MARIA'S MON ON THE IMPROVE Grade | Futurity and Champagne winner Maria's Mon (Wavering Monarch) is recovering well from surgery to repair a condylar fracture of his left front ankle, according to his trainer, Rick Schosberg. "He is doing fantastic, and this has been called one of the better post-operative situations any horse has ever been in," said Schosberg, "He is standing square on the leg, and every day his percentage for recovery is better and better. In about two to three weeks, we'll ship him to Florida to the Hart Farm in Ocala. The Triple Crown might be rushing it--it all depends on the horse--but we are looking to get two races into him before the Travers, one of the them being the Riva Ridge, if all goes well." Schosberg also took offense to comments he said trainer D. Wayne Lukas had made about his colt. "I read a statement that Lukas made saying it was ludicrous for Maria's Mon to even be in the hunt for the two-year-old championship," said Schosberg. "I understand he is trying to do the right thing and campaign for his horses, but to say that Maria's Mon isn't in the hunt for the championship is just ridiculous. After the Breeders' Cup, I can't control what happens. But, for now, Maria's Mon is the top twoyear-old in the country."

NEW YORK LIMITS UNCOUPLING OF

ENTRIES TO STAKES New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman Jerry Bilinski announced Thursday that the Board unanimously decided that uncoupling of entries will continue on a limited basis and will now apply only to stakes races. The experiment to uncouple entries trained by the same trainer but owned by different individuals began in February 1995. This past May 12, it was extended to allow full consideration of the issue by Dr. Bilinski, who was appointed to his post earlier that month. "This policy will protect the betting public as well as allow for potentially larger fields in stakes races where field size is more often a problem," Chairman Bilinski stated. The decision to limit uncoupling was made by the Board after widespread canvassing of bettors at the racetracks and off-track betting facilities, horsemen and track management. There will be no uncoupling in maiden, allowance or claiming races.

THE EYES HAVE IT: Allen Paulson told reporters that trainer Charlie Whittingham said a good horse beats the others by looking them in the eye, and Paulson said his Cigar (Palace Music) more than measures up. "He's just so bright the way he looks around," said Paulson. "He has a helluvan eye on him. He looks at every horse." But perhaps most important to aviation magnate Paulson: "He even looks up the air at the airplanes."

OVERHEARD: Asked by a reporter whether Soul of the Matter (Private Terms)'s mid-day arrival Wednesday wasn't a bit late, trainer Dick Mandella replied, "We took a plane--we didn't come by bicycle. It shouldn't be a problem."

THE ANGLE: Jockey Jerry Bailey, who will ride the favorite in this race for the first time when he boots Cigar (Palace Music) out of the gate, has won more Classics than he has lost. The Hall of Famer had only one mount in the first seven runnings of the race, finishing last with 26-1 Herat in 1986, but he has now won three of the last four editions, with Black Tie Affair (Ire), 4-1, '91; Arcangues, 133-1, '93; and Concern, 7-1, '94. His winning percentage in the race is 60 percent.

JUVENILE:

WORKS: Secreto de Estado (General Assembly) breezed a half-mile in :49 1/5 over Belmont's main track yesterday. The Virginia-bred is undefeated in two career starts, both in Panama.

THE SCOOP: Exetera (Forty Niner) will be the fifth Juvenile starter for trainer Ron McAnally, who saddled Balla Cove (7th) and Single Dawn (5th) in the 1989 race at Gulfstream and Mr Purple (8th) and On Target (4th) in last year's renewal at Churchill Downs. "I think he is equally as good as those were," McAnally said of Exetera, a full-brother to On Target. "He's a very good looking colt as was Mr Purple. Balla Cove was well balanced, but not real attractive. But he had won an important race in Europe and that's why we brought him over."

OLD VIC BACK TO ENGLAND Old Vic (GB)

(Sadler's Wells), winner of both the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and the Irish Derby during 1989, is set to resume a British stud career beginning next year. The nine-year-old, named Champion Three-Year-Old in Ireland, France and England in '89 and Champion Older Horse in England in '90, has spent the past two covering seasons in Japan. But he will stand at Barleythorpe Stud in Leicestershire, England for 1996. His fee has been set at \$5,430. Old Vic, who began his stud career at Sheikh Mohammed's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, won all his five races as a three-year-old and finished runner-up to Belmez in the 1990 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. He retired with earnings of \$1,271,203.

NOV. 11 RACING SHOW CANCELLED An ESPN scheduling conflict has caused the cancellation of the Nov. 11 telecast of ESPN2's "2Day at the Races" program. The 30-minute program was scheduled to feature coverage of the GII Churchill Downs Budweiser Breeders' Cup H., the Coral Gables H. at Calder, and the Wells Fargo California Cup Classic at Santa Anita.

