DORIEMUS CAPTURES MELBOURNE

CUP Jockey Damien Oliver, second aboard Paris Lane in last year's Melbourne Cup, captured yesterday's \$2 million (AUS) event aboard **Doriemus (NZ)** (Normand Pentaquad) by four lengths over **Nothin' Leica Dane** (Danehill). Doriemus, winner of the Caulfield Cup September 23, covered the two miles in 3:27.6 over a turf course rated heavy. It was the second victory in the G1 Melbourne Cup for trainer Lee Freedman. "I had so much faith in this horse," Freedman said. "Early on he reminded me of Super Impose (1989 Cup winner). It was a great staying effort." Oliver was elated with his easy triumph in Australia's richest horse race. Before the colorful tradition of the presentation of a gold mounted whip to the winning jockey, Oliver commented, "the last 200 meters were the longest of my life. This is unbelievable, I've just won the Melbourne Cup." A crowd of over 75,000 flocked to Flemington Race Course to witness the only sporting event in Victoria afforded a public holiday.

CHAMPION HONKY TONK TUNE DEAD

Honky Tonk Tune (Cure the Blues), Canada's Champion Two-Year-Old Filly of 1994, was euthanized Monday after foundering. According to Mike Doyle, manager of owner Frank Stronach's racing operations, the filly appeared on the road to recovery from a case of laminitis which was diagnosed "about one month ago. We discovered that her foot had rotated somewhat when we brought her in from the farm," Doyle said. "She seemed to be coming around. But she took a turn for the worse on the weekend. We didn't want her to suffer." Honky Tonk Tune won five of her six starts at two, her lone loss coming in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in November at Churchill Downs. This year she won the Achievement H. at Woodbine in her three-year-old debut and finished third in the Canadian Oaks, a race her connections are still appealing. Honky Tonk Tune was bumped into the rail at the top of the stretch; the stewards admitted an infraction had taken place but didn't change the order of finish when they could not determine guilt in the incident. "Perhaps, after the hearing, she'll go out a winner," Doyle concluded. Honky Tonk Tune won six of 11 career starts for earnings of \$306,047.

COACHWOOD (NZ) (Bakharoff) set the pace from the start, with race favorite **DOUBLE TRIGGER** (IRE) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}) tucked in third along the rail. Down the backside the order remained the same, with **Coachwood** still leading and **Double Trigger** moved to the outside for his run. Entering the final turn, **IT'S ALL IN FUN** (NZ) and **Coachwood** pulled away from the rest of the field to lead by three lengths, while **Double Trigger** tired and started to drop back. In the stretch, **Doriemus**, who had broken from post 23 on the extreme outside, came flying down the center of the track to take command. **Nothin' Leica Dane** made a run between horses to get up for second, while 1993 Melbourne Cup winner **Vintage Crop**, 23rd and last early, made an impressive late run for the show spot.

CHURCHILL DOWNS BUDWEISER BREEDERS' CUP H-Gill, \$200,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 1m

Breeders' Cup Distaff third-place finisher **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew) drilled a half-mile in a sharp :48 2/5 Monday over Churchill Downs' fast main track. The MGI-winning filly, who will tote highweight of 122 pounds in Saturday's event, will be ridden once again by her Breeders' Cup jockey Kent Desormeaux. "We're hoping this will get her back on the win trail," said Marty Jones, assistant to trainer Gary Jones. Four-year-old Lakeway has not visited the winner's circle since taking the GI Hollywood Oaks in July '94. Scheduled to face her Saturday are **Laura's Pistolette** (Big Pistol), **Alcovy** (Salutely), **Briar Road** (Proper Reality), **Eskimo's Angel** (Eskimo) and **Traverse City** (Halo).

DEVIL HIS DUE TO MARGAUX FARM Devil His Due (Devil's Bag) will not enter stud at Gainesway Farm in Lexington for the 1996 season as previously announced, but will instead stand at Margaux Farm near Midway, Kentucky. Syndication is currently underway on the six-year-old stallion, who is slated to stand his initial season for a fee of \$20,000 live foal, payable November 1. Devil His Due won five Grade I stakes from ages three to five, and won at distances ranging from six furlongs to 1 1/4-miles. Overall, he won 11 of 41 starts for earnings of \$3,920,405. JAPAN CUP INVITEES ANNOUNCED The Japanese Racing Association yesterday announced the list of foreign horses invited to the Nov. 26 Japan Cup. Those invited from North America include **Sandpit (Brz)** (Baynoun {Ire}), **Awad** (Caveat), **Turk Passer** (Turkoman) and **Lassigny** (Gone West). The connections of all four runners have accepted the invitation to run in the 15th edition of the 12 furlong turf event and will be joined by **Sunshack (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) and **Hernando (Fr)** (Niniski), the only two European runners confirmed to have accepted invitations. Also invited from Europe are **Lando (Ger)** (Acatenango {Ger}), **Pure Grain (GB)** (Polish Precedent) and **Carling (Fr)** (Garde Royale {Ire}). Oceanians **Danewin (AUS)** (Danehill) and **Jeune (GB)** (Kalaglow {Ire}) were also extended invitations, with only Danewin a confirmed starter. A selection committee will determine Japanese participants November 14, but the strongest of the home team starters appears to be American-bred **Hishi Amazon** (Theatrical {Ire}).

