CIGAR THE STAR OF THE SHOW IN

BREEDERS' CUP XII The biggest concern was not whether he would defeat the best the world had to throw at him, for it wasn't the 10 rivals that scared Cigar (Palace Music) and his connections at Belmont Park yesterday. Mother Nature was the big threat to the 3-5 favorite, who came into the \$3 million Breeders' Cup Classic with an undefeated season on the line. And while several of the winners of Breeders' Cup XII may be crowned champions when Eclipse Award time rolls around, Cigar will earn it with an exclamation point after romping home a 21/2-length winner in yesterday's Breeders' Cup Classic in stakes-record time of 1:59 2/5. He returned to the winner's circle to a standing ovation from the 37,246 fans. "They brought absolutely the best they had to offer," said trainer Billy Mott. And Cigar defeated them all, moving into fourth place on the all-time leading earners list with winnings of \$5,089,815. On a day when showers turned to intermittent drizzle and rendered the course a sea of slop, the track condition was the great unknown. "I knew either way, we would not lose the divisional championship and probably Horse of the Year," said Mott. "What we would have lost is the excitement of seeing him run." Despite the weather, the day provided plenty of excitement. My Flag (Easy Goer) ran down a determined Cara Rafaela in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in an effort reminiscent of her dam Personal Ensign's 1988 Distaff win. Unbridled's Song (Unbridled) became the first Breeders' Cup winner to win a Breeders' Cup race over the same track as his sire, causing trainer Jim Ryerson to predict Triple Crown victory. Inside Information (Private Account) set a new Breeders' Cup record with a 13 1/2-length win, the largest margin of victory in the event's 12-year history. My Flag (1:42 2/5), Unbridled's Song (1:41 3/5) and Inside Information (1:46) also all set stakes records. Records were set in the Mile and Turf as well, but for the slowest, rather than fastest, times. Over a course labeled soft, Northern Spur (Sadler's Wells) justified his \$1.3 million purchase price with a victory, while Ridgewood Pearl (Indian Ridge) gave Europe its lone victory of the day in the Mile. And just to keep the longshot bettors interested, Desert Stormer (Storm Cat) gave the fillies a fourth win on the card as part of the mutuel field to return \$31. The ontrack handle of \$9,283,611.26 was the second-highest in NYRA history, surpassed only by 1990 Breeders' Cup Day, when \$10.5 million was wagered on-track.

Superstar Cigar was kept off the pace and under a hard hold early by jockey Jerry Bailey. Bailey, bidding for his third straight Classic victory, finally allowed the bay to soar to the front after a mile and then lengthen his stride down the stretch while his fans cheered him on. "I would say this is the greatest horse I've ever been around," Bailey said. "I was not riding when Secretariat was here, so I cannot compare them, but this is the best I've known." Trainer Bill Mott added, "Cigar just did his job again. He's won 10 times this year; 12 in a row. Amazing." The trainer added that the Dubai Cup in March is on the horse's agenda. A big disappointment in the race was the performance of British import HALLING (Diesis {GB}), who was looking to increase his eight-race winning streak before being eased in the stretch yesterday. "He changed his legs (lead) and stopped," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "I don't know exactly what's wrong, but we will check his heart. He doesn't seem distressed, but there is something wrong."

