RIDGEWOOD PEARL IS EUROPE'S HORSE OF THE YEAR

Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Ridgewood Pearl (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) was named European Horse of the Year Wednesday evening at a dinner in London, where the 1995 Cartier Racing Awards, Europe's equivalent of the Eclipse Awards, were announced. According to a story in Friday's *Daily Racing Form*, undefeated Epsom Derby hero **Lammtarra** (Nijinsky II) finished second in the Horse of the Year voting by 25 points to 16, with G1 St. James Palace S. winner **Bahri** (Riverman) third with five points. **Ridgewood Pearl**, winner of five of six starts in 1995 including Grade/Group 1 victories in the U.S., France, Ireland and England, also took top Three-Year-Old Filly honors. **Lammtarra** was named top Three-Year-Old Colt; **Hever Golf Rose (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) top Sprinter; **Double Trigger (Ire)** (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}) top Stayer; and nine-year-old **Further Flight (GB)** (Pharly {Fr}), winner of the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket in September for the fifth consecutive year, top Older Horse. In the juvenile categories, undefeated G1 winner **Alhaarth (Ire)** (Unfuwain) was named top Two-Year-Old Colt; and unbeaten **Blue Duster** (Danzig), winner of the G1 Shadwell Stud Cheveley Park S., was named best Two-Year-Old Filly. The Cartier Award of Merit was presented to trainer John Dunlop.

CIGAR LIKELY TO SKIP DUBAI CUP According to a story in Friday's *Daily Racing Form*, Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Cigar** (Palace Music) will skip the \$4 million Dubai World Cup March 27 and remain in California to contest the Santa Anita H., Hollywood Gold Cup and Pacific Classic. The tracks who run those races, Santa Anita, Hollywood Park and Del Mar, have held preliminary discussions about awarding a \$3 million bonus to any horse who wins all three in 1996. "If we win the three races it would be twice as much as we would make if we went to Dubai," Cigar's owner Allen Paulson told the *Daily Racing Form*. "We couldn't run in both the Santa Anita H. and the Dubai race, so it looks as though we're going to keep him in the United States. In addition, it'll do more for racing in America."

SPORTS VIEW BRINGS \$105,000 TO TOP KEENELAND THURSDAY

Maitree Numpaisarn of Thailand bought **Sports View** (Cox's Ridge), an eight-year-old dark bay or brown stallion, for a top price of \$105,000 during Thursday's sixth session of Keeneland's 1995 November Breeding Stock Sale. **Sports View**, out of the mare Trestle (Tom Rolfe), is a multiple graded stakes winner of \$915,952 and a half-brother to four stakes winners including MGI winner **Classy Cathy**. His first foals are yearlings of 1995. Gainesway Farm of Lexington, as agent, consigned the young stallion. During Thursday's session, Keeneland sold 261 horses for a gross of \$5,976,200, an average of \$22,897 and a median price of \$19,000. After six days of the 11-day auction, 1,590 horses have brought \$124,855,400, an average of \$78,525. Gross sales for the entire 10-day auction last year totaled \$121,114,700. The sale continues through Nov. 21.

CALDER PURSES RAISED With on-track attendance up over 10 percent and on-track handle, including full-card simulcasts, up almost 30 percent, Tropical at Calder President Ken Dunn yesterday announced that the average daily purse distribution at the south Florida track will be increased to a record \$150,000. "The enthusiasm exhibited by racing fans for the Tropical meet has been extremely heartening. I'm also very pleased that, even with full-card simulcasting, our on-track handle on our own races is holding its own," said Dunn.

WOODBINE CANCELS AFTER DOUBLE Thursday afternoon's 10-race card at Woodbine was called off after the second race due to unsafe track conditions. It was the third straight cancellation at Woodbine, as rain and snow in the Toronto area have played havoc with the racing strip. A decision regarding Friday's program is expected this morning. Fans at the track and at intertrack outlets at Greenwood and Fort Erie once again received rain checks for admission and parking. The Ontario Jockey Club has already indicated it will not be able to make up the lost cards due to the fact it is already racing Mondays for the remainder of the season. The OJC is scheduled to end live Thoroughbred racing Dec. 6 and will be racing consecutive days for the last eight days before closing.

JOHN VON STADE RECEIVES AMBROSE

CLARK AWARD John T. von Stade, 57, has been named the recipient of the F. Ambrose Clark Award by the National Steeplechase Association. The award is given periodically to an individual "who has done the most to promote, improve and encourage the growth and welfare of steeplechasing." The award was originated in 1965; von Stade will be the 20th recipient. Chairman of the successful Far Hills (N.J.) Races since 1972, von Stade also serves as president of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in Saratoga. "It is pretty obvious why John was chosen," said NSA Executive Vice President Charlie Colgan. "He has been on the cutting edge of leadership in improving and promoting the sport for more than 20 years. Few people embody the spirit of Ambrose Clark the way John von Stade does." The award will be presented at the NSA's Centennial Dinner Saturday, Dec. 16 in Baltimore.

Local News, Churchill Downs:

Jockey Charles Woods Jr. was reported in stable condition Thursday morning at Caritas Medical Center after suffering four broken ribs, a broken jaw and severe lacerations of the left hand in a one-horse spill in Wednesday's sixth race at Churchill Downs. Woods' mount Strategic Intent stumbled coming out of the gate and Woods went right over the horse's head and then was stepped on by the three-year-old colt. Woods is to have his jaw wired shut Friday, with that procedure lasting six to eight weeks. Healing time for his ribs is expected to take from two to four weeks. The hospital reported that there appears to be no tendon or ligament damage to Woods' left hand.

Local News, Texas:

The Texas Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and Trinity Meadows Raceway Inc. have signed a three-year contract extending from January 1, 1996 through December 31, 1998. Key provisions of the contract include a guarantee of 70 live racing days annually, providing the handle on live and simulcast racing supports an average overnight purse structure of \$45,000 per day. "Horsemen throughout Texas have been increasingly concerned about declines in the number of live racing days compared with significant increases in simulcast racing days at every Texas track," said Dave Hooper, executive director of the THBPA. Trinity joins Sam Houston Race Park and Retama Park as the third Texas track committing to a guaranteed number of live racing days.
