### LARRY THE LEGEND TO UNDERGO SURGERY

Santa Anita Derby winner Larry the Legend (Local Talent) will undergo surgery this Sunday to have a bone chip removed from his left front knee, owner-trainer Craig Lewis said yesterday. Dr. Wayne McIlwraith will perform the surgery at Dr. Vince Baker's Clinic in Cypress, California. "Dr. McIlwraith will remove the chip and then determine what else, if anything, needs to be done," Lewis said. "It is his opinion that there is a reasonable chance for a full recovery." Larry the Legend had bone chips surgically removed from the same knee in April. The three-year-old colt had recently resumed light training before the latest setback occurred.

## STRONG TURFWAY MEET CONCLUDES

Boosted by top-quality racing and the success of its Race Book facilities, Turfway Park in Florence, Kentucky registered a 29.9 percent increase in total wagering during its recently completed Fall Meet. The meet, which concluded Friday, October 6, was also highlighted by a 21 percent increase in purses--a boost to \$220,565 daily--that placed Turfway among the leading tracks in the country. In addition, Turfway posted a 3.9 percent increase in total on-track attendance. For the 23-day meet, daily averages for total wagering were \$3,082,672 versus \$2,373,048 in 1994. Average ontrack wagering was \$765,006 daily, up from \$633,313 last year. Out-of-state wagering on Turfway's races zoomed 188.5 percent to almost \$25 million from 1994's \$8.6 million. "For our Fall Meet, we had one of our strongest racing programs ever, if not the strongest," said Turfway Park President Mark Simendinger. "Our fans and out-of-state full-card simulcasting bettors responded most favorably to our racing program and provided us with substantial increases over last year's Fall Meet."

LAS PALMAS H.-GII, \$125,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8mT

Twenty-one year-old trainer Casey Maslonka will attempt to post the first graded stakes victory of his career Sunday when he sends out Don't Read My Lips (Turkoman) in the Las Palmas. A \$16,000 claim this past February, Don't Read My Lips has earned \$124,150 for new owners Gary Howard, Mike Shuman and Mike Sokol. Her biggest victory to date was a wire-to-wire score in the \$76,200 Queen to Conquer H. June 25 at Hollywood Park. In another development, defending Las Palmas heroine Aube Indienne (Fr) (Bluebird) breezed five furlongs in 1:02 3/5 at Santa Anita Tuesday. Laffit Pincay Jr. will ride. Also confirmed for the race are Yearly Tour (Half a Year) and Lady Affirmed (Affirmed), with Ask Anita (Wolf Power {SAf}) and Just Tops (Topsider) considered possible starters.

EVANSVILLE SLEW RETIRED Graded stakeswinner Evansville Slew (Slew City Slew) has been retired, trainer Don Von Hemel reported vesterday. "He reinjured that suspensory," Von Hemel said. "It's a recurrence of the same problem that ended his juvenile season." The trainer said the three-year-old colt probably suffered his latest injury in the Sept. 23 Kentucky Cup Sprint at Turfway Park, in which he finished third. As a two-year-old, Evansville Slew, won five of six races and earned \$323,040. His victories included the GII Arlington-Washington Futurity, Mathis Brothers Remington Futurity, Juvenile Breeders' Cup S, at Aksarben and Honest Pleasure S, at Arlington. In his only loss as a two-year-old, he finished ninth at 7-2 odds in the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The colt did not race again until this year's Kentucky Cup Sprint. "He sure had a lot of talent," Von Hemel continued. "But along with the talent, you must stay sound. That just wasn't the case, and it's a real shame." No decision has been reached as to where Evansville Slew will stand at stud.

HAWTHORNE BACK TO SIX-DAY WEEK Starting next week, Hawthorne Race Course will go from a five-day to a six-day racing week. The track no longer will be dark Wednesdays, leaving Tuesdays as the only off day. The five-day experiment by the Illinois Racing Board began February 17, when Sportsman's Park opened the 1995 Chicago Thoroughbred season, and continued during the Arlington meeting. However, in assigning dates for 1996, the Racing Board put all three tracks back on a six-day week. "Because of the number of horses available, horseman and management felt it prudent to race six days," Hawthorne President Tom Carey told the Board in explaining the rationale behind ending the five-day experiment prematurely.


FUTURE STORM WEANLING TOPS OBS WEDNESDAY A chestnut weanling colt by Future Storm--La Delitzia (Diesis {GB}) topped Wednesday's second open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales mixed sale. Consigned by Summerfield, agent, the colt was purchased for \$29,000 by Buzz Chace, agent for Paraneck Stable. The colt is from the first crop by the five-year-old stallion Future Storm (Storm Cat), a GSW in both the U.S. and Italy. Overall, 154 horses were sold yesterday for a gross of \$740,200 and an average of \$4,806, up 19 percent from last year's second open session average of \$4,027. The sale concludes today.

### TATTERSALLS SECOND SESSION RESULTS The

top price during Wednesday's second session of Tattersalls' yearling sale in Newmarket, England was paid for a bay colt by Bluebird--Rise and Fall (GB) (Mill Reef). Consigned by Bruce and Virginia Deane's Bishops Down Farm, the colt, a half-brother to French stakes-placed Danseur Landais (GB) (Damister), was purchased for \$202,985 by C. Gordon-Watson Bloodstock. Overall, 205 lots were sold Wednesday for a gross of \$3,210,408 and an average of \$15,659. The sale continues through Oct. 14.


