MARIA'S MON OUT OF BREEDERS' CUP

Maria's Mon (Wavering Monarch), who moved to the head of the current two-year-old crop with his win in the Moet Champagne S. October 7, suffered a nondisplaced condylar fracture of the left front ankle during a routine gallop at Belmont Park yesterday morning and will be out for the rest of the year. Dr. Steven Selway operated on the colt yesterday afternoon, inserting screws to stabilize the fracture. "The prognosis is excellent," said trainer Rick Schosberg. "If everything progresses normally, we will aim him for the spring classics. It's a shame. I feel bad for the horse and the Rosenthals." A two-time Grade I winner, Maria's Mon will remain at Belmont for two-tothree weeks, then ship to Hart Farm in Ocala, Florida for the winter.

NYRA SET TO PULL THE PLUG ON

"RACEDAY" The New York Racing Association yesterday gave notice to the New York City Off Track Betting Corporation that it will stop supplying the "RaceDay" television program to homes in New York City in 45 days unless the two organizations can come to an agreement. "Our contract with City OTB expired May 1 and we have been trying for almost six months to reach a fair agreement with them to compensate us for our lost revenue and our additonal expenses in providing this program," said Kenny Noe, Jr., NYRA chair-man and president. "We don't want to pull the plug on this show to New York City, but we simply can't afford to keep losing on-track business to City OTB without proper compensation." New York City OTB President Allie Sherman admitted that the two sides are still far from an agreement, and that the issue may have to be resolved through mediation conducted by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. Whatever the outcome, "RaceDay" will continue to be available in Nassau and Suffolk Counties and in the Capital District. News cont. p2

BOUND For The BREEDERS'CUP

EUROPEAN REPORT By Graham Rock

Quality rather than quantity is the keynote to this year's European assault on Breeders' Cup. Despite the relative suitability of Belmont Park's turf course for European challengers, only half of last year's record 26 runners are expected to cross the Atlantic, but they will be disappointed if they don't bring home at least one of the prizes.

(European invaders captured both Breeders' Cup grass races at Churchill last year, with Barathea winning the Mile and Tikkanen taking the Turf.)

Cigar (Palace Music) might be a cinch to American race fans, but the British believe that **Halling** (Diesis {GB}) is the best ten-furlong horse to have emerged in recent years. He is trained by Saeed bin Suroor, who handles the Godolphin team, and judged on his effortless victory in the Juddmonte International at York, this still-improving three-year-old will make a fight of it if he handles the dirt. He is sure to be an overlay in the betting.

The Europeans are unlikely to have contenders in the Distaff or either Juvenile race, but six could make the Mile, including the versatile 1000 Guineas winner **Harayir** (Gulch), out to avenge Dayjur's unlucky defeat for Dick Hern in the Sprint at Belmont in 1990; Willie Carson rides. **Cherokee Rose (IRE)** (Dancing Brave) with Cash Asmussen, **Poplar Bluff (IRE)** (Dowsing) with Olivier Peslier, **Ridgewood Pearl (GB)** (Indian Ridge {IRE}), **Shaanxi** (Zilzal) and **Sayyedati** (Shadeed), handled by Pebbles' trainer Clive Brittain, are probables.

Hernando (FR) (Nininski) is a Turf runner along with Andre Fabre's pair, the 1994 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Carnegie (IRE) (Sadlers Wells), and this year's Arc runner-up, Freedom Cry (GB) (Soviet Star), who will be carrying the silks of Daniel Wildenstein. "Freedom Cry will be suited by the lefthanded bends at Belmont," said the owner.

Hever Golf Rose (GB) (Efisio {GB}), another versatile filly who has won eight races in five countries this year, was impressive in the Prix de l'Abbaye. She will be joined by the easy July Cup winner Lake Coniston (IRE) (Bluebird), in the Sprint. Lake Coniston has been training round a bend on equitrack. "The turns won't beat him. He's got to go there with a very big chance," said trainer Geoff Lewis.

CHIMES BAND RETIRED Chimes Band (Dixieland Band), a graded/group stakes winner in the U.S. and France, has been retired and will stand the 1996 breeding season at Mr. & Mrs. Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud in Midway, Kentucky. Bred and owned by Fares Farm, the sprinter began his career in Europe, winning the G3 Prix la Rochette as a two-year-old; he shipped to the States for his three-year-old campaign, accounting for the GII King's Bishop S. at Saratoga and the GII Fall Highweight H. over older horses at Aqueduct. The colt raced five times at four, taking the Deputy Minister H. at Gulfstream and running second in the GII A Phenomenon S. in August. Chimes Band retires with a record of seven wins from 19 starts and earnings of \$419,168; he will stand for a stud fee of \$7,500.
