POSSIBLY PERFECT RETIRED Possibly

Perfect (Northern Baby), one of the frontrunners for the 1995 Eclipse Award as Champion Turf Mare, has been retired due to a torn ligament in her right foreleg, according to a story in Tuesday's Los Angeles Times. Trainer Bobby Frankel, who scratched the fiveyear-old mare from last Sunday's GI Yellow Ribbon the day before the race, said the injury was revealed after X-rays were taken Sunday. "It's something she's had all along, more or less, but I was surprised to learn that it was torn," Frankel told the Times. "The ankle had been just a little puffy for about a week and a half. A lesser horse and we probably wouldn't have even checked it." Kentucky-bred Possibly Perfect entered 1995 already a multiple Grade I winner, having taken the GI Yellow Ribbon in '93, the GI Santa Barbara H. in '94 and the GI Santa Ana H. in '94. However, her five-year-old campaign proved to be her best, with five wins and one second from six starts. Her victories this year included the GI Ramona H. at Del Mar, GI Gamely H. and GII Wilshire H. at Hollywood Park and the GI Beverly D at Arlington in her last start August 26. Owned by Blue Vista Inc., she retires with 11 wins from 18 career starts for earnings of \$1,377,273.

HOLLYWOOD PARK OPENS TODAY Hollywood Park's Autumn Meeting, featuring the \$2-million Turf Festival Nov. 24-26, opens its doors today and continues through Sunday, Dec. 24. Highlights of the meet include the \$700,000 GI Matriarch S. Nov. 26; the \$400,000 GI Crown Royal Hollywood Derby Nov. 26; the \$500,000 GI Hollywood Turf Cup Dec. 10; the \$250,000 GI Hollywood Starlet Dec. 16; and the \$500,000 GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 17. Friday night racing returns for the fall campaign with the first race at 7 p.m., except Friday, Nov. 25, when first post is at 12:30 p.m. Today's opening day feature will be the first running of the \$60,000-added Flawlessly S. for fillies and mares, ages three and up at one-mile on the turf. Heading the field is 1993 Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Phone Chatter (Phone Trick). The Richard Mandella-trainee will be making her third straight start on the grass; she was fifth in the GII Palomar H. at Del Mar in her last start Sept. 9.

A half-sister to six stakes horses including Proskona, the Champion Three-Year-Old Filly in Italy in 1984, Cloelia was consigned by Lane's End, agent, and purchased for \$270,000 by Kilroy Estates of Dublin, Ireland. The day's highest priced weanling was a chestnut colt by Summer Squall. Purchased for \$155,000 by Mike Akers, agent, the colt's dam Czar's Princess (Czaravich) is a half-sister to MGI winner Sardula. Overall, 286 horses were sold Tuesday for a gross of \$13,676,300, an average of \$47,819 and a median price of \$37,000. Through the first four days of the auction, 1,048 horses brought a total of \$110,216,500 for an average of \$105,168 and a median of \$58,500. The sale continues through Nov. 21.

TIKKANEN HEADING TO THE FAR EAST 1994 Breeders' Cup Turf Champion Tikkanen (Cozzene) will stand the 1996 breeding season at JS Company's Arrow Stud near Shizunai, Japan. The four-year-old gray will remain the property of George Strawbridge, his current owner, who plans to race him in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup Dec. 10. In addition to the Breeders' Cup Turf, Tikkanen also won the GI Turf Classic Invitational S. at Belmont and the G2 Prix Greffulhe in France, both in 1994. His current record stands at four wins from sixteen starts for earnings of \$1,585,103.

RIDGEWOOD PEARL TO RAINBOW OUEST

Ridgewood Pearl (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who became the third filly or mare to win the Breeders' Cup Mile when she took this year's event at Belmont Park, has been retired from racing and will be bred in 1996 to Rainbow Quest. The three-year-old filly won six of eight career starts with a second and a third for earnings of \$1,179,650. In 1995, she won Group/Grade I stakes in the U.S. (Breeders' Cup Mile), France (Emirates Prix du Moulin de Longchamp), England (Coronation S.) and Ireland (Irish 1000 Guineas).

MEADOWLANDS CANCELS RACING The Meadowlands cancelled racing Tuesday night in the face of forecasts calling for extremely high winds and heavy rain. It is the second time in the past week that the New Jersey track has had to cancel its live racing. Live racing was called off Saturday night just before post time when a similar storm caused damage and power outages throughout the area. Simulcasting to the Meadowlands was also cancelled Tuesday night. "We felt that in the interest of our guests, horsemen and employees, that it would be much safer to cancel early," said Hal Handel, executive vice president and chief operating officer of racing. Live Thoroughbred action is expected to return to the Meadowlands Wednesday night.

JAPAN CUP FIELD TAKES SHAPE As of November 14, the participants for the 1995 Japan Cup, to be run Nov. 26 at Tokyo Racecourse, were decided as follows. Chosen from America were Grade I winners Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}), Awad (Caveat), Turk Passer (Turkoman) and Lassigny (Gone West). Japan Cup starters from Europe are expected to be Sunshack (GB) (Rainbow Quest), Hernando (Fr) (Niniski), Lando (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), Pure Grain (GB) (Polish Precedent) and Carling (Fr) (Garde Royale {Ire}). Oceanians likely for the race are Danewin (AUS) (Danehill) and Stony Bay (NZ) (Dahar). Five local horses are included in the field. They are last year's Horse of the Year in Japan Narita Brian (Jpn) (Brian's Time), Hishi Amazon (Theatrical {Ire}), Taiki Blizzard, (Seattle Slew), Matikane Tanhauser and Royce and Royce (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}).

RETAMA TO RECOVER LOSSES The Texas Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (THBPA) and Retama Park have executed an agreement whereby Retama will be able to recapture the \$1.1 million in overpaid Thoroughbred purses from its first Thoroughbred meet held this past summer. The recovery period will extend over four years and be completed by December 31, 1999, utilizing purse revenues generated on interstate simulcasting offered at Retama when there is no live racing taking place. By contractual terms currently in place, Retama is entitled to recover \$276,000 of the \$1,107,602.30 total overpayment before the start of its second Thoroughbred meet in early June next year. In both 1997 and 1998, Retama will recover an additional \$250,000 each year, and will complete the \$1.1 million recovery in 1999. THBPA Executive Director Dave Hooper said, "In reaching this agreement, the THBPA believes it has once again stepped forward to provide financial assistance to a Class I Texas racetrack in an effort to bring greater stability to its current and future existence."

Saturday, will now be pointed to Churchill Downs' GIII \$200,000a Falls City H. to be run Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 23. A victory in the Falls City would push the four-year-old filly's career earnings over the \$1 million mark.

Churchill Downs Incorporated yesterday announced results for the three and nine-month periods ended Sept. 30, 1995. The Company reported consolidated revenues for the third quarter of \$13.2 million, up 76 percent from the \$7.5 million recorded last year. Increases in gross revenues were generated primarily by Churchill Downs' subsidiary Hoosier Park, L.P., which is majority owner and operator of the Company's Indiana racing operations. Churchill Downs reported a consolidated net loss of \$2.2 million, or \$0.57 per share, for the third quarter compared to a net loss of \$1.8 million, or \$0.48 per share, in 1994. The Company historically incurs a net loss during the third quarter of its fiscal year primarily due to a lack of live racing at Churchill Downs.