TURF:

LANDO CLEARS QUARANTINE: German import Lando (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) cleared quarantine Thursday morning and took to the Aqueduct turf for a light canter. The five-year-old horse, fourth in the Oct. 1 Arc de Triomphe in his last start, took two straight Group 1 events before that in Italy and Germany.

ALICE SPRINGS HAS FINAL PREP: Alice Springs (Val de l'Orne {Fr}) got the last purposeful exercise of her preparation for the Turf Thursday, galloping 2 1/4-miles off two prompters, finishing with a mile breeze and a quarter-mile blow out. The training took place in an open field at trainer Jonathan Sheppard's farm in West Grove, Pennsylvania and therefore was not timed. The five-year-old mare, a close second in the GI Beverly D in August, will be turned out in her paddock Friday and will van from the farm 5:30 Saturday morning. She should arrive at Belmont at about 8 a.m. Sheppard is not happy about the forecasted rain, saying Alice Springs "doesn't handle the soft turf at all."

WORKS: Hernando (Fr) (Niniski) breezed three-eighths in :41 over Belmont's fast main track yesterday. "This is his third (Breeders' Cup) Turf and I hope he can keep out of trouble," said Alan Cooper, racing manager for owner Stavros Niarchos. "As a three-year-old he was struck into and came back with a large piece of hind hoof missing, and the following year he got stopped about four furlongs out and (jockey) Cash Asmussen had to sit down and stop riding." Asmussen will be aboard Hernando in the Turf for the third straight year.

MILE:

WORKS: Dove Hunt (Danzig) breezed three furlongs over Belmont's inner turf course Thursday in :38, around the dogs. Harayir (Gulch) went five furlongs, also on the inner turf, in 1:06 4/5, while Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed) covered the same distance in 1:04. Soviet Line (Ire) (Soviet Star), runner-up to Harayir in the G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket in his last start Oct. 12, worked six furlongs over the Belmont turf yesterday in 1:15 2/5. "Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (Indian Ridge) is the one to beat," said Soviet Line's jockey Walter Swinburn. "She'll love the soft ground."

THE SCOOP: If trainer Clive Brittain fails to win a race at Newmarket Friday or Saturday, a victory by Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed) in Saturday's Mile would represent his 1,000th winner worldwide. Brittain won the Breeders' Cup Turf with the filly Pebbles (GB) ten years ago at Aqueduct. Regarding Sayyedati's future, no matter where the five-year-old mare finishes Saturday, she will then be sent to Kentucky where she'll be bred to Gulch.

THE ANGLE: A \$2 win bet on every European shipper in the Mile would have produced a profit of \$31.40. A total of 44 Europeans have made it into the Breeders' Cup starting gate, including winners Last Tycoon (Ire) (Try My Best) in 1986 (\$73.80); Miesque (Nureyev) in 1987-88 (\$9.20, \$6.00); Royal Academy (Nijinsky II) in 1990 (\$7.60); and Barathea (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in 1994 (\$22.80). This year's candidates: Poplar Bluff (Dowsing), Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (Indian Ridge), Soviet Line (Ire) (Soviet Star), Cherokee Rose (Ire) (Dancing Brave), Shaanxi (Zilzal), Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed {GB}) and Harayir (Gulch).

DISTAFF:


WORKS: Exercise rider Jan Rushton sent Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) through a sharp half-mile in :46 2/5 Thursday morning at Belmont. "It was exactly what we wanted," trainer Shug McGaughey said. "She is coming up to the race perfectly and she should be helped by the speed up front. I really thought her work this morning was excellent." McGaughey added that Heavenly Prize's stablemate Inside Information (Private Account) "will blow out three-eighths Friday."

LUKAS CONFIDENT IN SERENA'S SONG: "Serena's Song (Rahy) deals the cards. The rest of them play the hand." Those were the words of a confident D. Wayne Lukas, trainer of the three-year-old filly, at Belmont Thursday morning. "Serena's Song has had a marvelous two days since she's been here," Lukas continued. "She's always good. She's doing excellent. She's an amazing, amazing filly. I look for her to run huge."

DISTAFF TDN ANALYSIS, by Bill Finley

It's awful hard to beat Wayne Lukas and equally tough to beat Serena's Song (Rahy), but if Shug McGaughey's Inside Information (Private Account) and Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) can't do it, no one can. Go with the McGaughey-trained entry, who should double team and overpower Serena's Song. Serena's Song did beat Heavenly Prize in the Beldame, but got away with an easy lead and a slow pace which will never happen with Inside Information and Mariah's Storm (Rahy) in the field. Shug can get Serena's Song with either half of his 1-2 punch. Inside Information will stalk her and Heavenly Prize will try to knock her out late. It's a three-filly race; forget about the rest.

