CIGAR BIDS FOR PERFECTION IN

BREEDERS' CUP XII Eighty-three of the world's finest horses take center stage at Belmont Park today on a predicted rainy afternoon, and while the Breeders' Cup is guaranteed to produce its share of peaks and valleys throughout the afternoon, there is no secret about what the day's star attraction promises to be. One year ago today, an anonymous horse cruised to the wire ahead of five others in an allowance race at Aqueduct Racetrack in just another race on another day. One year and 11 wins later. Cigar (Palace Music) is just one race away from the best campaign a thoroughbred racehorse has put together since Spectacular Bid's undefeated season in 1980. And if Cigar's former owner is not the least bit sorry that she traded her prize horse, perhaps it's only because she's in tight with the current owner. Madeleine Paulson, who gave up Cigar to husband Allen in exchange for 1992 Juvenile Fillies winner Eliza (Mt. Livermore), is almost relieved that things turned out the way they did. "Allen is entitled to all the glory and the prizes that go with it," said Madeleine Paulson. "He bred that horse, and I would be squirming every night if I still owned him. This way I can relax and let him enjoy it all," The rest of the world will do so as well. Post time for the Juvenile Fillies, the first Breeders' Cup race on the card, is set for 11:55 a.m. EDT. NBC's coverage of the Breeders' Cup will run from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

OCEAN VIEW OUT OF JUVENILE FILLIES: The Thoroughbred Corporation's Ocean View (Gone West) will not run in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies after X-rays revealed a small fracture in her right front leg, according to trainer Dick Mulhall. "I'd say it probably happened when she worked (Saturday over a muddy Belmont track)," said Mulhall. "She worked good and didn't show any signs of injury until after we entered Wednesday. Then we took X-rays Thursday and they showed just a tad of a fracture in the right front." Ocean View will be sent back to Santa Anita and given time off.


There is simply not a horse in the country, and probably the world, who can beat Cigar (Palace Music) when he runs his race--and he always does. The only knock here is the threat of a sloppy track. While he's never run in the slop or mud, there are some hints that he won't like it. Unaccounted For (Private Account), while no Cigar, is a good horse who lost to Cigar by only a length in the Jockey Club Gold Cup and is the clear second choice. Concern (Broad Brush), last year's Classic winner, has struggled since this summer, but didn't run badly when third in the Meadowlands Cup last out. European hopeful Halling (Diesis {GB}) showed his best stuff on the turf in Europe after beating second-flight competition on the dirt in Dubai, but is not bred for today's surface. French Deputy (Deputy Minister), in his sixth lifetime start, is being pushed into a tough spot after a defeat in an allowance last time out.

Freedom Cry (GB) (Soviet Star) is almost too obvious. Second to Lammtarra in the Arc de Triomphe last out, he is trained by Andre Fabre and has proven form over soft turf. Awad (Caveat) comes off a terrible effort in the Turf Classic, but he was much too close to the early pace and the race may be a throw-out. Epsom Derby second Tamure (Sadler's Wells) may be the bomb we're all looking for.

SANTA ANITA ANNOUNCES RECORD STAKES

SCHEDULE Multiple stakes races on the Strub, Santa Anita H, and Santa Anita Derby programs will highlight a \$9.65 million stakes schedule, the richest in Santa Anita history, when the track opens for its winter/spring meet Dec. 26. The \$1 million Santa Anita H. moves back to its traditional slot on the first Saturday in March after being pushed back a week in 1995. The \$150,000 GII San Carlos, the \$200,000 GII San Rafael and the \$125,000 GII Buena Vista H. will all be run Big Cap Day, Saturday, March 2. The Santa Anita Derby, raised to \$1 million in 1996, makes Santa Anita the only U.S. track with two (non-Breeders' Cup) million-dollar events. The '96 running will be held Saturday, April 6, and will be supported by the \$200,000 GIII Potrero Grande Breeders' Cup H. and the \$100,000 Santa Paula S. The \$500,000 GI Strub, run Sun., Feb. 4, will also be featured on a three-stakes card along with the \$100,000 Santa Catalina and the \$200,000 GII Palos Verdes H. "These days are the foundation of our program and we've made a move to make them even more dynamic," said Vice President of Racing Tom Robbins. The traditional opening-day feature at the winter/spring meeting, the \$150,000 Malibu, has been upgraded to GI status. The stakes calendar, which has a \$100,000 minimum purse, includes 12 GI events, 18 GIIs and nine GIIIs.

LAMMTARRA'S FEE FIXED Lammtarra (Nijinsky II), unbeaten winner of this year's Epsom Derby, King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and Prix de I'Arc de Triomphe, will begin his stud career next season with a covering fee of 30,000 pounds (approximately \$47,370). Successful in his lone juvenile start when trained by the late Alex Scott, Lammtarra collected his 1995 victories for Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin team and has been retired to Dalham Hall Stud in Newsmarket. "Lammtarra's racing credentials speak for themselves," said stud manager Robert Acton. "He represents the top thoroughbred bloodlines, being by a Derby winner out of an Oaks heroine (Snow Bride), and (the price) will give him the best chance to show his best as a stallion."

ROMAN DIPLOMAT TO KENTUCKY Roman

Diplomat (Roberto) will stand the 1996 breeding season at Doug Arnold's Buck Pond Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The 14-year-old stallion, who formerly stood at Hooper Farms in Ocala, Florida, has sired two multiple graded stakes winners from his first 34 foals. Roman Envoy, from Roman Diplomat's first crop, is a MGSW of \$684,170, while the three-year-old Diplomatic Jet won yesterday's GIII Knickerbocker H. at Belmont to increase his earnings to \$294,456. Roman Diplomat will stand for a fee of \$3,000 and is available for inspection.

REALITIES TO U.S. Realities (Cozzene), winner of Ascot's Royal Hunt Cup in June, is set to continue his racing career in America. "Realities has been purchased by Dick Colton and will be joining (Kentucky-based) trainer Tom Amoss," said Luke Lillingston, the Londonbased bloodstock agent who arranged the sale. "We have been chasing this horse for two years. He seems to be the ideal type for racing in the States."

BREEDERS' CUP WEATHER FORECAST:

According to the latest weather forecast provided to NYRA by a private weather service, the Breeders' Cup forecast calls for light showers beginning after 6 p.m. Friday with an accumulation of about 1/10 of an inch. Rain is expected to become steady after 2 a.m. and end sometime between 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. with an accumulation of one to two inches.

"The track will be sealed after the last race on the main track this afternoon," said NYRA Track Superintendent Don Orlando Friday. "There will be no training on the main track (Saturday) morning. Our best hope is that the storm system moves through quicker than currently anticipated."

During its monthly meeting at Beulah Park Oct. 20, members of the Ohio State Racing Commission voted unanimously to advertise a rule change that would end telephone account wagering in the state. Currently, over 3,000 people wager on races at Beulah Park, River Downs, Scioto Downs and Thistledown by telephone. The action was a direct result of an opinion delivered by Ohio Attorney General Betty Montgomery Oct. 10. Montgomery concluded Section 3769 of the Ohio Revised Code limits wagering on horse races only to those individuals physically in attendance at racetracks.

By comparison, the consensus of the major Las Vegas casinos has Halling at 4-1 with Cigar on offer at 2-5.

OVERHEARD: "We are all praying to the same God. We will find out who has got the best connection." Robert Perez, owner of Classic entrant **Jed Forest** (Gold Alert), whose past performances show two big mud victories in Panama, admitting he's wishing for rain on Breeders' Cup Day.
