### BREEDERS' CUP DRAWS \$64 MILLION IN

**HANDLE** Total wagering on the seven Breeders' Cup Championship races last Saturday was \$64,075,209. The figure, which includes \$56,484,875 bet at 756 simulcast and off-track betting locations across the U.S. and Canada, was the fifth highest in Breeders' Cup history. The highest figure was set in 1993, when \$79,744,742 was wagered on the card at Santa Anita. Last Saturday, a crowd of 37,246 at Belmont Park bet \$7,590,334 on the seven Breeders' Cup races. Among the simulcast outlets, Santa Anita Park and its intertrack system led the way with \$7,238,926 wagered on the seven Breeders' Cup races and the Breeders' Cup Pick 7. Santa Anita was followed by Keeneland and its satellite locations with \$5,633,758; Hawthorne and off-track affiliates, \$4,439,319; New York City OTB, \$3,191,970; and Calder and its simulcast locations, \$3,133,249. A total of \$3,169,020 was wagered on the Breeders' Cup Pick 7. There were 81 winning tickets, which returned an average payout of \$22,000. There were also 2,959 consolation tickets purchased which had six of seven winners correct. The consolation payouts, which vary due to individual state withholding percentages, averaged \$200. "With the national decline of on-track attendance and handle, we recognized before this year's event there would probably be a decrease in the volume of wagering on the seven championship races," said James E. Bassett III, president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "However, the Breeders' Cup Championship continues to be racing's largest betting day in North America. We had a superlative day of racing at Belmont Park and we look forward to another successful Breeders' Cup in 1996."

**BRENNAN RESIGNS AS ITB CHAIRMAN** Robert Brennan has resigned as Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of International Thoroughbred Breeders, which owns and operates Garden State Park and Freehold Raceway in New Jersey, ITB announced yesterday. Robert Quigley has been elected to serve the balance of Brennan's term as Chairman. According to an ITB press release, Brennan told the company he was resigning in response to the urging of the company's board of directors. ITB said it had been informed that the New Jersey Division of Gaming Enforcement had filed a complaint with the Casino Control Commission, seeking to prohibit Garden State and Freehold from conducting direct or indirect business with any casino licensee.

**POCAHONTAS S.**, \$100,000a, 2yo, f, 1m

**Cara Rafaela** (Quiet American), second by only 1/2-length in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last Saturday, will return on seven days rest to run in the Pocahontas S. The gray filly, who won the GII Alcibiades S. at Keeneland two starts back, shares highweight of 121 pounds with undefeated **J.D. and Water** (Northern Prospect). Following a win in a \$50,000 maiden claiming event at Churchill July 2, J.D. and Water has reeled off three straight stakes victories in the Palatine Breeders' Cup S. at Arlington, the Bassinet S. at River Downs and most recently the Indian Summer S. at Keeneland Oct. 19. Also entered in the Pocahontas is unbeaten allowance winner **Classy 'n' Bold** (Cutlass), who was pre-entered in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies but withdrawn after developing a cough. Also scheduled to go to the post are **Dynawin** (Dynaformer), **Gold Sunrise** (Forty Niner), **Subtle Fragrance** (Crafty Prospector), **Prissy One** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), **Birr** (Farma Way), **Corporate Debut** (Corporate Report), **Tanja** (Allen's Prospect) and **Summer Squeeze** (Summer Squall).

### Brennan Resigns As ITB Chairman, Continued.

Garden State and Freehold currently receive revenues from parimutuel wagering on races, including their own, simulcast to Atlantic City casinos. The Division based its complaint on the fact that Brennan, ITB's chairman and principal stockholder with 2,904,000 shares representing 30.4% of the company's outstanding common stock, had been found in a June, 1995 decision by Judge Richard Owen of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York to be "liable for violating federal securities laws in the years 1982 to 1985." None of the alleged securities laws involved ITB. Brennan is appealing Judge Owen's decision and has entered into an agreement which would place his ITB shares into an irrevocable dispositive trust, which would provide for the liquidation of all such shares if the U.S. Court of Appeals affirms Judge Owen's decision.

### FLORIDA COURT RULES IN FAVOR OF FTBOA

Horsemen who won races at Gulfstream Park in 1994 might be a little richer with a recent court ruling. The Fourth District Court of Appeal in Miami sided with the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association when it ruled the wording in a Florida statute "was clear and unambiguous and required Gulfstream Park to withhold and pay an additional three percent from all exotic wagering to Thoroughbred horse owners." The money in dispute was from the 1994 Gulfstream meeting. Stanley Ersoff, president of the FTBOA, said after the ruling was handed down, "I trust Gulfstream Park will now pay horsemen the estimated \$1.3 million in purses and FOA's (Florida Owners Awards) due them." Gulfstream Park President Doug Donn said, "We are disappointed by the court's ruling that upsets our agreement with the horse owners."