PURSES, HANDLE UP AT DELAWARE PARK

Delaware Park's 1995 meeting, which ran from April 15 through November 5 for a total of 129 live racing dates, produced total on-track wagering of \$27,251,269 for a daily average of \$211,250, down 20 percent from last year. However, the track reported increases in all other areas. Total wagering from all sources was up 64 percent to a daily average of \$693,988; daily purse distribution was up 38 percent to an average of \$77,880; and attendance rose a slight 0.2 percent for a daily average of 2,963.

IF YOU CAN MAKE IT THERE...

In the seven day period between Oct. 22-28, some may have missed the shining moments of the New York State breeding program's relatively short history.

On Breeders' Cup afternoon, of course, Virginia Kraft Payson's L'Carriere (Carr de Naskra) pulled more money out of a second-place finish than any horse in history. Although beaten by Cigar by 2½ lengths in the \$3 million Breeders' Cup Classic, L'Carriere picked up \$600,000 for his finish; \$60,000 additional in Breeders' Cup nominator prizes plus another \$65,000 in owner, breeder and stallion awards from the New York Breeding Program.

That all adds up to \$725,000 for not winning and it shot the four-year-old's bankroll over \$1 million for the year, a figure attained in '95 by only a half-dozen others: Cigar, Thunder Gulch, Serena's Song, Sandpit, Peaks and Valleys and Awad.

Seven days prior to the Classic, another New Yorker, the Brazil Stable's Perfect Arc, upped her unbeaten record for the year to seven when she won Keeneland's Queen Elizabeth Challenge Cup in majestic fashion, drawing away from a superior field of three-year-old fillies to win by two lengths.

Howard Battle, Keeneland's Racing Secretary, saluted Perfect Arc's performance by calling her the race's finest winner. She was also the first favorite to win it since it was first contested on grass in 1985.

Whereas the accolades for Cigar's wondrous 10 for 10 year keep accumulating, whither stands Perfect Arc's 7 for 7 and her undefeated grass record of 8 for 8? Hopefully she is not like Laura, "the face you see on the train that is passing through," but there are indeed some haunting things about Perfect Arc.

It appears that she will be that oblique rarity; the undefeated runner that has competed in major events yet concludes the year without an Eclipse Award. People still argue about the last of those, Ogden Phipps's Personal Ensign, who went 4-4 in 1987, but lost the Eclipse to Sacahuista, who was 2-9, yet took the Spinster and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in her concluding races of the year.

Perfect Arc was not eligible to the Breeders' Cup, so it would have cost \$120,000 for her to have run in it, a terribly high price to pay. But look who won the Mile. A three-year-old filly named Ridgewood Pearl (Indian Ridge).

In theory, at least, Perfect Arc could win the Eclipse by going to California and defeating the front-runner for the title as the top female grass runner, Possibly Perfect, in this weekend's \$600,000 Yellow Ribbon at Oak Tree (Nov. 12) or the \$700,000 Matriarch at Hollywood Park on Nov 26.

Possibly Perfect is five for six this year including three victories in Grade 1 races. One of those came in the \$500,000 Beverly D at Arlington International, generally regarded as the most significant event for females on the grass.

During the Breeders' Cup week Angel Penna, Jr. was congratulated again and again by horsemen for his accomplishments with Perfect Arc. Not to be forgotten is the fact that Angel already has an Eclipse for training a filly; he handled Christmas Past, the nation's top three-year-old filly of 1982.

"Ambition," Penna says, "is to be admired; greed is a mistake," indicating that although some people might want him to ship out west to face Possibly Perfect, he prefers to give his filly a good rest before her four-year-old season.

Owner Paul Sorren bought Perfect Arc for his Brazil Stable for \$22,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale in 1993. She is by Brown Arc (Alleged) from Podeica, an Argentine mare who broke her maiden by beating Bayakoa in a Grade 1 race. If that isn't odd enough, Penna trained both the sire and dam of Perfect Arc.

Brown Arc is now standing at Brookdale Farm in Lexington, and the last reported stud fee for him was \$1,000, a figure certain to increase. Perfect Arc made up one-eighth of Brown Arc's entire first crop and was the only one sold at auction.

"She has been in training since last December," Penna says. "I want her to have a big four-year old year and go to the Breeder's Cup Mile with her then. She is a big filly and can handle any kind of ground. She had an excellent year."

No, Angel, she had a perfect year.
