STEEPLECHASE JOCKEY CALLS IT QUILTS Irish jump jockey Declan Murphy, who returned to the saddle a month ago after suffering near-fatal head injuries in a spill at Haydock at the beginning of 1994, announced Monday that he is retiring. The 28-year-old made his comeback in the Annual Flat vs. Jump Jockeys Challenge at Chepstow October 10 and led the field from wire-to-wire, but he has decided to turn in his riding books for a microphone, taking a job with a new British racing television channel. Murphy told the *Associated Press*, "I was offered the job quite a while ago, and it was hard to weigh up. But winning on my comeback ride was such a high that I thought no matter what I did afterwards, it would be an anti-climax."

MICHAEL HERNON JOINS GAINESWAY Graham J. Beck's Gainesway Farm yesterday announced the appointment of Michael Hernon to the position of Director of Sales, effective December 1, 1995. Said Beck, "Michael Hernon brings to Gainesway a wealth of experience in the Thoroughbred industry. I think our clients will find him extremely knowledgeable and helpful as they plan their matings and purchase stallion seasons." Hernon, a native of Ireland, gained pedigree experience with Pedigree Associates of Lexington, followed by three years with Fasig-Tipton Auction Sales Company. For the past five-and-a-half years, Hernon has represented Walnut Green Bloodstock Agency in Lexington. He will continue in that position through the November Bloodstock Sales before joining Gainesway.

COLONIAL DOWNS FINALIZES FINANCIAL PLANS Colonial Downs has finalized an agreement with developer/financier Jeffrey P. Jacobs to inject \$5 million in equity into what will be Virginia's first pari-mutuel horse racing track and its six statewide Satellite Wagering Facilities. The investment, when approved by the Virginia Racing Commission, will represent a 50 percent ownership interest in Colonial Downs. Jacobs will provide an immediate infusion of \$2.25 million. The balance of the investment will be made available upon resolution of an appeal of the Virginia Racing Commission's award of the sole license to operate a pari-mutuel racetrack by one of the losing applicants. The appeal, which was rejected by the Richmond Circuit Court, is pending in the Virginia State Court of Appeals. Colonial Downs plans to open the first of its six Satellite Facilities in Chesapeake by late December.

Mountain Affair (Mt. Livermore), two-for-two on the turf, shipped down from Canada to try her luck on the dirt in the GI Frizette last time out and finished a well-beaten fourth. The Florida-bred miss returns to her preferred surface, where she captured a division of the GIC Natalma by a decisive 4 1/2 lengths two starts back. New York-bred **Light Up New York** (Majestic Light) is undefeated in two starts against state-breds on the main track. The bay tries turf for the first time after galloping to a 6 1/2-length score in the restricted **Maid of the Mist S.** last time out. **Platinum Blonde** (Silver Hawk) took her first two starts on the grass, including the other division of the GIC Natalma, but ended up third as the even-money choice to then- maiden **Ethyl Mae** (Woodman) in the Staten Island S. after checking at the start in her latest effort.

NOVEMBER SALES PREVIEW ... ANYTHING BUT MIXED

Over the river and through the woods, to...the 1995 November Mixed Sales we go. Actually, the route to these sales has been anything but arduous. Given the crystal-clear sailing thus far in the 1995 North American sales season, we would expect much more of the same for these upcoming mixed sales, and we're certainly not alone in that assessment. But then, even our pet goldfish would be able to predict that the November Sales will be strong.

One year ago, the Breeders' Cup was held at Churchill Downs, a scant seventy miles up the pike from Lexington, where the 1994 November Mixed Sales commenced the very next day. The racing was simply superb, and everyone—including more than a few potential sales participants—left the track in a giddy, euphoric mood. They just floated out of there. The next day, the sale flew from the get-go, and prices just went high and higher and higher...

This year, the Breeders' Cup was held at Belmont Park, two weeks before and 800 miles away from Lexington, but this is not mentioned as a suggestion that the Mixed Sales, which begin Thursday, will see a slide from last year's record numbers simply because the Breeders' Cup was not held in Louisville, although, admittedly, we wouldn't mind it at all if it were held there each and every year. We already said that the 1995 Mixed Sales will be up, but it will be without all the concomitant euphoria which accompanied last year's sales.

The reasons why the sales will be up are obvious. The 1995 two-year-old in training

market was strong, thanks in part to the Japanese. The 1995 yearling market was crazy strong, in fact, because the two-year-old in training market was strong, also in part because of the Japanese. This has to mean the 1995 Mixed Sales will be strong...people (read: breeders) have money which is burning a red-hot hole in their pockets. But where, exactly, do we expect the sale to show the most strength?

There is a record number of weanlings catalogued in this year's edition of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. People will be paying yearling prices, and then some, in some cases, for these foals.

At the recently concluded Ocala mixed sale, prices went through the roof for foals with less-than-Kentucky-quality pedigrees. The Florida market set all kinds of records; we would expect to see a record weanling market in Kentucky this month, fueling a rise in all overall indicators for the sale, but it would not be terribly surprising to see the mare market level, or perhaps even down a bit from last year.

Mares were soft in Ocala last month and, with a few notable exceptions, the mares catalogued in Kentucky this November will not produce bidding wars. No doubt mares will be bought in the coming weeks that will prove tremendous bargains a few short years down the line.

We would attribute the possible softness in the broodmare market to the current Thoroughbred marketplace mentality, which seems to be that nobody wants to own the factory. Pinhook foals to yearlings; pinhook yearlings to two-year-olds; pinhook successful racehorses to sires—that's the name of the game today. It's instant gratification, a theme more reminiscent of the go-go, went-went Eighties...something which was practiced but not perfected in the Thoroughbred marketplace during that decade.