No cigar, but close," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas, whose trio of Juvenile starters, Hennessy, Editor's Note and 2-1 favorite HONOUR AND GLORY (Relaunch) finished 2nd, 3rd and 4th, Instead, the race belonged to Unbridled's Song. Making only his third career start after breaking his maiden by 81/2 at Saratoga Aug. 26 and setting extremely quick fractions before fading to 4th in the GI Champagne S. Oct. 7, the gray colt was rated off the pace for the first time here then guided to the rail for the stretch drive, where he dug in and prevailed by a neck over GI Hopeful winner Hennessy. "Well this is NOT the way to get to the Breeders' Cup," said winning trainer Jim Ryerson. "He's had only two races, but we gained from those experiences. We tied his tongue today; he was just too much in it in the Champagne. The horse relaxed to that today. I was concerned in midstretch. For a stride or two Hennessy had him, but he came back." Unbridled's Song first made headlines this past March when he attracted a bid of \$1.2 million, the most ever for a two-year-old at auction, at the Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training. However, the colt was later returned to the seller. "I really didn't want to put him through the sale," said owner Ernie Paragallo. "But we took the approach that we would put everything through the sale and if they sold, fine; if not, fine. But I never wanted to put this one through the sale. I always thought he was something special." Unbridled's Song is the first stakes-winner for his freshman sire. Donna Barton, aboard runner-up Hennessy, said, "The horse broke sharp and put me in a beautiful position away from the gate. He ran his race; you can't ask for more than that. I was just trying to get the most out of my horse and be in front at the wire. I got everything out of him, but I wasn't in front at the wire." Said Gary Stevens of beaten favorite Honour and Glory, "He was really slipping around out there. I was wide the whole trip, and that didn't help any. He got

banged pretty good at the 3/8-pole when another horse came out; he broke from the 14 hole. So with all those things working against him, he ran pretty well to get fourth."

Purchased for \$1.3 million this spring, Northern Spur all but earned back--and justified--his purchase price with his front-running win in the Turf. Settling in just behind the early pace of TURK PASSER (Turkoman), Northern Spur hit the front on the turn and held off a determined late charge from Freedom Cry. "He had to work hard to get over the ground today," said Chris McCarron. "The course is quite deep." Still, said his rider, he was grateful for the showers. "When the forecast called for rain, it didn't lower my level of confidence because he's had success on soft conditions." The slowest Turf in the 12vear history of the event produced conditions unfavorable to many of the other runners. AWAD (Caveat), the highest-placed American-bred finisher, was sixth. "It is virtually impossible to gain any ground with a running style like he's got," said jockey Eddie Maple. "It was just too tough." Owner Charles Cella and jockey Ron McAnally will discuss the winner's future over the next few days. "The horse will tell the trainer and the trainer will tell the boss," said McAnally.

In the only real upset victory of the day, Desert Stormer, one of three members of the mutuel field, broke on top and never gave way, racing around the oval a head in front of Mr. Greelev and extending her lead to a neck under the wire. It was the five-year-old mare's third stakes victory this year and her first Grade I tally. "Today we said they were going to have to catch us and they didn't," said jockey Kent Desormeaux, who was winning his second Breeders' Cup race after taking the 1993 Turf with Kotashaan. Trainer Frank Lyons added, "She is dynamite when she's fresh," Desert Stormer last raced Aug. 13 at Del Mar, finishing second to Sprint runner TRACK GAL (Track Barron) in the GIII Rancho Bernardo Breeders' Cup H. "She has never run against the boys before, but she has run in 1:07 and change before at Santa Anita, so I knew she was up to this caliber," Lyons continued. Desert Stormer is the third filly or mare to win the Breeders' Cup Sprint, following Very Subtle in 1987 and Safely Kept in 1990. Rounding out the \$733 exacta was 31-1 longshot Mr. Greeley, winner of a trio of sprint stakes against threeyear-olds earlier this year but 10th, beaten 201/2 lengths, in the Kentucky Cup Sprint last out. "I thought we were going to get it," said trainer Nick Zito. "I was screaming at the top of my lungs. I can't believe that mare was so game. How about all these seconds I've had this year?" Beaten favorite NOT SURPRISING (Medieval Man) dropped further back than expected in the early going, then closed ground late to finish a creditable fourth. "I'm not one to make excuses, but I think the mud cost him the first part of the race," said trainer Judson Van Worp, "It was too much to ask of him to come back

after being eight lengths out of it. We'll take him back to Florida and show up again at Gulfstream. Who knows, maybe we'll be back to New York...or back to the Breeders' Cup." CLASSY MIRAGE (Storm Bird) was scratched due to the muddy track conditions.

