CIGAR WORKS FOR BREEDERS' CUP Leading Horse of the Year candidate **Cigar** (Palace Music), looking to cap an extraordinary season by extending his 1995 record to a perfect 10-for-10 with a victory in the Oct. 28 Breeders' Cup Classic, worked six furlongs in 1:15.41 Thursday morning at Belmont. "He went well," said trainer Bill Mott. "Our job is to get him to the starting gate as good as we can get him there. At this point we can afford to be a little conservative with him, mostly because of his race in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. He doesn't need any serious breezes and we can afford to get some rainy weather and still have him fit enough. We've had enough experience with him by this time so it's not much of a guessing game with what we need to do."

INSIDE INFORMATION TO DISTAFF Ogden Mills Phipps' Inside Information (Private Account) will definitely start in the Breeders' Cup Distaff and skip the Classic, trainer Shug McGaughey said Thursday morning. Both Inside Information and her stablemate Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) had been cross-entered in both races. "Most likely, (Heavenly Prize) will run in the Distaff too, unless there is some big change in the make-up of the Classic," McGaughey said. The two four-year-old fillies have won a combined 13 Grade I stakes, but have never raced against each other. In other Distaff news, Lakeway (Seattle Slew), third to Serena's Song (Rahy) and Heavenly Prize in the GI Beldame S. Oct. 7, breezed a half-mile in :46.37 yesterday at Belmont. "I was looking for her to tell me where she was, and I was really pleased with what I saw," said trainer Gary Jones. Jones added that Kent Desormeaux, who rode Lakeway throughout her successful three-year-old campaign last year, will replace Eddie Delahoussaye on the filly for the Breeders' Cup.

FAIR GROUNDS TO OFFER RECORD PURSES

Fair Grounds Director of Racing and Racing Secretary Mervin Munoz has announced a record purse distribution of over \$165,000 daily for the track's upcoming 88-day meeting. The track, which averaged \$156,162 for the '94-'95 season, was able to offer the raise in part due to over \$5 million accrued in the Fair Grounds purse account based on the track's simulcast handle from its OTBs over the summer. The '95-'96 meet begins November 23.

RECORD NUMBER FOR KEENELAND SALE The 1995 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, to be held Nov. 11-21, has attracted a record number of entries--3,844. Included in that number are a record 1,562 weanlings. Sessions will start at 10 a.m. daily. The Frances A. Genter Stable will disperse its breeding stock, weanlings, yearlings and two horses of racing age during the first session Saturday, Nov. 11. Gaines-way Farm will act as agent in selling the Genter horses. Among the twenty-seven broodmares part of the Genter dispersal is Gana Facil (*Le Fabuleux), the dam of 1990 Kentucky Derby winner Unbridled. She's in foal to Seeking the Gold. Mares will be sold in foal to such prominent stallions as Sadler's Wells, Mr Prospector, Danzig, Storm Cat, Nureyev, Woodman and Gulch. His resignation from Arlington is effective Tuesday.


ROBERT VAN WORP JR. NAMED TOBA
