PURSE INCREASE AT AQUEDUCT Effective yesterday, purses at Aqueduct were raised by approximately 4½ percent overall. "The raise is not across the board," said New York Racing Association Vice President of Operations Terry Meyocks. "The amount of the raise will vary by classification. In general, we will try to reward the classification of horses that will be racing here this winter. The purse raise is a result of legislation passed last summer by the Assembly and Senate and signed by the Governor. It is due to their efforts that our horsemen will enjoy better purses this winter."

OGYGIAN SALE COMPLETED Foxfield has completed the sale of Ogygian (Damascus) to the San-Ai Club of Urakawa, Hokkaido, Japan for an undisclosed sum. Ogygian is scheduled to leave for Japan within a week. The 12-year-old won seven of 10 starts, including three GI stakes: the Futurity, Dwyer and Jerome. He earned \$455,520. The sire of five crops to race, his runners have earned over \$6 million. "I regret that Foxfield and other American breeders will be losing a stallion with such great brilliance and physical quality," said Foxfield Director of Operations Rob Whiteley. "I believe that trainers are just now figuring out how to manage Ogygian's babies successfully, and I believe several of his young horses will make a significant mark in the near future."

JOCKEYS INJURED IN AQUEDUCT SPILL Jockeys Jose Trejo and Frank Alvarado were injured in a spill when their horses, Eryn's Abby Girl (Herat) and Cherokee Maid (War Secretary), fell during the running of the first race at Aqueduct Wednesday. Eryn's Abby Girl stumbled early in the race, causing Cherokee Maid to fall as well. Both horses were uninjured. Trejo, who complained of pain in his lower back, was sent to North Shore Hospital in Manhasset, N.Y. for precautionary X-rays. "It appears he was stepped on, but fortunately it was in opportune spots," said Dr. Andy Samma, the hospital's Emergency Department Director. Alvarado suffered a contusion of the front of his lower right leg and an abrasion on his right elbow and was sent for X-rays of his right leg.

RETAMA CONSIDERS BANKRUPTCY Just seven months after opening, the owners of Retama Park have voted to consider bankruptcy because of \$2.3 million in unpaid bills, according to a story in yesterday's Fort-Worth Star Telegram. Track officials voted Monday to shut down live quarter horse racing at the track immediately. "All of this is a step-by-step process that could lead to bankruptcy," said Retama Development Corp. President Andy Iosue to the San Antonio Express-News. "We're going to spend the next week or so with our insolvency proceedings and see if bankruptcy reorganization is the most expedient route."

ISRAEL COHEN TO DISPERSE STABLE Fasig-Tipton will disperse the racing stable of Israel Cohen at its Mixed Sale at Timonium, Maryland Monday, Dec. 4 at approximately 5 p.m. The 25 horses of racing age will comprise the final offerings of the two-day sale and are featured as an addendum to the catalogue. The group includes 10 two-year-olds, only two of which have raced to date. Cohen and his longtime trainer, Dean Gaudet, have campaigned a stable from Laurel for many years. "Mr. Cohen's deteriorating health has required his advisors to take steps to put parts of his holdings in order," said Mike O'Farrell of Ocala Stud, who will help to coordinate the dispersal, "and the Midlantic December sale was an opportunity to deal with the racing stable. The dispersal includes all his racehorses with the exception of the multiple stakeswinning mare Mixed Appeal (Mighty Appealing). She will be offered as a broodmare prospect at Fasig-Tipton's January 7 Mixed Sale in Lexington." A separate cataloque will be distributed by Nov. 23 and horses may be inspected at Laurel by appointment only with Gene Leach at 301-776-4670.
