FOURSTARS ALLSTAR TO COOLMORE

Fourstars Allstar (Compliance), winner of the 1991 Irish 2000 Guineas, has been acquired by Coolmore Stud, one of the sponsors of that Irish classic, and will stand at the County Tipperary farm in 1996. The seven-year-old New York-bred has won 14 races, including this year's GII Bernard Baruch H., and more than \$1.5 million. Fourstars Allstar is a full-brother to millionaire gelding Fourstardave, who was retired this past summer at the age of 10; his stud fee has not yet been announced.

OAKS WINNER TO RACE AT FOUR Epsom Oaks heroine Moonshell (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), out of action since her classic success in June, will be back racing in Europe for 1996. The lightly raced filly, winner of a maiden event and third in the 1000 Guineas in her only other runs, is reported completely recovered from the joint injury which cut short her three-year-old campaign.

NEW HEAD FOR AUTOTOTE Autotote has announced the appointment of Thomas C. DeFazio to the position of President and Chief Operating Officer. DeFazio joined Autotote just six months ago as Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer. Before joining the wagering equipment company, he was Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer with Smith Corona Corporation and served as Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of General Instrument Corporation. DeFazio will have worldwide responsibility for all domestic and international operating units.

"We were hoping it would come up the way it did." Turk Passer set the pace briefly in the 13-furlong GIII Seneca H. in his most recent outing August 25, but tired to finish ninth. He fared better in the nine-furlong GII Bernard Baruch H., running second from start to finish.

EPSOM STARTER EYES ROTHMANS Presenting (Mtoto), third in the G1 Epsom Derby, is set to challenge for the Rothmans International at Woodbine October 15. Presenting was made the favorite for this year's St. Leger, but was scratched when the course came up soft. The colt was similarly withdrawn from consideration for races in Italy and Ireland. Owner George Strawbridge is looking beyond the Woodbine race, saving, "I would very much like a Japan Cup invitation for Presenting." A Breeders' Cup Turf bid is also being considered. As the Rothmans gained one possible starter it lost another as Only Royale (Ire) (Caerleon), dual winner of the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, has been counted out of the race. The filly, third to Carnegie in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud in July, has been sidelined with a foot injury, forcing trainer Luca Cumani to call off both her trip to Canada and her possible Breeders' Cup bid. Cumani still hopes Only Royale will recover in time for the Japan Cup, "It's nothing serious at all--just an abscess--but it is taking a long time to clear up. Japan, however, remains a possibility,"

ENGLISH 2000 GUINEAS WINNER ARRIVES AT VINERY Mister Baileys (Robellino) arrived Friday morning at Vinery in Midway, Kentucky, where he will begin stud duties next year. As a 2-year-old, the colt won England's G3 Lanson Champagne S. and the G2 Royal Lodge S. Last year at three, Mister Baileys won the G1 Madagans 2000 Guineas, recording the fastest time in the 180-year history of the race. The stallion will stand for a fee of \$10,000 live foal, payable November 1.

GOFFS WRAP-UP A son of Last Tycoon (Ire)--Perfect Alibi (Ire) (Law Society) brought a bid of \$252,217 to top the Orby II session of the Goffs Irish National Yearling Sale, held Tuesday through Thursday at Ireland's Kildare Paddocks. Consigned by Westerlands Stud, property of Mr. M. L. Page, the colt was purchased by John Ferguson, Esquire. In all, a total of 450 yearlings were sold during the three days of the Orby II session for a gross of \$9,737,273, an average of \$21,638.

NOSEDA HEADS FOR AMERICA Trainer Jeremy Noseda, 31, who has played an important role in the conditioning of Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin string, is now ready to set up a public stable in California. Noseda, former assistant to both John Dunlop and John Gosden, was originally offered the chance to train for the Sheik in France, but turned it down because of difficulties with his application; he expects to have his American operation running after the Breeders' Cup.

SANTA ANITA TO LIMIT TURF RACING Santa Anita track management, concerned that the growth of the new \$2.3 million turf course has been hampered by extremely high temperatures, will reduce the number of turf races originally planned for the 32-day Oak Tree meet which began Wednesday. "Through the end of the month, which takes us through the second condition book, we will only run stakes on the turf course," said Thomas S. Robbins, Director of Racing. "Our intention is to give the course a chance to mature. If all goes well, beginning with condition book three (November 1), additional races will be written daily for the inside oval."