SPRINT:

WORKS: Morning-line favorite Not Surprising (Medieval Man) breezed 1/4-mile Thursday at Belmont in :24 3/5, galloping out three-eighths in :37 2/5. "It was fine. I just wanted to take a little edge off him," said trainer Judson Van Worp. "We'll freshen him up now." British sprinter Owington (GB) (Green Desert) breezed a half-mile in :49 over the fast main track. Jockey Frankie Dettori, who will ride Owington in the Sprint, was aboard the four-year-old for the first time for the work.

LAKE CONISTON BREEZES: Pat Eddery, who won the 1991 Sprint with Sheikh Albadou, took Lake Coniston (Ire) (Bluebird) for 1/2-mile breeze Thursday morning at Belmont and was delighted with the result. "He breezed better here than he did at Lingfield (all-weather track in England) the other day," Eddery said. "He loved it. He went down the backstretch with the pony, nice and relaxed, and halfway around the turn I let him go and he didn't want to take off with me. It was nice and even. Sheikh Albadou couldn't lay up with the pace when he won, but this horse has more speed and he'll be able to."

HEVER GOLF ROSE IN GOOD SPIRITS: "She's on the muscle...it was like trying to stop a train going around there this morning," said jockey Jason Weaver yesterday after Hever Golf Rose (GB) (Efisio) had been out for a five furlong spin on Belmont's main track and had been allowed to "stretch out" the final two furlongs. Trainer Joe Naughton was delighted. "She's nice and bubbly," he said. "She's bucking and pulling hard and she does that when she's right. The climate helps." Naughton added, "She shouldn't have any trouble with the track. Her full-brother Go Hever Golf was the topweighted three-year-old on the all-weather track in England and a half-brother won four or five in a row on it."

BREEDERS' CUP BEST BET:

When you look at the characteristics in picking a Breeders' Cup Sprint winner, all angles point to Not Surprising (Medieval Man). He is seven-for-seven at the Sprint distance and is turning back from his win in the seven-furlong Vosburgh, an angle that has produced six of 11 Sprint winners. His stalking style fits not only the running style of many Sprint winners, but is also typical of how sprints are won at Belmont. There is plenty of speed on the outside to set up Not Surprising's late run--and in case it rains, he is four-for-five over wet tracks.

SPRINT TDN ANALYSIS, by Bill Finley

It pays to go with what has worked in the past. There have been a number of sprint winners--Gulch, Dancing Spree, Smile, etc. who have been proven class distance horses who have dropped back to sprints and won because they have a class edge. This year's candidate is You and I (Kris S.), winner of the Met Mile and Brooklyn H. He has proven he belongs with the very best horses in the country and obviously a sprint will be no problem for this very quick horse. Though beaten by Not Surprising (Medieval Man) in the Vosburgh, it was probably just a prep and a good prep at that. There's no knocking Nor Surprising, who has done everything right this year and has won four straight while being expertly handled by unheralded trainer Judson Van Worp. He belongs on every exacta and trifecta ticket in the country. Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor) is coming off a terrible race in the Vosburgh but has put in some powerful performances this year and could wake up at a price.

JUVENILE FILLIES:

GASTRONOMICAL LOOKS TO IMPROVE: G. Arthur. Seelbinder's homebred Gastronomical (Sunshine Forever) looks to improve after finishing third, beaten two lengths by Juvenile Fillies entrants Tipically Irish (Metfield) and Ocean View (Gone West), in the GI Oak Leaf S. Oct. 7 at Santa Anita. Trainer Gary Jones was pleased that Gastronomical drew an outside post for the nine-horse Juvenile Fillies. "She got intimidated when she was in tight along the rail in the Oak Leaf S.," Jones said. "Kent (Desormeaux) had to take her out at the 1/16th pole and once she got clear she made another big run." Gastronomical may be one of the more cleverly named horses in this year's Breeders' Cup. Her owner/breeders' initials are G.A.S. and Seelbinder is the chairman and one of the founders of the Cooker Restaurant Corporation. While Jones is hoping his filly has plenty of gas herself, he volunteered that is worried most about Cara Rafaela (Quiet American), "I don't want to take anything away from Golden Attraction (Mr. Prospector), but she's had everything her way in all of her races," the trainer said. Jones, who will also start Lakeway in the Distaff, is seeking his first Breeders' Cup win. His most successful entrants from 10 previous starters were Meafara, runner-up in the '93 Sprint, and Turkoman, second in the '86 Classic and third in '85.

THE SCOOP: Juvenile Fillies hopeful La Rosa (Wild Again) is the first Breeders' Cup competitor whose parents were both Breeders' Cup champions. The filly's sire took the inaugural Breeders' Cup Classic in 1984; her dam, Twilight Ridge, took the Juvenile Fillies in 1985.
