BREEDERS' CUP WRAP-UP The Winners:

Owner Allen Paulson announced yesterday at the post-Breeders' Cup Press Breakfast that his Breeders' Cup Classic champ Cigar (Palace Music) will race again next year as a six-year-old. "He's great for racing," said Paulson, "People say New Yorkers don't get into it, but they did yesterday...the public has a hero." Plotting the certain Horse of the Year's course for the future, trainer Bill Mott said, "If all goes well, he'll get a good physical between now and December. We'll keep him in light training. He'll stay here for a couple of weeks, then he'll go to Payson Park until the first of January. We're looking for a different kind of campaign with him (next year), fewer races in different places--particularly if we go to Dubai (March 27). Ideally, you'd want a race 30 days out, probably at Gulfstream in the Donn or the Gulfstream Park H. We'll have all winter to think about that." Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) came back from his victory in the Turf in good order and will now ship back to California. The colt will race again as a fiveyear-old. Two-year-old Unbridled's Song (Unbridled) ended his '95 campaign with Saturday's game win in the Juvenile; he will be rested before pointing to the classics next spring. "I think maybe his light campaign will help him next year, and I have to remember he has only run in one-turn races," said trainer Jim Ryerson. "But I think he showed classic potential the way he rated and relaxed when he was in between horses. If he stays sound, he should be a top three-year-old." The bay will winter in Florida and prep for the Kentucky Derby in the Gulfstream three-year-old series. Inside Information (Private Account), who set a record for both the Breeders' Cup Distaff and the largest winning margin in any Breeders' Cup race, has been retired and will go to Claiborne Farm to be bred next spring. The other McGaughey/Phipps winner yesterday, My Flag (Easy Goer), was doing well after her rallying triumph in the Juvenile Fillies; there had been some thought on running the eye-catching chestnut back in the Demoiselle at Aqueduct if she had not won, but trainer Shug McGaughey said he would reconsider future plans for the daughter of his 1988 Distaff winner, Personal Ensign. Desert Stormer (Storm Cat), who became the third distaffer to win the Sprint, will race again next year at six. Owner Joanne Nor and trainer Frank Lyons indicated the now five-year-old would be pointed to the Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita.

BREEDERS' CUP WRAP-UP CONTINUED Connections of Mile champ Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) said it is 80 percent sure that the three-year-old filly will be retired. The Injury Report: Peaks And Valleys (Mt. Livermore), who is likely to be named Canada's Horse of the Year, came back from his sixth-place finish in the Classic with a severe bruise on the heel of his left front foot. "He also has a small crack in the bar of the hoof," said attending veterinarian Dr. Steven Selway. "It's probably more painful than a coffin bone fracture. He can't put any weight on it." The injury will take several weeks to heal; the MGISW will not race again this year. Trainer Richard Mandella said that Soul Of The Matter (Private Terms), fourth in the Classic, returned with a small quarter crack on his right hind foot. "It's a new crack, no big deal," said Mandella. "We'll give him a week off before taking him back to the track." Lando (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), who beat just one horse in the Turf, came out of the race with "a cut that required stitches, but it was not very serious, according to Alistair Donald of the International Racing Bureau. The horse flew back to Germany yesterday morning. Seacliff (Valid Appeal), who forged to the lead on the far turn in the Juvenile but stopped to finish 10th, bled in the race. "We scoped him and found that he had bled and there was also mucus in his lungs, maybe from a low-grade infection. I'll give him a little break now and then point him for the three-year-old series at Gulfstream." Trainer Nick Zito said that his Juvenile runner, Diligence (Miswaki), fifth, also bled slightly. Zito added that the colt may be back for the Remsen at Aqueduct November 25. Future Plans for Also-rans: Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold), runner-up in the Distaff, will race again before being bred next season. Trainer Shug McGaughey said the filly could face colts in either the Donn or the Gulfstream Park H. in '96. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas shipped his seven-horse contingent back to Churchill Downs Sunday morning, but he has not yet mapped out plans for the winter for his stable stars. Unaccounted For (Private Account), third in the Classic, could run in the NYRA Mile November 25; he will definitely race in 1996, according to trainer Scotty Schulhofer. Schulhofer also said that Turk Passer (Turkoman), ninth after setting the pace in the Turf, could go to the Japan Cup if he is invited. Both he and Signal Tap (Fappiano), 11th in the Turf, will also race next year. Two fillies owned by the Maktoum family, Cherokee Rose (Ire) (Dancing Brave), eighth in the Mile, and Sayyedati (GB) (Shadeed), third in the same race, will be retired to Gainsborough Farm in Kentucky to be bred next spring. Halling (GB) (Diesis {GB}), last in the Classic, will winter in Dubai. Assistant trainer Jeremy Noseda said Sunday, "He seems fine. He just did not race comfortably on the track."

Winner of a Belmont maiden and allowance in his first two starts this fall, Gator Dancer rallied from last place to lead at the top of the stretch, but needed every ounce of effort to hold off Skip Away through the lane. "I think he just did too much too early," said rider Eddie Maple. "He made the lead and he started to act like he was finished.