Ridgewood Pearl came into the Mile with just one loss in her last six starts, a second-place finish in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot last out. The filly, who arrived in America with Group 1 wins in France, England and Ireland under her belt, added the U.S. to that list with a powerful stretch run to wear down a determined Fastness. With good performances on soft turf in Europe in her past performances, she was sent off the 5-2 choice, but encountered traffic problems early when trapped in behind the early leaders down the backstretch. Angled out at the top of the lane, she responded with a stretch drive which sent her clear in the final stages to give her Irish connections their first Breeders' Cup victory. "It feels so good to come back and prove she is the best in Europe," said winning rider John Murtagh. "She really handled the softness of the course." Others didn't fare as well over the going: the connections of Fastness, FOURSTARS ALLSTAR (Compliance), MIGHTY FORUM (GB) (Presidium {GB}), DOVE HUNT (Danzig) and CHEROKEE ROSE (IRE) (Dancing Brave) attributed the soft going to their performances. Ridgewood Pearl will be taken home to Ireland where a decision on her future will be made. HARAYIR (Gulch) was scratched early in the day after sustaining an injury to her left rear tendon sheath.

My Flag, equipped with blinkers for the first time in the GI Frizette S. October 7, rallied strongly in that race to finish second, beaten only 3/4-length by Golden Attraction. Golden Attraction controlled the pace here as the even-money favorite, setting fractions of :23, :46 2/5 and 1:11 on the front end. Her stablemate Cara Rafaela took over from her in midstretch, but was unable to hold off a strong late finish from 7-2 second choice My Flag, who became the first Grade I winner for her deceased sire Easy Goer. "She fired really good coming out of the turn," said jockey Jerry Bailey, who was securing his first Breeders' Cup win in a race other than the Classic. "For a long time I didn't think she had it. She ran a great race." Dinny Phipps, son of winning owner Ogden Phipps, said, "I thought she made a pretty good run from behind and I am very pleased. Jerry Bailey said he finally learned how to ride her and she's a good filly. He said he knew the filly had more speed now than she did three races ago. When Shug (trainer McGaughey) put blinkers on, it took her way up." When asked to compare this race with the 1988 Breeders' Cup Distaff, in which My Flag's dam Personal Ensign beat Winning Colors at the wire, Phipps said, "I guess I have never seen a better race than the one in 1988. This was a great race, but the 1988 Personal Ensign was the greatest." My Flag is the second Grade I winner from Personal Ensign's first four foals, and the first Breeders' Cup winner whose dam was a Breeders' Cup winner. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who ran the trio of Cara Rafaela, Golden Attraction and Tipically Irish (Metfield), said of beaten even-money favorite Golden Attraction, "She's lost twice, both in mud. Talking to (jockey) Gary Stevens, he said she just doesn't have that quick burst...doesn't get over it the same way (as a fast

track). Pat Day, who was aboard GII Alcibiades winner Cara Rafaela, was pleased with his filly's effort. "My filly broke running and we were right inside Golden Attraction, which seemed like a key spot to be," Day said. "She had to work a little harder than I thought to get by Golden Attraction, but she just kept on kicking. I thought I was home free."

The favored entry of Inside Information and Heavenly Prize provided few anxious moments for their backers. Inside Information, bidding for her sixth Grade I win, used her early speed to her advantage, taking over inside late on the backstretch, then drawing off as she pleased under a brisk hand ride. "If that wasn't an Eclipse Award performance, then I don't know what is," said her jockey Mike Smith. Trainer Shug McGaughev added, "(Inside Information) loves this racetrack and she loves the mud. She brought tactical speed to this race and that's what she used today. I would say this was a sterling performance." Her late-running stablemate Heavenly Prize, runner-up to One Dreamer in last year's Distaff, had to settle for second once again. "I would have liked to have been a little closer, if she had put me there," said jockey Pat Day. "I waited for her to give me the nod until the three furlong pole, but she never did, so I went to work on her. She came on and finished good, but just didn't have the same finish she's given me in the past." Both Inside Information and Heavenly Prize, who have never been worse than third in 34 combined starts, will now be retired. Top three-year-old SERENA'S SONG (Rahy), sent off the 5-2 second choice, pressed the pace early but tired to be 5th. "When they don't like (the mud), they don't like it," said Serena's Song's trainer D. Wayne Lukas. This was the eighth time in 12 runnings that the favorite won the Distaff.
