**ALHAARTH TOPS IN EUROPE Alhaarth (Ire)** 

(Unfuwain) is "almost certain" to be rated Europe's champion juvenile of 1995 after his impressive victory in Newmarket's Dewhurst S. yesterday. Geoffrey Gibbs, the British Horseracing Board's senior handicapper, said he would be "very surprised if a rating of less than 125" was allotted to the colt following his 2 1/2-legth victory in the G1 event. "Unless something puts up a very special performance in one of the races still to come, I would think Alhaarth is virtually certain to be top-rated at the end of the season," said Gibbs. "He hardly came off the bridle to beat previous Group One winners and, although it is just possible that Tagula (Ire) (Taufan) ran a little below his best after his layoff, I think you would have to say the winner was impressive." Britain's bookmakers thought so, offering prices as low as 2-1 for next vear's 2000 Guineas and only around 4-1 for the '96 Epsom Derby. The Guineas is expected to be the colt's first major target next spring.

## RECORD FALLS AT TATTERSALLS OCTOBER

After four days of lively trading, the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale which concluded yesterday established a new record average price and comfortably bettered the sales turnover of the previous three years. A total of 730 lots were sold during this year's auction, bringing in \$20,138,373 for a record average of \$27,585. Last year, 829 Tattersalls October yearlings sold for \$16,418,455, an average of \$19,805. "The general consensus among buyers has been that the yearlings have been of exceptional quality," said Tattersalls' Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The strength of the middle market has, in some quarters, been questioned recently, but it has been alive and kicking this week, and long may it last." The sales topper, sold Wednesday, was a colt by Bluebird--Rise and Fall (Mill Reef); consigned by Bishop's Down Farm of Bruce and Virginia Deane, the bay went for a bid of \$202,985 to C. Gordon-Watson Bloodstock. The top bid from vesterday's fifth and sixth sessions was brought by Ashtown House Stud's colt by Slip Anchor out of Europe's top-rated two-year-old of 1981, GSW Circus Ring (High Top); the half to SW Lady Shipley (Shirley Heights) was purchased for \$138,030 by Mr. W. H. Ponsonby.

ALBAHA (Woodman) acted as pacemaker and set strong early fractions, but Alhaarth was forced to go on when his lead horse could find nothing more. Winning jockey Willie Carson later said, "I shouted at Michael (Hills, jockey of Albaha) to go on, but he couldn't and I had to let Alhaarth go. He paced himself well, but I had to give him a backhander coming up the hill...he showed a lot of speed." The classy Danehill Dancer, previously unbeaten himself, looked superb in the paddock and had every chance in the race but in the end was no match for the winner. Trainer Dick Hern was full of praise for Alhaarth, saying, "He spoke for himself today. This was a great performance. He races so easily, hence his five outings this season. I doubt he will run again this year. I can't remember having a better two-year-old colt; it helps you through the winter having a horse like this. It's good for the staff, too. He is a very exciting prospect for 1996." Alhaarth is now a perfect five-for-five in his career with four Group victories.


