saddle last time out when the Colleen S. winner finished fourth in the GI Matron at Belmont, said of that effort, "She was having trouble handling the racetrack that day. She handled this track fine this morning."

OAK TREE INVITATIONAL-GI, \$300,000, 3yo/up, 10fT La Sierra Thoroughbreds' Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}) is on course for a try at his second straight in this race. The six-year-old chestnut was last seen finishing second to Awad in the Arlington Million August 27; he breezed six furlongs in a sharp 1:11 4/5 over the Santa Anita turf Monday, Trainer Rodney Rash will run owner Gary Tanaka's latest acquisition, three-year-old Shemaran (Ire) (Kahyasi). Rash said the colt, a two-time graded stakes winner and first or second in six of seven starts in Ireland, was scheduled to arrive from France yesterday; Gary Stevens, who has been riding in New York, will fly in for the mount. Other probables are Cafe Milano (Fr) (Irish River {Fr}), Black; Gl Hollywood Turf H. winner Earl Of Barking (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}), Almeida; Gl Man o'War runner-up Kaldounevees (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}), No Rider; Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), McCarron; two-time Chilean champ Patio de Naranjos (Chi) (Gallantsky), Delahoussaye; River Rhythm (Riverman), Desormeaux; and French group stakes winner Royal Chariot (Strawberry Road {Aus}), Pincay Jr.

Jeff Lukas said of Othello, "When he pulled up (after working five-eighths in :59 Sunday), it was evident that he wasn't quite right. It isn't career-threatening, but he'll be given a little time off. We're shipping him to Westerly Training Center." SW Cavonnier (Batonnier) is expected to be supplemented to the race: also expected are Exetera (Forty Niner), three-time stakes-placed Desert Native (Roanoke), and Odyle (Aileged), a maiden.

CARNEGIE RETIRED Last season's winner of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) has been retired after a disappointing seventh-place finish in this year's edition of the race. The four-year-old, out of champion and Arc winner Detroit (Fr) (Riverman), won seven of his 12 career starts for earnings of \$1,188,259; he added a victory in this season's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud to his Arc victory. The highweight three-year-old in France last year, Carnegie earned his final win in the G3 Prix Foy September 10. Plans for his stud career have not yet been announced.

AUTOTOTE OFFERS PROPOSITION BET ON
