KEENELAND'S NOVEMBER BREEDING STOCK SALE BEGINS TODAY A record

3,844 horses and stallion shares have been catalogued for the 11-day 1995 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, which begins today in Lexington, Kentucky. The total consists of 2,103 broodmares, 1,562 weanlings, five yearlings, seven stallions, two stallion shares and 165 horses of other ages. The auction continues through Nov. 21 with sessions at 10 a.m. daily. The Frances A. Genter Stable will disperse 53 horses during Saturday's first session. Included in the dispersal is the dam of Unbridled, who carried the late Mrs. Genter's colors to victory in the 1990 Kentucky Derby and Breeders' Cup Classic. The 14-year-old Gana Facil (*Le Fabuleux), who is also the dam of Wood Memorial winner Cahill Road, is in foal to Seeking the Gold. The Genter Stable will sell 27 broodmares, 19 weanlings, five yearlings, one four-year-old and one five-year-old. Described as a major reduction, John T.L. Jones' Walmac International, as agent, will sell 42 horses Monday, Nov. 13. Walmac will offer 28 broodmares, 13 weanlings (seven by Nureyev) and one four-year-old. During the auction, mares will be sold in foal to such prominent sires as Sadler's Wells, Mr. Prospector, Danzig, Storm Cat, Nureyev, Woodman, Deputy Minister and Gulch. Last year in November, Keeneland sold 2.492 horses for \$121,088,500, an average of \$48,591. The total sales and average increased dramatically from the previous November and were the highest since 1989. Top price in 1994 was \$2.7 million for Mapleiinsky, Dam of champion Sky Beauty, the nineyear-old daughter of Nijinsky II was in foal to A.P. Indy.

LURE SALE FINALIZED Coolmore Stud yester-day finalized the deal for the outright purchase of dual Breeders' Cup Mile winner Lure (Danzig). The deal for the purchase of the six-year-old stallion from a syndicate of insurers ran into contractual problems last month but everything has now been agreed to the satisfaction of both parties. Coolmore Stud Manager Christy Grassick said, "We are delighted to have secured this exceptional prospect for stud duty. He covered a number of mares successfully to Southern Hemisphere time and the early indications show a marked improvement in his fertility over last season's figures." Lure will stand at Coolmore Stud in Fethard, Co. Tipperary, for a fee of 25,000 Irish Guineas (approximately \$41,400 U.S.).

FASIG-TIPTON OPEN SALE SOARS An unraced three-year-old daughter of Pleasant Colony brought a bid of \$46,000 to top yesterday's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Open Fall Mixed Sale. Colonial Stride, a daughter of MGSW Costly Shoes consigned by Buckland Stables, was purchased by Brereton C. Jones. In all, 148 broodmares sold Friday for a total of \$885,000, averaging \$5,980, up nearly 50 percent from 1994. During last year's Open Fall Mixed Sale, held in one day, broodmares averaged \$3,993; the 1995 weanlings averaged \$5,325, up 30 percent from last year's average of \$4,094. The 1995 auction saw 254 hips sold for \$1,405,600, up 32 percent from last year's gross, when 262 hips sold for \$1,064,900.

TRAGEDY ON KENTUCKY HIGHWAY A

fire which started on a horse van traveling north early Thursday morning on Interstate 75 in Rockcastle County, Kentucky caused a chain reaction which left one woman dead and two seriously injured, and claimed the lives of all five horses aboard the van. According to a report in today's Daily Racing Form, a Brook Ledge Inc. van was carrying five horses, including GSW Looie Capote, when it caught fire. The van driver pulled over and an attempt was made to free the horses, but one of the five broke loose and ran across the highway onto the southbound lane of I-75, where it was struck by a vehicle driven by Jean L. Nunnevy, 52, of Berea, Kentucky. Nunnevy then veered into the northbound traffic, which resulted in a five-car pile-up; she died after suffering severe head injuries in the accident. Elizabeth Renner, whose vehicle was struck head-on by Nunnevy, and her passenger, Tammy Weaver, were hospitalized. The horse which started the chain of events was killed after being struck by a second vehicle. Three of the horses on the van died from burns and smoke inhalation; the fifth was transported to Lexington's Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital but also later died. Confirmed dead in the accident were Looie Capote, a graded stakes winner of \$533,505 who was believed in foal to Storm Cat, and Pandysia, an unraced four-year-old filly in foal to Alleged, both of which were bound for the Keeneland sale. The horse van attendant, Stoner Cole, was treated for smoke inhalation and shoulder injuries. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

SIR IVOR DEAD Sir Ivor (Sir Gaylord), a champion at two and three and England's Horse of the Year in 1968, was euthanized yesterday at Claiborne Farm due to the infirmities of advanced age. He was 30. The sire of seven champions, the stallion had 23 crops to race, with a total of 89 stakes winners and earnings of better than \$20 million. Sir Ivor, who arrived in Kentucky in June, 1970 and stood at Claiborne until his retirement in 1991, was buried at the farm's Marchmont cemetery.

GAINESWAY RETIRES EXPLODENT Graham J. Beck's Gainesway Farm announced Friday the retirement from stud duty of leading sire Explodent (Nearctic) at the age of 26. Explodent has sired 62 stakes winners, including millionaires Mi Selecto, Exchange and Exbourne. For 12 straight years, from 1982 through 1993, he was ranked on the Leading Sires list with progeny earnings that averaged over \$1,500,000. The five-year-old, who won at distances from six furlongs to a mile and an eighth, captured the GI Jerome Mile at three and the nine-furlong GI Philip H. Iselin H. at five and earned \$496,306 while winning seven of his 11 career starts. He will stand for a fee of \$5,000, live foal, payable September 1.

Cherokee Rose (Ire) (Dancing Brave) was originally invited, but declined. So Factual has already accepted the invitation; the other preliminary nominees, one of which could join the field if another invitee declines, are: Blitzer (Ziggy's Boy), Demaloot Demashoot (Bold Ruckus), Hever Golf Rose (GB) (Efisio {GB}), King Ruckus (Bold Ruckus), Leap For Joy (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), O'Martin (Geiger Counter) and Wild Gold (Wild Again).
