SANTA ANITA TO APPLY FOR REDUCED

RACING DAYS In an effort to improve field size and quality, Clifford C. Goodrich, president of Los Angeles Turf Club Inc., announced Tuesday that Santa Anita will apply for two fewer racing days than originally planned. The 1995-96 winter/spring racing calendar would now offer 87 days rather than the previously planned 89. Two Wednesdays following special Monday holiday racing cards. Jan. 17 and Feb. 23, would be eliminated. "Although the prevailing belief in this business seems to be that more racing is better," said Goodrich, "our fans are telling us they want larger fields and quality races. We at Santa Anita must face the fact that there simply are not enough horses to properly fill racing programs as they now exist. Eliminating a six-day week in January and February is a small step toward improving our product, while still attempting to maximize profitability for our shareholders." Besides eliminating two racing days, Goodrich said Santa Anita plans on running eight-race cards weekdays during January and February and 10race cards on weekends during the latter half of the meeting.

These will be followed by a selected session of weanlings Friday night at 7 p.m., a selected session of broodmares, broodmare prospects and stallion prospects Saturday evening at 7 p.m. and a Foxfield dispersal of 69 horses, also Saturday night. YELLOW RIBBON INVITATIONAL S.-GI, \$600,000, 3vo/up, f/m, 1 1/4mT

Flagbird (Nureyev) worked five furlongs in :59 over Santa Anita's fast main track Wednesday. The fourvear-old filly, a GSW in France, Ireland and Italy, will be making her North American debut Sunday. Canadian invader Bold Ruritana (Bold Ruckus) arrived in California early Wednesday morning for the race; also scheduled to arrive Wednesday was French-based Tamise (Time for a Change). Olivier Peslier, currently one of the leading jockeys in France, has been named to ride the threevear-old filly for trainer Andre Fabre. Tamise has won four of six career starts in France, including the G3 Prix de Flore Oct. 29. Also probable for the Yellow Ribbon are Alpride (Ire) (Alzao), McCarron; Angel in My Heart (Fr) (Rainbow Quest), Asmussen; Don't Read My Lips (Turkoman), F. Valenzuela; Onceinabluemamoon (Al Mamoon), no rider; Mz. Zill Bear (Salutely), Pincay Jr.; and Possibly Perfect (Northern Baby), Nakatani. The provisional invitees are last year's Yellow Ribbon winner Aube Indienne (Fr) (Bluebird), Real Connection (Vigors) and Capracotta (Ire) (Shernazar {Ire}). SW Real Connection drilled a half-mile at Santa Anita Wed. in :47 2/5.

Among the weanlings scheduled to be sold are a full brother to MGSW Jaggery John (Blushing John) and a half-brother by Mister Frisky to Grade I-winning sprinter Lite the Fuse. Broodmares of note in Saturday's selected session are half-sisters to multiple Canadian champion Deputy Jane West, GI Santa Anita Derby winner Larry the Legend, Champion Sprinter Precisionist, English Group 1 winner Green Desert and MGSW's Honorable Miss and Bailjumper. Highlights of the Foxfield dispersal include GI winner Scoot (Mr. Prospector) in foal to Dayjur; a half-sister to Arlington Million and Japan Cup winner Golden Pheasant; the dam of GI Secretariat S. winner Vaudeville; and a half-sister to MGI winner and millionaire Skip Trial.

SILKEN CAT SOLD Undefeated Silken Cat (Storm Cat), the likely choice for this year's Champion Two-Year-Old Filly in Canada, has been sold to Irving and Marjorie Cowan at a price believed to be over \$500,000. Silken Cat raced three times at Woodbine this season, winning all three starts by a combined 25 1/4-lengths. She took the Mazarine S. (GIC) in her most recent outing, but developed soreness in her hind quarters after the race and was retired for the year. The Canadian-bred filly is scheduled to race as a three-year-old for trainer Neil Drysdale.

NEW JERSEY DATES ANNOUNCED FOR 1996

During a meeting of the New Jersey Racing Commission Wednesday, the 1996 Thoroughbred racing schedule for New Jersey was announced. Garden State Park will run Jan. 12-May 24, and for the first time will have a Friday night closing date. The Jersey Derby for three-yearolds on the grass will be held May 24. Monmouth Park will open May 25 and run through Labor Day, Sept. 2. Monmouth will race five days a week, but it has not yet been determined which two days will be dark. Atlantic City Race Course will be open June 7-Aug. 31; a date has not yet been set for the GI Caesar's International. The Commission awarded Atlantic City the dates with the stipulation that the track must file monthly reports to the Commission updating its economic status. The Meadowlands, which will race Sept. 6-Dec. 14, was presented with two changes to its traditional schedule. The New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority set Labor Day as Monmouth's closing day, rather than Meadowlands opening day as has been done in the past. The start of the Meadowlands meet will be delayed until the Friday night after Labor Day, creating a three day hiatus. To compensate for those lost days, the Meadowlands' meet was extended until Dec. 14, a week longer than usual.

OJC SEEKS EXPANDED SEASON The Ontario Jockey Club, which had been looking to expand its current season scheduled to end Decimber 6, is now looking to add even more dates. Originally, the OJC had sought to add eight more days of racing up until December 31. Now it is looking to increase to 11. The OJC has to get approval from the Ontario Racing Commission. A meeting is scheduled for Friday.

SANTA ANITA COMPANIES TO SELL NON-CORE REAL ESTATE ASSETS The Santa Anita Companies announced Wednesday they will dispose of non-core real estate assets as part of their long-term program to build shareholder value through the development of their prime Arcadia property. As a result of their disposition, The Santa Anita Companies will have greater financial strength and flexibility and a sound foundation for long-term earnings growth. The disposition program is expected to produce improved cash flow and net income, as well as, upon completion, reduce total debt by approximately \$37 million.


