JOCKEY JULIE KRONE REACHES 3,000 WINS

Julie Krone, already America's winningest female Thoroughbred jockey, added another milestone to her career Wednesday at Aqueduct when she won her 3,000th race, according to *Daily Racing Form* statistics. Krone, 32, reached the milestone in yesterday's fourth race, riding Dustin's Dream to victory in a maiden special weight. It was one of her three winners on the day. A native of Benton Harbor, Michigan, Krone became racing's top woman jockey when she surpassed Patricia Cooksey with her 1,205th victory March 6, 1988 at Aqueduct. Cooksey currently ranks second on the female rider list with 1903 career wins through November 14. "To overcome all these injuries, to have my slump behind me and to have a lot of momentum going into Gulfstream, that makes all of

this special," Krone said. There was some confusion

CHAMPION TALKIN MAN TO WALMAC Walmac Farm General Manager John T.L. Jones announced Wednesday that 1994 Canadian Champion Two-Year-Old Colt Talkin Man (With Approval) will enter stud at the Lexington, Kentucky farm for a 1996 fee of \$7,500 live foal. Talkin Man won the GIC Coronation Futurity last year, defeating eventual Queen's Plate winner Regal Discovery by 6½ lengths. As a threeyear-old, the Canadian-bred won the GII Gotham S. and GII Wood Memorial S., both at Aqueduct, by a combined margin of 14 3/4 lengths. Bred by Kinghaven Farms and Angus Glen Farm, Talkin Man went postward 10 times, winning five of those starts and earning \$677,967. He raced for the partnership of Kinghaven Farms, Helen Stollery and Peter Wall, and will stand as the property of Kinghaven, Angus Glen, Walmac and Wimborne Farms.

GILDED TIME WEANLING TOPS KEENELAND WEDNESDAY A weanling bay colt by Gilded Time--For Dixie (Dixieland Band) brought top price of \$150,000 during Wednesday's fifth session of the 1995 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. Silver Oaks Farm of Sorrento, Florida bought the colt, who is from the first crop by Gilded Time, the Champion Two-Year-Old Colt of 1992. The highest-priced broodmare of Wednesday's session was Misspitch (Waguoit), in foal to 1993 Champion Two-Year-Old Colt Dehere. A multiple stakes-winner of \$176,898, five-year-old Misspitch was purchased by Upson Downs Farms, agent, for \$130,000. Overall, Keeneland sold 281 horses Wednesday for a gross of \$8,662,700, an average of \$30,828 and a median price of \$25,000. One stallion share in Eastern Echo brought an additional \$25,000. After five days of the 11-day sale, 1,329 horses have been sold for a total of \$118,879,200, an average of \$89,450 and a median price of \$47,000. The sale continues through Nov. 21.

SRI PEKAN TO COOLMORE STUD Sri Pekan (Red Ransom), a top two-year-old in England last year, is the latest recruit to Coolmore Stud's powerful stallion team. The Kentucky-bred will stand at the Irish stud for a 1996 fee of IRE 7,500 gns (\$12,632 U.S.), payable October 1. Sri Pekan raced only at two, posting a career record of five wins and one second-place finish from six starts for earnings of \$150,894. His only defeat, in his career debut, came at the hands of an eventual Group 2 winner. Sri Pekan went on to take the G3 Coventry S. at Ascot, the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood and the G2 Laurent Perrier Champagne S. at Doncaster by six lengths in his final career outing last September.

WOODBINE CANCELS WEDNESDAY NIGHT

CARD Jockeys, horsemen and The Ontario Jockey Club management unanimously agreed to cancel last night's 10-race Thoroughbred program at Woodbine due to track and weather conditions. Woodbine's dirt strip had been deluged by heavy snow and rainfall throughout the day and it was uncertain how the expected below freezing temperatures Wednesday night would affect it. John Whitson, The Ontario Jockey Club's Vice President of Thoroughbred Racing, said all three parties were in agreement to cancel approximately 90 minutes before the first race was scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. Whitson said a decision about Thursday afternoon's card is expected at about 11 a.m. this morning, after the three parties inspect the course once again. The track did remain open for simulcasting last night.

PURSE INCREASE AT REMINGTON PARK

Remington Park purses will see a 10 percent increase when entries are drawn today for Saturday's race card, said Mike Anifantis, director of racing and racing secretary. The across-the-board hike will also be accompanied by an eight percent increase in Oklahoma-bred purse supplements. The Oklahoma-bred purse hike is effective immediately. "It's always a good sign when you are able to increase purses," Anifantis said. "The trainers here have entered their horses this meeting through thick and thin. I'm glad we can give them a little pop before the meet ends." The continued growth of Remington's satellite wagering network and a recent Pick Six carryover of over \$129,000 are two factors Anifantis credits for the increase.

Jones Jr.'s name makes it even more special, because he was such a good friend."
