#### MAJOR DISPERSALS HIGHLIGHT FASIG-TIPTON TODAY Dispersals of racing

stock from Rokeby and Due Process Stables headline the catalogue for today's Fasig-Tipton Horses of Racing Age Sale at Belmont Park. Return of Mom (Deputy Minister), already twice stakes-placed, tops the 28horse Due Process dispersal. The four-year-old filly, an allowance winner at Aqueduct and Belmont in her last two starts, could earn back a major portion of her purchase price in just three days; she is nominated to Friday's GI \$150,000 Top Flight H. at Aqueduct. The 14-horse Rokeby consignment includes seven-year-old Home of the Free (Hero's Honor), a multiple graded stakes winner of \$457,144; and Prodigal Son (Devil's Bag), a three-year-old colt who finished second as Hall of Fame trainer MacK. Miller's final starter Friday. A total of 173 horses have been catalogued for today's auction, which begins at 10:00 a.m.

AGA KHAN MAKES COMEBACK The Aga Khan, who turned his back on British racing in 1990 following the controversial disgualification of Aliysa from the previous year's Epsom Oaks, has announced his fulltime return in a statement renewing his link with Luca Cumani. Newmarket-based Cumani, trainer of the Aga's most recent Derby winner Kahyasi (1988), is to receive approximately 15 yearlings "before the end of the year." Michael Stoute, responsible for the Aga Khan's earlier Derby heroes Shergar (1981) and Shahrastani (1986), will not be receiving yearlings. The statement explained, "Because he will have almost one-third fewer yearlings in training this year than in 1990, the Aga Khan does not believe he can, at this time, maintain a meaningful presence with more than three trainers." Cumani in England, John Oxx in Ireland and Alain de Royer-Dupre in France will be the trio of handlers to race the Aga's world-famous green and red silks. The Aga himself said, "I greatly look forward to seeing my colors carried by horses trained in England and I am hopeful Luca Cumani will be as successful for me as he has been in the past." MATRIARCH S.-GI, \$700,000, 3vo/up, f/m, 10fT Bail Out Becky (Red Ransom), winner of the Miesque S. during last year's Turf Festival, will try to repeat her success over the course for trainer Bill Mott in the Matriarch. The three-year-old arrived from New York Monday with a contingent of five Mott-trained horses slated to run this weekend; the winner of this year's Del Mar Oaks will be joined in the starting gate Sunday by stablemate Duda (Theatrical {Ire}), who captured the 11-furlong GII Sheepshead Bay H. over the Belmont grass in June. Three-year-old G1SW Matiara (Bering {GB}), second in the GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine in her most recent effort, arrives today from France. Harbor View Farm, which took the 1991, '92 and '93 Matriarchs with champion Flawlessly, will be represented by Caress (Storm Cat) this year. The four-yearold has won 11 of 20 starts, including the GIII Poker over colts, and the Suffolk H. at Belmont and the GIII Athenia H. at Aqueduct in her last two starts; she gives Hall of Famer Allen Jerkens his first Turf Festival starter.

#### Sunday, Hollywood Park

CROWN ROYAL HOLLYWOOD DERBY-GI, \$400,000, 3yo, 9fT

Hawk Attack (Silver Hawk), winner of two-thirds of the Mid-America turf series for three-year-olds, is set to ship into town Thursday to get ready for the Hollywood Derby. The colt missed his chance to sweep the series when he developed a fever and had to sit out the American Derby after taking the GI Secretariat and the GII Arlington Classic. "It's a pleasure to know you're going to be in the hunt," said trainer Elliot Walden of the consistent runner, who has been on the board in 12 of 14 career starts. "If you put the tack on him, he's going to be." The Kentucky-bred has been second his last two starts, three-quarters of a length shy of victory in the GIII Hawthorne Derby and a neck back of Homing Pigeon in the River City H. last time out. Bill Mott will saddle Green Means Go (Green Dancer) for the race off a four-month layoff; the colt bruised his left forefoot while winning his third straight in the GIII Lexington S. at Belmont July 16. "I feel the horse is awfully nice," said Mott. "He's been beaten one time, and that was in the second start of his life in a stake at the Meadowlands. He's done everything else we've asked of him. The foot seems fine now. We're back on track, and we've got quite a bit of work in him...good works. I'm optimistic he'll give a good account of himself."


**RECORD HANDLE AT SAM HOUSTON** More than \$1.2 million was wagered on Saturday night's Texas Champions Day racing card at Sam Houston, marking the largest handle at the track since it opened April 29, 1994. A total of \$856,586 was bet on the Sam Houston races from wagering sites around the country, and \$389,380 was bet on-track. Sam Houston patrons wagered an additional \$402,793 on simulcast signals, bringing the combined handle to \$1,648,759. "We offered an exciting night of good racing, full fields and Texas-bred excitement. The betting public here in Houston and around the nation responded. Sam Houston Race Park is heading in the right direction," said Bob Bork, senior vice president and general manager of the track. "It's a spiral that builds upward. Better handle makes better purses which brings better horses which makes better handle--and it all starts again."
