**BREEDERS' CUP PRE-ENTRIES RELEASED** Led by early Breeders' Cup Classic favorite Cigar (Palace Music), defending Classic champion Concern (Broad Brush) and Distaff star Serena's Song (Rahy), 101 horses, including 18 from Europe, have been pre-entered for the 1995 Breeders' Cup Championship. The seven race, \$10-million Breeders' Cup Championship Day will be run Saturday, October 28 at Belmont Park and televised live by NBC Sports (11:30-3:30 p.m. EDT).

**RED RUM DEAD AT 30** Three-time Grand National winner Red Rum was put down vesterday at his Cheshire Stables home in Liverpool, England. The 30vear-old horse was buried under the finish line at Aintree Racecourse, where his record of three Grand National wins and two seconds is unparalleled. He won his first National in 1973, catching Crisp inside the last 50 yards to score in what was then record time. After a win the following year, he scored two consecutive seconds in 1975 and '76, but victory in 1977 brought him an unprecedented and probably unmatchable treble in Britain's most popular jump race. A memorial in his honor is set to be built at the track. Red Rum made his final appearance at Aintree on his 30th birthday this past May 3. "Red Rum had great charisma from the very start of his career over fences," said his trainer, Ginger McCain. "He loved people and the people loved him. We shall all miss him terribly." Jockey Tommy Stack marveled at the reaction to the horse's death. "I couldn't believe a 30-year-old horse could still be so popular," said Stack. "In the 1970's, the Grand National was fading from popularity and he made the race famous again. Now we only appreciate 18 years later what an event it was."

#### BRUNSWICK RETIRED TO OLD FRANKFORT

**STUD** Grade I winner **Brunswick** (Private Account) has been retired and will stand the 1996 breeding season at Old Frankfort Stud in Lexington, Kentucky. The six-yearold horse captured the 66th running of the Gl Whitney H. at Saratoga in 1993, defeating Grade I winners Devil His Due and West By West and covering the 1 1/8-miles in 1:47 2/5, just two-fifths of a second off the track record. A winner in his only start at two, Brunswick went on to capture eight of 21 career outings for earnings of \$412,960. Along with his Whitney victory, he was placed in the 1993 Grade I Jockey Club Gold Cup and the Hialeah Sprint Championship H. Brunswick, who is in the process of being syndicated, will stand for a fee of \$5,000 live foal.


#### LARRY THE LEGEND RECUPERATING FROM

**KNEE SURGERY** Santa Anita Derby winner Larry the Legend (Local Talent) had two chips and a bone spur removed from his left front knee Sunday during surgery performed by Dr. Wayne McIlwraith in Cypress, California. The three-year-old colt's racing career remains uncertain. "I'm cautiously optimistic," said owner/trainer Craig Lewis. "The blessing, if any, is the chips were in an upper joint, which is usually more forgiving than a lower joint. We'll give him the time he needs to recover. We're in no hurry."

#### NEW JERSEY RACING COMMISSION MEETS

The 1996 dates requests for New Jersev tracks were released at Wednesday night's meeting of the New Jersey Racing Commission, held at The Meadowlands. Final approval for the dates requests, which were filed by Oct. 15, will come at the Commission's Nov. 8 meeting. Also accomplished last night was the allocation of the \$568,000 of casino simulcasting special fund money. Atlantic City Racecourse was the main beneficiary; it was awarded \$437,404 to compensate for damage done by casino competition and by the opening of casino racebooks. Atlantic City must use \$270,000 of its allocated funds for 1996 purses. In other business, the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority requested and received approval for simulcasts from New York Racing Association tracks to both Monmouth Park and Freehold Raceway to be halted effective Monday, October 30. This action was taken in response to NYRA pulling their simulcasts from nearby Meadowlands Racetrack. The NYRA signal will continue to be received by Garden State and the Atlantic City Casinos.

THOMAS S. SWEENEY DEAD Thomas S. Sweeney, longtime Louisiana Downs General Manager and Executive Vice President, died at Schumpert Medical Center Tuesday at the age of 77. Sweeney came to Louisiana Downs in 1982 and, after his retirement in April, 1995, had been serving as a consultant to the track. Sweeney began working for the DeBartolo Corporation as a mutuel manager over 25 years ago and has the distinction of serving as General Manager at three Edward J. DeBartolo Corporation-owned tracks: Louisiana Downs, Thistledown and Balmoral Park. "Tom was a wonderful man and a true ambassador for Thoroughbred racing," said Louisiana Downs General Manager Ray A. Tromba. "His enthusiasm for life and dedication towards his profession touched the lives of many of us as he directed Louisiana Downs over the years." A funeral mass is scheduled to be held Friday at St. Jude's Catholic Church in Bossier City, Louisiana.
