JADE FLUSH INJURED, RETIRED William Condren, Joseph Cornacchia and Allen Paulson's Jade Flush (Jade Hunter) suffered a career-ending injury Monday morning, apparently taking a bad step at the conclusion of a five-furlong work in 1:01 4/5 on Belmont Park's main track at 6:45 a.m. According to Dr. Jim Hunt, the four-year-old filly suffered a fairly severe condylar fracture of the right foreleg. She will be flown to Kentucky Wednesday morning to be operated on by Dr. Larry Bramlage, said her trainer Nick Zito. "Her exercise rider Eddie Cruz said she took a misstep," said Zito. "It was a little wet, which is what she loves. If you want to theorize, it's possible she overtried last time against Inside Information (in the Spinster) and weakened herself. It's unusual though. She's an older filly and you might expect a tendon or an ankle or a knee, but not that. It's a shame, because she was getting good." Jade Flush, who had been pre-entered in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Distaff, won last year's GII Rare Perfume H. at Belmont and placed in six other graded stakes. She retires with eight wins from 29 career starts for earnings of \$481,518.

NO INJURIES IN OLD FRANKFORT FIRE A fire Sunday night at Old Frankfort Stud in Lexington, Kentucky destroyed the breeding shed but caused no injuries to horses or humans. The fire broke out shortly before 6:30 p.m. but firefighters contained it within an hour. While the official cause of the fire has not been determined, officials theorized that a lawn mower parked on some freshly laid bark could have touched off the blaze. "One of the maintenance people had been cutting grass," said Old Frankfort owner Jim Plemmons, "and they think it was a case of one of those freak things where the exhaust pipe was hot and it could have caused the bark to smolder." Plemmons said no horses are kept in the breeding shed; the stallions reside in a separate stallion barn. Plemmons said the new breeding shed will be under construction by Friday.

EUROPEANS ARRIVE FOR BREEDERS' CUP After an uneventful 71/2-hour flight, five Breeders' Cup-bound horses from France arrived safely at Belmont Park Monday afternoon. The flight, which originated at Beauvais Airport in France, was carrying Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) (Turf), Poplar Bluff (GB) (Dowsing) (Mile), Freedom Cry (GB) (Soviet Star) (Turf), Shaanxi (Zilzal) (Mile) and Cherokee Rose (Ire) (Dancing Brave) (Mile). Rifapour (Ire) (Shahrastani), pre-entered in the Breeders' Cup Turf, has a low-grade fever and did not ship. In addition, nine Breeders' Cup hopefuls from England flew into New York from Stansted Airport yesterday. They were Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) (Mile), Hever Golf Rose (GB) (Efisio (GB)) (Sprint), Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed) (Mile), Harayir (Gulch) (Mile), Lake Coniston (Ire) (Bluebird) (Sprint), Owington (GB) (Green Desert) (Sprint), Soviet Line (Ire) (Soviet Star) (Mile), Winter Quarters (El Gran Senor) (Juvenile), Tamure (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) (Turf) and Halling (Diesis {GB}) (Classic). The connections of Nicolotte (GB) (Night Shift) (Mile) did not feel he would draw into his race as the fourth alternate, and thus he did not ship. Upon their arrival, the English and French horses had blood drawn at the track by USDA officials; the blood will be shipped to the lab in Ames, lowa for testing. The horses will remain in quarantine Tuesday and be able to go out to the track Wednesday morning.

Also working at Belmont was Jockey Club Gold Cup runner-up Unaccounted For (Private Account), who went a half-mile in :47 4/5.

WORKS: Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), winner of the GI Oak Tree Invitation in his last start Oct. 8, breezed five furlongs over Belmont's soggy turf course (dogs up) Monday in 1:05. Scotty Schulhofer-trainees Turk Passer (Turkoman) and Signal Tap (Fappiano) worked over Belmont's wet-fast main track yesterday. Turk Passer cruised a half-mile in :48 4/5, galloping out five furlongs in 1:00 2/5, while Signal Tap breezed five-eighths in 1:02. "They both looked good and did it very nice and easy," Schulhofer said.

JUVENILE:

WORKS: Three D. Wayne Lukas trainees prepped for the Juvenile Monday at Churchill Downs. GII Breeders' Futurity winner Honour and Glory (Relaunch) went a half-mile in a bullet :47 2/5; GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile winner Editor's Note (Forty Niner) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 flat; and GI Hopeful S. victor Hennessy (Storm Cat) covered five-eighths in 1:01. Lukas listed the colt's probable jockeys for Saturday: Jerry Bailey on Editor's Note; Gary Stevens on Honour and Glory and Donna Barton on Hennessy. Sampras (Secret Hello), winner of a turf allowance at Keeneland Oct. 12, worked five furlongs in 1:00 over Belmont's training track Monday. "He's named for the tennis player...big and gangly," said trainer A. Peter Perkins. Jockey Robbie Davis, who rode Sampras for the first time during yesterday's workout, will also be aboard in the Breeders' Cup. Working five furlongs over Belmont's main track yesterday were Exetera (Forty Niner), who covered the distance in :59 4/5; Unbridled's Song (Unbridled), who went in :59 and change; Diligence (Miswaki), who went in 1:00.14; and Blushing Jim (Blushing John), who went in :59.

