HOUSEAFIRE INJURED The promising two-year-old colt Houseafire (Housebuster), who prevailed by a nose in last Sunday's \$209,500 Mathis Brothers Remington Futurity, has suffered a fractured cannon bone that will sideline him for at least six months. The fracture required surgery Monday and screws were put in place to secure the bone. Owned by Margaret du Pont and Margaret Bloss, Kentucky-bred Houseafire won five of seven races, including three stakes, in his juvenile campaign for earnings to date of \$227,908.

LEFT TAKES OFF FOR USA Take A Left (Formidable), purchased for a record 160,000 guineas at Tattersalls' Newmarket Horses In Training Sales Tuesday, is to continue his racing career in America. Bloodstock agent John Ferguson, whose final bid broke the previous high fetched by Swing Low in 1993, is unable yet to reveal his client. He confirmed Wednesday that the two-year-old colt will race in the U.S. wearing the colors of an owner with horses on both the East and West coasts. Take A Left finished second to Tagula (Ire) (Taufan) in the G3 July S. at Newmarket, third to Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib {Ire}) in the G2 Gimcrack S. at York and third again behind early 2000 Guineas favorite Alhaarth (Ire) (Unfuwain) in last month's G2 Laurent-Perrier Champagne S. over seven furlongs at Doncaster.

HOLLYWOOD PARK HIRES ASSISTANT

RACING SECRETARY Doug Bredar has been hired as assistant racing secretary and stakes coordinator at Hollywood Park, Racing Secretary Martin Panza announced yesterday. Bredar, 33, has served as assistant racing secretary at Atlantic City, Hoosier Park and Sportsman's Park. The native of Des Plaines, Illinois has also worked as stakes coordinator at Arlington International, Calder, Gulfstream and Hialeah. "Doug will be a tremendous asset to our office," said Panza. "He has a lot of East Coast connections and, with his help, we hope to recruit more stakes horses based in the Midwest and the East." In the off-season, Bredar will continue work as stakes coordinator and placing judge at Gulfstream Park in Florida. "This is a tremendous opportunity," Bredar said. "I feel privileged to work for a class organization like Hollywood Park and R.D. Hubbard. I look forward to assisting in the continued success of the track."

FIELDS DRAWN FOR 1995 BREEDERS' CUP Cigar (Palace Music), currently riding on an 11-race winning streak, has been made the shortest-priced morning-line favorite in the 12-year history of the \$3 million Breeders' Cup Classic, to be run Saturday at Belmont Park. The draw was held Wednesday morning. NBC-TV will televise the seven-race, \$10-million extravaganza for the 12th straight year from 11:30 a.m. (EDT) to 3:30 p.m.

EUROPEAN HORSES STRETCH LEGS Most of the European contingent for the 12th Breeders' Cup took to the Belmont track Wednesday. Blood drawn from the French horses was approved Tuesday night with a phone call from the USDA, and the British contingent was cleared at about 8:30 Wednesday morning. First to leave the quarantine barn was Cherokee Rose (Ire) (Dancing Brave) (Mile), who accompanied Hernando (Fr) (Niniski) (Turf) for six furlongs of light exercise on the main track. Trainer Andre Fabre's trio of Freedom Cry (GB) (Soviet Star) (Turf), Poplar Bluff (GB) (Dowsing) (Mile) and Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) (Turf) followed. Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (Indian Ridge) (Mile), Harayir (Gulch) (Mile) and Tamure (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) (Turf) went to the turf course, the latter dropping his rider near the finish line but being recaptured by him quickly. The other English horses were on the track as well, with Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed) (Mile) and Hever Golf Rose (GB) (Efisio) (Sprint) walking through the gate to satisfy the starter. Halling (Diesis {GB}) (Classic) was asked for the most by his connections, going once around the one-mile training track at a steady canter.

CALIFORNIANS ARRIVE IN NEW YORK The last Southern California-based contingent of Breeders' Cup horses left early Wednesday morning from the Ontario, California airport on their flight to New York. The travellers included Track Gal (Track Barron) (Sprint), Soul of the Matter (Private Terms) (Classic), Top Rung (Seattle Slew) (Distaff) and Earl of Barking (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}) (Mile).

"I think he's doing awfully well," Mott said. "He was strong today. He was aggressive, on the muscle."

WORKS: Jed Forest (Gold Alert), a Group 1 winner in Panama, breezed five furlongs in 1:01 at Belmont vesterday. In his only U.S. appearance, the four-year-old colt was sixth in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 7.

THE SCOOP: Asked if he were disappointed that top European threat Halling (Diesis {GB}) had the misfortune to run into Cigar (Palace Music) on his first trip to America, Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford said that, on the contrary, he was looking forward to the rivalry. "It's great for the Breeders' Cup and it's going to be fantastic race," said Crisford. "It's not a two-horse race. There are a lot of other horses who have to be considered. If our horse reproduces his best form, and we think he will, he'll fit in well. We believe he will run a great race and hopefully, whatever the outcome, there will be rematch next March in Dubai."

