THUNDER GULCH INJURED, RETIRED

Following an injury suffered in Saturday's Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park, this year's Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch) has been retired. The three-year-old colt will stand alongside his broodmare sire Storm Bird at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. Thunder Gulch's injury, a condylar fracture of the left front cannon bone, marked the end to an exceptional racing career, which had seen the chestnut win nine races and \$2,915,086 in 16 career starts. In addition to the Kentucky Derby and Belmont S., the Kentucky-bred was victorious as a three-year-old in the GI Travers S., GI Florida Derby, GII Swaps S., GII Fountain of Youth S. and Kentucky Cup Classic, and recorded a third-place effort in the Preakness S. He also showed flashes of brilliance as a juvenile, taking the GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct and finishing second in both the GI Hollywood Futurity and GII Cowdin S. "We discovered after the Gold Cup and watching him blow out after the race that he was very uncomfortable," said the colt's trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "There was no filling or heat in his leg, but he looked very uncomfortable--we knew something was bothering him. So we had X-rays taken. After examining the X-rays, we discovered he has a condylar fracture of his cannon bone in his left front. The bone is not displaced. I think it's fair to point out that if you look back in the last decade and pull the records on three-year-olds, he should stand with them. He had a marvelous three-year-old campaign. He danced every dance. People thought he couldn't win the Swaps after the Triple Crown and not only did he win the Swaps, but he won the Travers as well. If there's one thing we want in a racehorse, it is the consistency he had, his heart and the way he tried. He really was a world-class racehorse. This horse is going to have a marvelous stud career." Owner Michael Tabor said after deciding to retire Thunder Gulch, "Obviously, I'm shellshocked. I hoped to run him as a four-year-old. I think the public really enjoyed watching him run. But I think this is the right thing to do."

"It wasn't her best race by any means, but it was a good, hard race for her," said winning jockey Mike Smith. "If she gets away good, she's probably going to be loping on the lead." 3-2 second choice Mariah's Storm, who upset Saturday's GI Beldame winner Serena's Song in the GII Turfway Park Budweiser Breeders' Cup in her last, pressed the pace early then tired to be third in the 4-horse field. "To me, she just didn't act like she was getting a hold of the racetrack," said Mariah's Storm's jockey Robert Lester.

Northern Spur, a G2 winner in France last year, had been 0-for-2 since coming to the U.S., finishing 3rd and 10th in the GI Eddie Read H. and GI Arlington Million in his only 2 stateside outings. Using Lasix for the first time here, the bay colt tracked pacesetter and 4-5 favorite Sandpit to the top of the stretch, where he took over for the victory. Northern Spur was purchased early this year by current owner Charles Cella for \$1.3 million. AFTERNOON DEELITES BACK ON TRACK

Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms), winner of five of seven career starts including the GI Hollywood Futurity, GII San Felipe S., GIII San Vicente Breeders' Cup S. and GIII Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup S., returned to trainer Richard Mandella's barn Saturday and is ready to begin training for a winter/spring campaign. The threeyear-old colt has been sidelined almost five months since being diagnosed with a slight tear in the tendon of his left foreleg. "He came in last night," said Mandella Sunday, "He looks great," Burt Bacharach's colt hasn't started since finishing eighth in the May 6 Kentucky Derby, and had been turned out at Sid Craig's Rancho Paseana in Rancho Santa Fe, California, Mandella said he hopes to have Afternoon Deelites ready to race by the beginning of 1996.

CORDERO TO RIDE AT BELMONT SATURDAY

Angel Cordero Jr. will ride this Saturday at Belmont Park, making his first appearance as a jockey in New York in 3½ years, he reported yesterday morning. Cordero plans to ride a filly he trains, Rogues Walk (Ends Well), in the \$75,000 Ticonderoga H. during New York Showcase Day. The best horse Cordero trains, Roques Walk, winner of seven of 10 starts including the GII Reeve Schley Jr. S. at Monmouth in June, will be among the favorites in Saturday's race. Cordero, 52, expects he will get at least one other mount on the card but, if so, he will have to turn in his trainers license temporarily.

Armand Delaperriere's Honest Colors, trained by Eddie Plesa, goes 11/2-miles for \$100,000; Boulanger has the call. Marissa Olivares' Buck Call, trained by Luis Olivares, will go a mile for a winner's purse of \$40,000; Jose Rivera II is scheduled to ride.