MILE:

WORKS: Last year's Mile runner-up Johann Quatz (Fr) (Sadler's Wells), seventh on the preference list for Saturday's running, breezed five furlongs over Belmont's yielding turf course (dogs up) in 1:07 Monday. MGSW Savinio (The Minstrel), who has not raced since finishing third in the GII American H. at Hollywood July 4, worked five-eighths Sunday at Santa Anita in 1:00 3/5. Wild Zone (Wild Again), a MSW at Woodbine in '95, breezed six furlongs at the Ontario oval yesterday in 1:14. "I would love to see him get in," said trainer Daniel Vella. The five-year-old horse is currently listed as the 10th alternate for the Mile.

DISTAFF:

WORKS: Serena's Song (Rahy), whose career earnings already top \$2.1 million, drilled five furlongs in a bullet:59 4/5 at Churchill Downs yesterday; jockey Donna Barton was in the irons. Barton said when Serena's Song worked, there was another horse a sixteenth of a mile in front of her "and she ran that horse down through the stretch. (Serena's Song) was happy to have a horse in front of her to run down. She worked very, very impressively." Borodislew (Seattle Slew) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 over Belmont's main track Monday morning; the five-yearold will be trying for her fifth straight stakes victory Saturday. Also working at Belmont yesterday was Golden Klair (GB) (Damister). "She went six furlongs very nicely in 1:16," said Tim Pinfield, assistant to trainer Darrell Vienna.

HEAVENLY PRIZE LIKELY FOR DISTAFF: "Unless something drastic should happen to some of the horses in the Classic," said trainer Shug McGaughey, (Heavenly Prize {Seeking the Gold}) will run in the Distaff with Inside Information (Private Account). Both of these horses are running in the Distaff to win. This is not a situation where one will run as a rabbit for the other."

THE ANGLE: Serena's Song and Forested (Country Pine) are the only three-year-old fillies pre-entered in this year's Distaff. In 11 prior runnings, only three three-year-olds have won the race: Sacahuista in 1987; Dance Smartly in 1991 and Hollywood Wildcat in 1993. All three were later presented with Eclipse Awards as Champion Three-Year-Old Filly.

Golden Gear (Gulch), 7½-length winner of the six-furlong Phoenix S. at Keeneland in his last outing, worked a half-mile in ":47 and change" at Keeneland yesterday, according to trainer Noel Hickey. Also working for the Sprint Monday were three-year-old Mr. Greeley (Gone West), who zipped five furlongs over Belmont's wet fast track in a bullet:58 4/5; and Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor), who breezed a half-mile in :49 1/5 at Santa Anita. Third alternate Goldminer's Dream (Crafty Prospector) drilled five-eighths in :58 3/5 at Pimlico Sunday.

JUVENILE FILLIES:

WORKS: Jockey Donna Barton was aboard trainer D. Wayne Lukas's three Juvenile Fillies candidates Monday morning for their workouts at Churchill Downs. Both Gl Oak Leaf S. winner Tipically Irish (Metfield) and GII Alcibiades S. winner Cara Rafaela (Quiet American) breezed half-miles in :48 2/5, while three-time GI winner Golden Attraction (Mr. Prospector) drilled five furlongs in 1:00. "The three fillies were equally impressive," Barton said. "I think Golden Attraction still stands out. She's just very, very impressive to be on." Lukas said Mike Smith will most likely ride Tipically Irish Saturday, with Pat Day aboard Cara Rafaela and Gary Stevens on Golden Attraction. Flat Fleet Feet (Afleet) breezed five furlongs over Belmont's training track Monday in 1:01 1/5; jockey Robbie Davis was in the irons. Also prepping for the Juvenile Fillies yesterday was the undefeated Classy 'n' Bold (Cutlass), who went five-eighths over a fast Churchill Downs surface in 1:01 2/5; the Floridabred will be making her stakes debut Saturday.

TEXAS SALE RESULTS The Texas Thoroughbred Association held its Fall Mixed Sale Sunday at the Will Rogers Equestrian Center in Fort Worth. There were 216 horses sold for a gross of \$698,550 and an average of \$3,234, up 34.6 percent from the 1994 average of \$2,402. The median price was \$1,500. The sales topper was the 10-year-old bay mare Stormy Beauty (Storm Bird). Consigned by Straus Medina Ranch, Stormy Beauty was purchased for \$34,000 by Mark Dixon.

EMPEROR JONES TO STUD Emperor Jones (Danzig), winner of last year's G2 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury, has been retired from racing and is to take up stallion duties in 1996 at Fares Stables in Hertfordshire, England. A covering fee has yet to be decided by stud owner Issam Fares. The five-year-old, also victorious in the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket in 1993, achieved his most prestigious victory while carrying Sheikh Mohammed's colors. This year, which he opened with success in a handicap in Dubai, Emperor Jones has been a member of the Godolphin team. He made his final appearance in Newmarket's G2 Challenge S. two weeks ago, finishing seventh. The Kentucky-bred retires with four wins in 20 career starts for earnings of \$247,789.

OJC TASK FORCE ESTABLISHED The Ontario Jockey Club, which owns and operates Woodbine. Fort Erie and Mohawk Raceway, has set up a nineperson task force to study the state of its racing operations. The task force includes several high-ranking members of the OJC's board of trustees, including President and C.E.O. Pat Keenan and Chairman George Hendrie. It has outlined four specific areas in which to concentrate, including: the future governing of the OJC, the organization's financial structure, coexistence of its Thoroughbred and Standardbred operations and racing regulations. The OJC is currently carrying a debt of more than \$50,000,000 Canadian, and was forced to sell Greenwood Racetrack earlier this year for a reported \$25 million to reduce that debt load. The OJC is expected to lose some \$7 million this year. Keenan plans to step down early next year and a search for his replacement is already underway.
