WORK THE CROWD IN "GUARDED"

CONDITION **Work The Crowd** (Political Ambition), who was scratched from last Saturday's Gill California Jockey Club H. at Bay Meadows because of a fever, is battling pleurisy, an inflammation of the lining of the chest cavity, at the University of California at Davis. The four-year-old filly spiked a fever of 103 last Saturday, but had a normal temperature Sunday morning after being treated with antibiotics. She was sent to UC Davis Tuesday after the fever returned. "We'd treat her and it would go down, but then it would go right back up again," said her trainer Greg Gilchrist. "Tuesday, we decided we'd better get her to Davis. I talked to the doctors (Thursday) morning and she's doing a little better, but she's still in guarded condition. She has some fluid in her chest cavity and they have to drain that off." **Work The Crowd**, owned by Harris Farms and Norma Foster Maddy, is a multiple stakes winner of 14 races and \$644,550.

AFTERNOON DEELITES BREEZES Burt Bacharach's **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) breezed three furlongs in :38 2/5 Thursday at Santa Anita in his first workout since returning to training 30 days ago. "This part's easy," said trainer Richard Mandella. "The next month's going to be a little bit tougher." **Afternoon Deelites** hasn't raced since his eighth-place finish in the May 5 Kentucky Derby. The colt came out of that race with a slight tear in the tendon of his left foreleg and spent the summer recuperating at Sid Craig's Rancho Paseana in California. "If he's ready in time for the (Dec. 26) Malibu S. that would be fine, but we haven't set any specific date for him," Mandella said. "And at the first bad sign, if we get one, we'll retire him and send him to Kentucky." **Afternoon Deelites** has won five of seven starts, including four graded stakes at Santa Anita and Hollywood Park, for earnings of \$668,125.

CORRECTION: It was incorrectly reported in yesterday's TDN that the top Canadian filly **Silken Cat** (Storm Cat) was purchased by Irving and Marjorie Cowan for a price believed to be over \$500,000. The filly was actually purchased by Aaron U. Jones, who bought the two-year-old for an undisclosed sum.

SILVER GHOST FILLY TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

THURSDAY A gray or roan weanling filly by Silver Ghost--One Last Colony (Pleasant Colony) topped Thursday's first open session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Mixed Sale. Consigned by Buckland Farm Inc., the Kentucky-bred filly, who is the first foal out of her stakes-placed dam, was purchased for \$35,000 by Edward P. Evans. Overall, 106 weanlings, yearlings, horses of racing age, stallions and stallion prospects were sold for a gross of \$520,600 and an average of \$4,911. There were 19 horses reported as not sold. The sale continues through Saturday.

TURFWAY ANNOUNCES NEW STAKES

EVENTS Turfway Park's stakes schedule for the 1995 Holiday Meet will include two new races honoring classic winners Winning Colors and Prairie Bayou. The two new events, both of which will be broadcast on ESPN's "2Day at the Races," are part of the seven-race stakes program for the Holiday Meet, which runs from Sunday, November 26 through Sunday, December 31. All seven stakes carry \$75,000-guaranteed purses. The Winning Colors, to be run December 10, is for fillies and mares going six-and-a-half furlongs. The 1 1/16-mile Prairie Bayou, for three-year-olds and up, is set for Dec. 17.

George M. Hendrie, chairman, announced Thursday the appointment of William D. Graham to The Board of Trustees of The Ontario Jockey Club. The appointment of Graham was unanimously approved at The Board of Trustees meeting held Friday, Nov. 3, at Woodbine. Graham, who breeds and owns Thoroughbreds under the nom de course Windhaven, raced 1989 Canadian Oaks winner Blondeinamotel, 1981 Frizette S. winner Proud Lou and 1977 E.P. Taylor winner Majestic Kahala. Born in Ontario, Graham, 57, brings valuable racing experience to The Board, having served nine years as vice-president of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and six years as a member of the Ontario Racing Commission.

A popular winner in his debut at Woodbine Wednesday night, the colt showed tremendous professionalism, coming from off the pace and responding to the challenge of the well-backed second choice, **Secret Meadow** (Meadowlake), who had run once before. Mike Doyle, racing manager for owner Frank Stronach, said that while the two-year-old is nominated to both the Remsen at Aqueduct and the Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill, both set for November 25, it is likely he will ship to the Fair Grounds to run in a non-winners-of-two allowance race, and added that he may follow the Triple Crown trail through Louisiana and/or Arkansas.