### TEAM LUKAS LOSES A KEY PLAYER

Todd Pletcher, Wayne Lukas' chief assistant on the New York and Florida circuits, will leave the Lukas operation around December 1 to open up a stable of his own. Pletcher, 28, said he has tentatively lined up about 20 horses and several owners, none of whom currently use Lukas as their trainer. He plans to travel the Florida-New York circuit, with a possible stopover at Keeneland in the spring. "I felt like it was time to make a career move," Pletcher said. "I have been with Wayne for 6½ years and it has been a terrific experience. That's why you work for someone, so that one day you can go out on your own. Heading up his East Coast operation was an ideal situation, but I felt it was time to try it on my own." According to Pletcher, George Weaver will take over the New York division this winter. He did not know who would run Lukas's Florida operation.

### MEADOWLANDS OFFERS MELBOURNE CUP

**SIMULCAST** For the first time, betting on Australia's Melbourne Cup will be available in the United States through a common pool based at Meadowlands Race-track. The \$2 million (Aus) Melbourne Cup, with an Eastern Standard Time post of 11:20 p.m. Monday, November 6, will be featured as part of a 30-minute international telecast. Wagering through the Meadowlands simulcasting hub will be Philadelphia Park, Rockingham Park, Sam Houston, Mountaineer Park, Connecticut OTB and Lewiston (Maine) Raceway. "The Meadowlands, which has been at the forefront of international simulcasting, is pleased to provide the hub for the 135th running of the Melbourne Cup," noted Hal Handel, executive vice president and chief operating officer for racing operations at The Meadowlands and Monmouth. Melbourne Cup rules allow up to 24 starters, but only 14 betting interests will be available in the U.S. due to varying tote capabilities. The race is a Group 1 handicap for three-year-olds and up going two miles on the turf at Melbourne's Flemington Racecourse. Win, place, show, exacta and trifecta wagering will be offered.

### NORTHERN SPUR TO SKIP JAPAN CUP

Charles Cella's Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Northern Spur (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) will not run in the Japan Cup Nov. 26 at Tokyo Racecourse, trainer Ron McAnally said Thursday. McAnally added that the \$500,000 GI Hollywood Turf Cup Dec. 10 remains a possibility. "We cancelled any plans for Japan this morning," McAnally said. "Let me just say that the horse ran a very hard race in the Breeders' Cup and to go that far (Japan) for that race, we decided against it." **Sandpit (Braz)** (Baynoun {Ire}), rested since finishing second to Northern Spur in the GI Oak Tree Invitational Oct. 8, will make the trip to Japan. The six-year-old chestnut drilled seven furlongs in a bullet 1:24 3/5 at Santa Anita yesterday.

### PLANS FOR FABRE RUNNERS

Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up **Freedom Cry (GB)** (Soviet Star) will race next in the March 27 Dubai World Cup, trainer Andre Fabre reports. Fabre will not give the horse a prep for the \$4 million event, but will send him to Dubai in plenty of time to adjust to the unfamiliar surroundings. "I have no particular worries about him racing on the dirt," Fabre said. "We will ship him there in plenty of time for him to acclimate. The track there is not exactly dirt, it is more sand." **Carnegie (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), the 1994 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner and third in this year's Turf, has been retired. However, Fabre said that plans concerning his stud career are unclear.

**VETTORI RETIRED** Vettori (Ire) (Machiavellian), successful in this season's Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp, has been retired to stud in Normandy. The colt retires with earnings of \$248,024 from two wins in five starts. Vettori, whose last race was a third to Bahri in Ascot's G1 St. James Palace S. in June, is to stand stud in 1996 at the Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard. His fee has been fixed at \$8,159 (40,000off). Vettori's dam Air Distingue is by 1968 Derby hero Sir Ivor and was herself Group 1 placed. Stud manager Tim Richardson said, "We are delighted to be able to offer breeders a chance to use a son of the brilliant and successful sire Machiavellian."

**FLORIDA DERBY EARLY BIRD NOMINEES**

**ANNOUNCED** Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled) heads a record 147 Early Bird nominees to the \$500,000 Florida Derby (Grade I) March 16 at Gulfstream Park. The previous record was 136 for the 1992 Florida Derby. Together with **Maria's Mon** (Wavering Monarch), **Hennessy** (Storm Cat), **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner) and **Honour and Glory** (Relaunch), the Early Bird nominees boast virtually all of the national leaders among two-year-old colts and geldings. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who saddled 1995 Florida Derby winner Thunder Gulch, has nominated 21 to the race for three-year-olds at 1 1/8-miles. "The Early Bird nominees are a bumper crop," said Gulfstream's Director of Racing and Racing Secretary Robert D. Umphrey. "We look forward to another exciting Florida Derby." The regular closing for the Florida Derby is February 22. Supplemental nominations may be made at the time of entry, March 13, upon payment of \$20,000 each.

**CALDER MEET CLOSES TODAY** With one day left in the 122-day 1995 Calder Race Course meet, the races for top owner, trainer and jockey have all turned into runaways. Gary Boulanger has secured his third riding title at the track. The highlight of the meet for the 27-year-old Alberta native was a come-from-behind win with Glen Hill Farm's two-year-old filly Effectiveness in the \$350,000 My Dear Girl Division of the Florida Stallion S. Trainer Dan Hurtak, a native of Johnstown, Pennsylvania, is the leading trainer at the track for the second straight year. Leading owner F.W. Ballou has won with 29 percent of his starters, winning 28 races at the Florida track through Monday.
