SANTA ANITA DERBY PURSE INCREASED

When the field goes postward for the GI Santa Anita Derby this coming April 6, there will be \$1 million on the line. According to Thomas S. Robbins, Santa Anita's Director of Racing, "The Santa Anita Derby has long been one of the country's most prominent races and we feel this increase will make it even more appealing to owners and fans alike. The million-dollar purse puts it in very select company. Other than the Breeders' Cup, it will become one of only six million-dollar races in the country." In addition to the Santa Anita Derby, two other Triple Crown prep races have increased in purse. The San Rafael, scheduled for March 2, will be worth \$200,000 and the March 17 San Felipe will have a purse of \$250,000. The early nomination fee of \$500 for the Santa Anita Derby is due Dec. 1 and will automatically make the nominee eligible to the San Felipe and San Rafael.

SRI PEKAN RETIRED Sri Pekan (Red Ransom). officially the third-best European juvenile of 1994, has been retired. Sri Pekan scored five times in six outings as a two-vear-old last season; his wins included the Coventry S. at Royal Ascot, the Richmond S. at Goodwood and the Champagne S. at Doncaster. Europe's International Classifications saw him officially rated at 122 pounds, behind only Celtic Swing (130) and subsequent 2000 Guineas hero Pennekamp (124). But, after being fancied by connections to take the Newmarket Classic, Sri Pekan was hit by a muscular problem which he has failed to shrug off. It is this injury that has now caused his retirement. Trainer Paul Cole said, "Nothing has been finalized about Sri Pekan's stud career yet. But, of several possibilities, we are leaning towards a stud in America."

DODGE TO WALMAC Graded-stakes winner Dodge (Mr. Prospector), who has been standing at Haras Santa Maria de Araras in Brazil, is scheduled to arrive at Lexington's Walmac International in December for 1996 stud duty. Dodge, whose dam is GIII winner Storm Star, a full sister to the dam of 1994 champion Flanders, won or placed five times in seven starts including a win in the GIII Best Turn S. and a third behind Fly So Free in the GIII Riva Ridge S. From a short first crop of two-year-olds, Dodge has sired two winners from three starters; he will stand for a fee of \$3,500.
