### JERRY BAILEY BREAKS EARNINGS RECORD

According to Daily Racing Form statistics, Jerry Bailey has broken the record for the most earnings in a single season by a jockey. With his win aboard **Duda** (Theatrical {Ire}) in Sunday's \$700,000 Matriarch at Hollywood Park, Bailey's 1995 earnings rose to \$16,153,065. Mike Smith set the previous record in 1994 when his mounts earned \$15,979,820. "I realize the record won't last very long, but it's nice to savor the moment, at least for the year," Bailey said. "Maybe this will be the thing that helps me get the Eclipse Award."

**LAKEWAY RETIRED** *Lakeway* (Seattle Slew), a MGSW of \$965,330, has been retired from racing after X-rays showed she had suffered a stress fracture in her left front cannon bone. Her trainer Gary Jones reported the injury had been found during a physical exam scheduled to help determine whether to race the filly next year. "(Owner) Mike (Rutherford) decided to have her checked over before deciding if we should go ahead with a full campaign with her next year--to make sure there was nothing hidden. We didn't want to push her since we thought she'd have a great future as a broodmare." The results of the X-rays came on the heels of *Lakeway's* disappointing fourth place finish in Saturday's Falls City H. at Churchill Downs, the only off the board finish of her career. But, according to her veterinarian, the injury did not happen during the race. "The doctor said it had been there a while. She had been going sound. We were really lucky we found it," the trainer explained. Jones is going to miss his stellar filly. "She is the best 3-year-old filly I've ever trained and maybe the best I've seen run. She won four Grade I stakes races and three of them were stakes records. When you have a horse do all that, it hurts to lose them." Four-year-old *Lakeway* is currently at Manchester Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. She is scheduled to be bred to Storm Cat in 1996. She retires from racing with seven wins from 14 starts including victories in the GI Mother Goose S., GI Santa Anita and Hollywood Oaks and the GI Las Virgenes S.

### Sunday, Hollywood Park:

**BAYAKOA H.-GII**, \$100,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/16m

Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel's **Urbane** (Citidancer) drilled a half-mile in :47 handily Wednesday morning at Hollywood Park in her final workout for Sunday's Bayakoa. "It couldn't have been any better," trainer Randy Bradshaw said of the work. "I got her galloping out the five furlongs in :59 flat. If she gets beat Sunday, it'll be because she gets out-run by a better horse, not because she isn't doing well. But it's a tough race. You almost feel like you should be running for \$200,000." *Urbane*, never worse than third in eight career starts, won the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland in April. The three-year-old filly returned from a five-month layoff to take the \$95,000 Maryland Million Oaks by eight lengths in her last start Oct. 14. Also working for the Bayakoa yesterday was **Klassy Kim** (Silent Screen), who is coming off a sharp score in the Nov. 11 California Cup Distaff H. The four-year-old breezed seven furlongs in 1:26 2/5 for trainer Mel Stute. Also expected for the race are **Twice the Vice** (Vice Regent), **Pirate's Revenge** (Pirate's Bounty) and **Ashtabula** (Rahy).

### Saturday, Hollywood Park:

**ON TRUST H.**, \$100,000a, (S), 3yo/up, 7 1/2f

GSW **Kingdom Found** (The Bart) sharpened his speed Wednesday at Hollywood Park with a three furlong workout in :35 2/5 handily. The five-year-old has raced just once in the last seven months, winning a \$55,000 allowance at Santa Anita Oct. 27 and covering the 6 1/2 furlongs in 1:15 1/5. Also working for the On Trust yesterday were MSW **Desert Pirate** (Pirate's Bounty), who drilled five furlongs in :59 2/5 at Hollywood; and SW **Flying Sensation** (Flying Paster), who covered the same distance in 1:00 3/5 at Santa Anita.