WORKS: With jockey Gary Stevens up, Celtic Arms (Fr) (Comrade in Arms {GB}) breezed a half-mile over Belmont's soft turf yesterday in :50 4/5. "He's coming up to the race perfect," trainer Rodney Rash said. The four-year-old colt is winless in nine starts since taking the 1994 French Derby. Also breezing over the soft turf yesterday was Flitch (Demons Begone), who went a half-mile in :50 4/5. Arlington Million winner Awad (Caveat) breezed over the fast main track Wednesday, going a half-mile in :48 4/5. "When he works like this, he usually runs well," said Awad's trainer David Donk. "I wasn't looking for him to be quite this sharp."

THE ANGLE: Two previous Turf winners were not running in the Breeders' Cup for the first time when they made it to the winner's circle. Great Communicator was making his second Turf appearance when he cruised to a 1/2-length victory in 1988; the gelding had finished 12th the previous year. The third time was the charm for 1987 hero Theatrical (Ire), who had suffered defeats in the race in both '85 and '86. Three entrants in this year's field have appeared in the Breeders' Cup before. Alice Springs (Val de l'Orne {Fr}) was fifth in the '94 Mile; Celtic Arms (Fr) (Comrade in Arms {GB}) was 10th in the '94 Turf; and Hernando (Fr) (Niniski) was 10th in the '93 Turf and sixth in last year's running.

It'll pay to respect his opinion and pick Honour and Glory on top. He's another Lukas horse who has been lightly raced and should be ready for a career best effort after a solid performance in the Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland. Hennessy is the most accomplished starter in the field and should improve off his sixth place finish in the Champagne, when he raced part of the way along the infamous Belmont dead rail. Appealing Skier (Baldski) might just be the fastest horse in the field and shouldn't be overlooked. He's looked fantastic in his three career starts. The only knock is that he has never been beyond 71/2 furlongs and may not be bred to handle this distance.

DA HOSS TO SPRINT: Wednesday morning trainer Michael Dickinson pulled off a mild surprise by calling for a last minute change in plans and entering Da Hoss (Gone West) in the Sprint, his second preference, rather than the Mile. "The decision was based on the soft turf," said Dickinson, who recommended not to run over soft turf but ultimately left the decision up to owners Prestonwood Farm & Wall Street Racing. "My horse is a beautiful mover. He needs a fast course, turf or dirt." The three-year-old gelding breezed three furlongs Wednesday morning at Fair Hill in Maryland. Undefeated in four starts at six furlongs, Da Hoss set the fastest recorded time ever for a two-year-old going six furlongs when he stopped the timer at 1:07 1/5 last October at Turf Paradise.

THE ANGLE: European runners are one-for-19 in the Sprint. The lone winner was Sheikh Albadou (GB), who took the 1991 edition at 26-1. The only other to ship across the Atlantic and hit the board was the unlucky Dayjur, who looked a certain winner in 1990 before he jumped a shadow in the Belmont stretch and ended up second to the filly Safely Kept as the 2-1 favorite.



Wayne Lukas will win it; the only question is with which of his three standout fillies. Golden Attraction (Mr. Prospector), a winner of five stakes races this year. is the obvious pick on paper; however she has looked vulnerable in her last two starts and could be a filly who has peaked too soon. Take a chance that she'll be upset by stablemate Cara Rafaela (Quiet American), who has improved in each of her last three starts and may have an even better race in her. She nearly beat Golden Attraction in the Matron and followed that up with a strong effort in the Alcibiades. The rail has been dead all meet at Belmont, meaning that Cara Rafaela's one post might be a problem. It may just be a clean sweep for Lukas as Tipically Irish (Metfield) also comes in with strong credentials and will be the third pick behind her two previously mentioned stablemates.

BARRETTS FALL MIXED SALE CONCLUDES

A total of 592 horses brought a gross of 6,283,750 guineas (\$1,041,834) and an average of 10,614 guineas (\$17,597). The average was up 20 percent from last year, when 779 horses sold for an average of 8,819 (\$14,621).

BREEDERS' CUP TRIVIA:

HOME TRACK ADVANTAGE:

Prepping for the Breeders' Cup over the host track has only been a factor three times--when the event was held at Santa Anita in 1986 and 1993 and at Belmont in 1990. A total of 32 starters had run at Santa Anita last out in 1986, and they took two of the seven Breeders' Cup races. The 1990 Breeders' Cup saw 35 runners prep at Belmont; they found their way to the winner's circle three times that day. But the home-track advantage was most obvious in 1993; 25 horses got ready with a race at Santa Anita, and five of them came home winners on Breeders' Cup Day.

THE ODDS ON MOTT:

Cigar (Palace Music) will become the third horse to go postward as a Bill Mott-trained Breeders' Cup favorite. The other two favorites both ran in the Turf -- Theatrical won the '87 Turf as the 9-5 favorite and Paradise Creek, the 4-5 choice in last year's running, finished third. Mott had one previous starter in the Breeders' Cup Classic when Chief Honcho ran eighth in the 1991 edition. Ten of Mott's 14 Breeders' Cup starters have gone off at greater than 10-1, including his 1992 Turf Champion Fraise who went off at odds of 14-1.

BREEDERS' CUP BEST BET:

You and I (Kris S.) fits the profile of a horse who wins this kind of race. He's a Grade I winner who has won at a middle distance. And, he's won at Belmont before. He had a great gut tightener of the layoff in his last start and has worked solidly since. Bobby Frankel is 0-for-16 in the Breeders' Cup. He's due!
