CALDER INCREASES PURSES Full-card simulcasting just began in Florida October 1, but the effects are already being felt. Ken Dunn, president of Calder, said purses will increase beginning this Saturday. "We expect to get purses back to where they were before the last cut," said Dunn. Calder was forced to reduce purses when an earlier experiment with simulcasting was halted by state officials. Purses were slashed from \$100,000 a day in early August to the current \$88,000 a day. Since the experiment began, the track has brought in two simulcasts a day which it distributes to 13 interstate outlets. In the first five days, Florida bettors wagered \$2,055,000 more than during the same period last year. "Simulcasting has significantly increased our handle," Dunn continued. "We hope the response continues across the state."

#### TOP RUNNERS SET FOR MARYLAND MILLION

Graded stakes-winners Oliver's Twist (Horatius), Urbane (Citidancer) and Prenup (Smarten) head the list of expected starters in Saturday's 10th running of Maryland Million Day, to be held at Laurel Park. "Top to bottom, this is the best Maryland Million Day ever," said Laurel President Joseph A. De Francis. "We have large, competitive fields and a number of star horses. We're anticipating another great day of racing." The 11-race program, restricted to the offspring of Maryland sires, offers over \$1,000,000 in purses. Preakness S, runnerup Oliver's Twist is expected to vie for favoritism in the \$200,000 First National Bank of Maryland Classic. Gl Ashland S. winner Urbane will make her first start since finishing second in the May 5 Kentucky Oaks in the \$100,000 Baltimore Magazine Maryland Oaks. Last year's GI Jerome H. winner Prenup will defend his title in the \$100,000 BWI Airport Maryland Sprint, and Mz. Zill Bear (Salutely) will try for her third consecutive victory in the \$125,000 USAir Maryland Ladies. In addition, Count On Numbers (Polish Numbers), a twoyear-old gelding from the first crop by his sire, looks for his third stakes victory in the \$100,000 Crown Central Petroleum Nursery.

TATTERSALLS AVERAGE SOARS Both the third and fourth sessions of Tattersalls' 1995 October Yearling Sales were held Thursday. During the morning's third session, 79 yearlings were sold for a gross of \$2,706,194 and an average of \$34,222, up a whopping 73 percent over last year's third session average of \$19,751. The session's highest price of \$121,791 was paid for a bay colt by Mtoto--Hug Me (Shareef Dancer). Consigned by Whitsbury Manor Stud, the colt was purchased by Mr. Gordon Smyth. During the fourth session, held in the evening, a chestnut colt by Lahib--Mother Courage (Busted) topped the bidding. Consigned by Islanmore Stud, Ireland, the colt was purchased for \$178,627 by P.F.I. Cole Ltd. There were 77 yearlings sold during the evening session for a total of \$3,228,596 and an average of \$41,929, up 79 percent from last year's fourth session average of \$23,392. The sale concludes today.