**TOP MARES TO THUNDER GULCH** Thunder Gulch (Gulch), winner of two legs of this year's American Triple Crown, has received a very warm welcome from breeders on both sides of the Atlantic. Numerous outstanding broodmares and racemares are already booked to visit the Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes winner in his first season at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. Among them are 1994 Broodmare of the Year Fall Aspen, a mare whose total of seven Group and Graded stakes-winners include Timber Country, last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Colt. Thunder Gulch is also booked to cover 1986 Horse of the Year Lady's Secret, as well as Gana Facil, the dam of Kentucky Derby winner Unbridled and GI winner Cahill Road. Thunder Gulch will also be bred in 1996 to three European Group 1 winners, including two champion European two-year-old fillies: Lyric Fantasy, the 1992 champion, and Lemon Souffle, the 1993 champion. Wind In Her Hair, the third Group 1 winner, was second to champion Balanchine in the 1994 Energizer Oaks.

### TATTERSALLS WEANLING SALE FIRST

**SESSION RESULTS** A son of Lion Cavern--Nadia Nerina (Northern Dancer) brought the highest bid in Wednesday's first session of the Tattersalls Weanling Sale in Newmarket, England. The colt, consigned by Barton Stud and bought for \$73,644 by Michael Page, is from the first crop by Mr. Prospector's son Lion Cavern and is a half-brother to Nadina (Shirley Heights) (MGSP-Fr). In all, 126 weanlings were sold Wednesday for \$1,066,905. Last year, 168 horses were sold for \$2,004,279. This year's first session average of \$8,467 is down 29 percent from last year's \$11,929. The sale continues through December 2.

### UNBRIDLED'S SONG ARRIVES AT

**GULFSTREAM** Unbridled's Song (Unbridled), the early favorite for the 1996 Kentucky Derby, arrived at Gulfstream Park at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday. Buzz Chace, racing manager for owner Paraneck Stable, confirmed that the winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in only his third career start, is scheduled to make his 3-year-old debut in the \$75,000 GII Hutcheson S. February 4. The GII Fountain of Youth S. and GI Florida Derby are also on the precocious youngster's calendar for next spring. Unbridled's Song will walk Thursday and "may walk with tack on him on Friday and go to the track Saturday," said Chace. Jim Ryerson, trainer of Unbridled's Song, is at the Meadowlands with the other Paraneck horses and "it may be a week or more before he arrives at Gulfstream," according to Chace.

**CALDER WINS COURT RULING** Calder will get its day in court--something the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering tried to deny. When Calder applied for full-card simulcasting in June, the Division denied the request. Calder then applied for an administrative hearing from the state, which was also denied. Later, in October, the state granted a 90-day simulcasting experiment, which is due to end December 29. The Third District Court in Miami ruled yesterday the state could not deny Calder's request for an administrative hearing, even though it later allowed the track to simulcast. The court's written decision said, "We reverse and remand instructing the Division to hold a formal administrative hearing in order to ensure the generation of a proper record, as well as responsible agency decision making and policy making." The ruling will probably have a more immediate impact on Gulfstream, which just recently had a similar request denied by the state for full-card simulcasting. It is thought Gulfstream will have to reapply for an administrative hearing. But yesterday's ruling cleared the way for the possibility of getting simulcasting during its 1996 meeting, which begins January 3.

### TOSSEFOTHECOIN TO BLOOMING HILLS

**Tossofthecoin** (Magesterial), winner of two stakes this year including the GII Mervyn Leroy H. at Hollywood Park in May, will stand stud at Blooming Hills in Clements, California beginning in 1996. The five-year-old chestnut, who also placed in 10 graded stakes including second-place finishes in the GI Wood Memorial and GI Californian S. and a third in the \$1,000,000 Hollywood Gold Cup, defeated Grade I winners Best Pal, Cardmania, Concern, Sea Cadet, Tinnors Way and Urgent Request during his racing career. Tossofthecoin won six of 33 career starts, and finished in the money 26 times, for earnings of \$808,159. He will stand for \$3,500 live foal guaranteed and is owned by a Partnership.
