SADLER'S WELLS COLT TOPS GOFFS SELECT SESSION A bay colt by Sadler's Wells out of the multiple stakes-placed Princesse Timide (Blushing Groom (Fr)) topped Tuesday's select session of Goffs' 1995 Irish National Yearling Sale, held in Kildare, Ireland. Consigned by Camas Park Stud, the colt, a half-brother to MGSW Louis Cyphre (Niniski) and French G2 winner Psychobabble (Ire) (Caerleon), was purchased for \$489,345 by Newgate Stud Company. Bringing the second highest price of \$426,204 was a chestnut filly by Kris (GB)--Sweetly (Fr) (Lyphard). Also consigned by Camas Park Stud, the filly, a full-sister to French Champion Common Grounds (GB) and French stakes-winner Lightning Fire, was purchased by Shadwell Estate Co. Ltd. Overall, 158 yearlings were sold for a total of \$15,052,881 and an average of \$95,271, down slightly from last year's select session average of \$96,122. There were 14 yearlings reported as not sold.

VINERY PURCHASES INTEREST IN STORMY

BLUES Mr. and Mrs. Ben Walden Jr.'s Vinery has purchased an interest in the three-year-old filly Stormy Blues (Cure the Blues) from Harriet and David Finklestein's H & D Stable. Stormy Blues, winner of the GI Matron, GIII Selima S. and GIII Sorority S. last season, has been retired from racing and will arrive at Vinery November 1 to join the rest of the Finklestein's breeding stock. Stormy Blues, trained by Scotty Schulhofer, won four of six starts at two and finished third to champion Flanders in both the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and in the GI Spinaway Stakes. The filly was named 1994 Florida-Bred Champion Two-Year-Old Filly. According to Ben Walden Jr., "Stormy Blues represents an important acquisition for Vinery as she combines three vital ingredients for the top of the market: youth, Grade I talent, and precocity." Mating possibilities for Stormy Blues include Red Ransom, Gulch and Rahy.
