TATTERSALLS WEANLING SALE BEGINS

TODAY Tattersalls's four-day weanling sale begins today at the Park Paddocks in Newmarket, England. A total of 962 weanlings have been catalogued for the sale, which runs through Dec. 2. Past European Group 1 winners who have emerged from the December auction include British St. Leger winner Classic Cliche (Ire) (Salse), Epsom Derby winner Dr Devious (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}), two-time Juddmonte International winner Ezzoud (Ire) (Last Tycoon (Ire)), British 2000 Guineas winner Mister Baileys (GB) (Robellino), Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Nicer (Ire) (Pennine Walk (Ire)) and British and Irish 2000 Guineas winner Tirol (Ire) (Thatching {Ire}). This year's sale features weanlings by such leading European sires as Sadler's Wells (2), Caerleon (11), Sharpo (GB) (6), Warning (GB) (3) and Nashwan (1), as well as individuals by North American-based sires Chief's Crown (1), Danzig Connection (1), Dynaformer (2), Eastern Echo (1), Gone West (1), Hansel (1), Little Missouri (1), Miswaki (1), Rahy (1), Red Ransom (3), Regal Classic (1), Septieme Ciel (2), Silver Hawk (1), St. Jovite (1) and Star de Naskra (1). Weanlings of note scheduled to go through the auction ring are a half-brother by Suave Dancer to multiple champion User Friendly (GB); a fullsister to MG1 winner Ezzoud (Ire); and the second foal out of GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup winner La Gueriere -- a colt by St. Jovite.

MR. GREELEY TO DIXIANA FARM Dixiana Farm, along with Needham/Betz Thoroughbreds, announced they have jointly purchased an interest in William J. Condren and Joseph M. Cornacchia's Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up Mr. Greeley (Gone West), and will stand the stallion at Dixiana Farm in Lexington, Kentucky in 1996 for a fee of \$10,000 Live Foal. The threeyear-old colt, first or second in 11 of 16 career starts, won three graded stakes this year--the GIII Lafayette at Keeneland and both the GIII Swale S. and GIII Spectacular Bid Breeders' Cup S. at Gulfstream Park. In addition to finishing second by a neck in the Oct. 28 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, the chestnut also placed in the 1995 GII Jerome H., GIII Riva Ridge S. and GII Hutcheson S. By Gone West, sire of 11 1995 stakes winners to date, Mr. Greeley is out of the mare Long Legend and is thus a half-brother to stakes horses Majestic Legend (His Majesty), Talltalelady (Naskra) and Warfield (Roberto). He retires with earnings of \$474,452.

PURE GRAIN ON THE MEND Pure Grain (GB)

(Polish Precedent), who sustained a compound cannon-bone fracture while finishing 10th in Sunday's Japan Cup, has made enough progress to give connections hope of saving her for stud. The Michael Stoute-trained filly, winner of this year's Irish and Yorkshire Oaks, is still under veterinary care in Tokyo, but connections were heartened by the latest news of her condition. Stoute said from his Newmarket stables Tuesday, "I spoke to my head lad, Stuart Messenger, this morning and he told me Pure Grain is more comfortable. The filly is better now than when I left Japan and it is encouraging that she's already bearing a little weight on the injured leg. However it is very much a day-by-day process, so it would be wrong to get too bullish at this stage."

NUREYEV MARE TOPS GOFFS IRELAND Modern Dance (Nureyev), a six-year-old bay mare in foal to Ela-Mana-Mou (Ire), topped Goffs Ireland's November Premier Foal and Breeding Stock Sale, held November 23–26. Consigned by Godolphin Stud as the property of Godolphin Management Co. Ltd., Modern Dance, a half-sister to GI winner Too Chic (Blushing Groom {Fr}), was purchased for 135,000gns (\$227,382) by B.B.A. (Ireland) Ltd. Overall, 695 horses were sold during the four-day auction for a gross of \$10,157,748 and an average of \$14,615, down eight percent from last year's average. The median price was \$8,422. There were 198 horses reported as not sold.

LYLE WHITING DEAD AT 80 Lyle Whiting, a retired trainer and former jockey, died in his sleep at his home in Hot Springs, Arkansas Monday night. He was the father of trainer Lynn Whiting, who saddled 1992 Kentucky Derby winner Lil E. Tee. Lyle Whiting had suffered from lymphoma since 1992 and had been released from the hospital earlier Monday. During his riding career, Whiting rode outstanding handicap horse First Fiddle and 1943 juvenile filly champion Durazna. As a trainer, he handled Par Avion, Baruna, Chance Sord and Weatherite. Final arrangements are incomplete, however there will be a memorial service and cremation. Arrangements are being handled by Gross Funeral Home in Hot Springs.

RIZZI RETIRES TO MOCKINGBIRD Rizzi (Afleet) has been retired from racing and will stand the 1996 season at Mockingbird Farm in Ocala, Florida. The four-year-old retires with earnings of \$286,506 and seven victories in 23 starts. Rizzi won the Perpetuate S. at Aqueduct as a two-year-old, the GIII Best Turn S. at three and the GIII Bold Ruler H. at four, defeating champion Cherokee Run and GI winner Light the Fuse. Rizzi will stand his first season at stud for \$3,500, live foal.

TATTERSALLS YEARLING SALE FIRST

SESSION RESULTS During Monday's first session of the Tattersalls Yearling Sale at Newmarket, England, 182 lots were sold for a gross of \$3,412,909 and an average of \$18,751, up 4.7 percent from last year's first session average of \$17,910. The highest priced yearling Monday was a bay filly by Danehill--Sweet Soprano (GB) (High Line {GB}). A full sister to British Group 3 winner Alriffa (GB), the filly was consigned by Ted Voute, agent, and purchased for \$122,740 by B.B.A. (UK) Ltd. The second and final session of the yearling sale was held Tuesday, with the Weanling Sale set to begin Wednesday.

HOOSIER PARK SECURES 1996 RACING

DATES The Indiana Horse Racing Commission approved yesterday Hoosier Park's request for 1996 racing dates. A 53-day Thoroughbred meet will be conducted from Sept. 20 to Nov. 30. Racing will be conducted Fridays through Tuesdays. First post will be at 7 p.m., except Sundays when racing will begin at 1:30 p.m. "Purses will be increased in 1996, which should bring about some great races," said Hoosier Park Executive Vice President/General Manager Rick Moore. Projections for the Thoroughbred meet call for average daily purses of \$67,000 to \$72,000. The Churchill Downs Management Co., a wholly-owned subsidiary of Churchill Downs Inc., is majority owner of Hoosier Park in Anderson, Indiana.

Through Sunday, Nov. 26, average daily handle on the Blue Ribbon races at Remington Park during the Fall Meet was \$87,065. Should the plan be approved, it will mark the first time Remington will take full-card simulcasting while
