FRENCH DEPUTY MAY SKIP 'CUP' FOR BELMONT SATURDAY French Deputy (Deputy

Minister) may be scratched from tonight's Meadowlands Cup if the rain which has been falling in the New Jersey area since Wednesday continues as forecast, according to trainer Neil Drysdale. The undefeated three-year-old colt has also been entered in the fourth race at Belmont Saturday, a \$46,000 one-mile allowance. "I'm worried about the track conditions in both places," said Drysdale. "This gives us another alternative. I just want to see what the weather does." Drysdale was not concerned about getting the colt ready for the Breeders' Cup off the allowance race. "I think he'd be okay if he were to run at Belmont," said Drysdale. "I'm trying not to lose sight of the fact our primary goal is the Breeders' Cup."

HOLLYWOOD DERBY GETS SPONSOR The 54-year-old Hollywood Derby has been renamed the Crown Royal Hollywood Derby. The announcement was made after Hollywood Park signed a sponsorship agreement with The House of Seagram, a division of Joseph E. Seagram & Sons, Inc. The \$400,000 Crown Royal Hollywood Derby, a 1 1/8-mile grass event for three-year-olds, will be contested November 26 during Hollywood Park's Autumn Meeting, which opens Nov. 15. Inaugurated in 1938, the Derby's rich history includes victories by such champions as Itsallgreektome (1990), Affirmed (1978), Crystal Water (1976) and Swaps (1955).

LARRY THE LEGEND'S COMEBACK ON HOLD

Larry the Legend (Local Talent)'s comeback from knee surgery has been placed on hold, owner/trainer Craig Lewis said Thursday. The three-year-old colt, who gained national prominence early this year after winning the GI Santa Anita Derby and GII San Rafael S., had been in light training for a winter/spring campaign at Santa Anita before suffering a recent setback. "His status is unknown," Lewis said. "We were walking him after a gallop the other morning and we didn't like what we saw." Lewis said the problem is in the colt's left front knee--the same knee from which the Illinois-bred had chips surgically removed this past April, causing him to miss the Triple Crown. "We're in the process of having the knee examined by a least a half-dozen veterinarians and surgeons," Lewis continued. "After that, we'll make a decision regarding the horse's future. This much is for sure; we won't compromise with a valuable horse like him."


