## 1997 BREEDERS' CUP DECISION

POSTPONED Officials of Breeders' Cup Limited have deferred a final decision concerning selection of a host track for the 1997 Breeders' Cup Championship until their next board meeting, currently scheduled for late February. "As a result of last minute and unforseen circumstances, some of our Executive Committee members were unable to attend today's meeting," said President James E. Bassett III following yesterday's Board of Directors meeting in Lexington. "We all feel that this decision is too important to be made without the benefit of a full discussion and have thus postponed it until our next meeting." Hollywood Park and the Oak Tree Racing Association are both under consideration for the 1997 Breeders' Cup, which is scheduled for November 8.

#### MAJOR DISPERSALS AT KEENELAND

JANUARY Major dispersals from Howard B. Keck and Due Process Stable are among 1,380 lots--1,376 horses and four stallion shares--catalogued for Keeneland's annual January 8-11 Horses of All Ages Sale. Keck, who bred 1986 Kentucky Derby winner and 1987 Horse of the Year Ferdinand, recently announced his retirement from racing after more than 50 years in the sport. He will sell 17 horses with Claiborne Farm as agent. Due Process will disperse 19 horses, including the dam of champion Dehere, Sister Dot (Secretariat); a yearling half-sister to Dehere will also be sold. Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency is the agent for Due Process. In addition to the two major dispersals, GI Spinster S. runner-up Jade Flush (Jade Hunter) will be sold by the partnership of Allen Paulson, William Condren and Joseph Cornacchia. The total number of horses catalogued for the January sale is the third highest in the history of the auction. There are 670 broodmares, 438 yearlings, 54 two-year-olds, seven stallions, four stallion shares and 207 horses of other ages.

## LONESOME GLORY REIGNS IN ENGLAND On the verge of picking up his third Eclipse Award as America's top steeplechaser, Lonesome Glory (Transworld) dazzled the crowd at England's Sandown Park vesterday with a convincing 11-length triumph in the \$15,586 Crowngap Construction Handicap Chase. Making his second start across the Atlantic, the sevenyear-old gelding left the highly regarded Egypt Mill Prince (Ire) (Deep Run {GB}) in his wake as he powered away from the field in the 2 1/2-mile race under regular rider Blythe Miller. Lonesome Glory became the first U.S.-trained jumper to win in England when he captured a novice hurdle race in that country in 1992. Longrange plans call for the champion chaser, who is being handled overseas by English trainer Charlie Brooks, to make several starts in England this winter before returning to the U.S. in the spring. "He'll probably have a break now, but he will definitely be entered for the (Cheltenham) Gold Cup (in March)," said Brooks.

TATTERSALLS WEANLING SALE CONTINUES A bay colt by Sadler's Wells--Impatiente (\*Vaguely Noble) brought a bid of \$360,065 to top the fourth session of Tattersalls Weanling Sale in Newmarket Friday. Consigned by Raffin Stud, the February foal was purchased by B.B.A. (Ireland), Ltd.; his second dam, Sangue (Lyphard), was a Grade I stakes winner in the U.S. and a Group winner in France. A total of 197 lots sold during the sale's fourth session, bringing \$5,331,178, up 25 percent from 1994 when 174 weanlings sold for \$4,272,913; the '95 average of \$27,061 was up 10 percent from last year's figure, \$24,556. Thursday's third session saw a filly by Mujtahid--Jenny Lake (Ire) (Lomond) draw a high bid of \$88,380. Consigned by New England Stud, the second foal from an unraced daughter of English and Irish champion Park Appeal (Ahonoora) was purchased by Mr. T. Hyde. A total of 187 horses sold Thursday for \$2,605,237, down 52 percent from 1994's third-session gross of \$5,372,586; Thursday's average, \$13,931, was down 49 percent, from \$27,272 in 1994.

DOGWOOD BUYS LATIN REIGN Dogwood Stable has purchased the graded stakes-placed two-year-old Latin Reign (El Gran Senor) from Robert Sangster. Currently stabled in England, the colt will be imported to the U.S. for his three-year-old campaign. Second, beaten only a nose in the G2 Premio Guido Berardelli in his most recent start, Latin Reign is tentatively scheduled to make his American debut in the Tropical Park Derby January 2. Dogwood will keep and maintain a five-percent interest in the colt and will sell four shares of 23.75 percent interest each.

LATE RALLY SAVES "RACEDAY AQUEDUCT" New York City's racing fans will continue to receive the broadcast of "Raceday Aqueduct" after the New York Racing Association and New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation reached an 11th-hour agreement vesterday morning. Said Steven Crist, NYRA's vice president of communications and development, "The two sides were unable to reach an agreement (Thursday), so we were forced to pull the plug on "Raceday Aqueduct" (Friday) morning at 11:30. About 13 minutes later we worked out the final details that had blocked an agreement. By 11:43 a.m., the program was back on television in New York City." Crist described the agreement as "threepronged" and said he expected it would mean an additional \$3 to \$4 million in income for the NYRA annually. "New York OTB will pay an additional two percent on their telephone handle above last year, retroactive to March of this year," Crist said. "We will be sending our signal into more OTB parlors in Brooklyn and Queens, but OTB will pay an additional one percent of their handle from all parlors taking our signal. The third part of the agreement covers the teletheaters, along with restaurants and bars, OTB wants to move into. From those locations, we will receive the extra one percent of the handle I just referred to, plus another three-quarters of a percent." NYC-OTB also agreed that it would not attempt to televise any out-of-state Thoroughbred racing without the permission of NYRA.

## TURF PUBLICISTS LAUNCH MARKETING

**NEWSLETTER** The Turf Publicists of America will unveil the first edition of Track Marketing Reporter, a quarterly newsletter designed to further the exchange of successful marketing ideas, at the TPA Mark Kaufman Workshop which opens the University of Arizona RTIP Symposium on Racing in Tucson Tuesday, December 5. The brainchild of TPA Vice President Rick Baedecker, Track Marketing Reporter, which will be available to all members of the TPA, will provide fresh and timely ideas for increasing attendance and racetrack revenues. "A lot of great ideas are being successfully developed at race tracks throughout the country but, apart from a few major promotions at major tracks, few people get to know about them outside the areas where they've been tested," said Baedecker, who works as vice president of marketing and public relations at Hollywood Park. "Other professional sports have set up machinery to share successful marketing and promotional ideas, but racing, with an even more diverse population and range of products, has failed to do so. We hope the Reporter will be a start toward putting this right."

CUP CHALLENGE RETIRED Cup Challenge (Mr. Prospector), a winning half-brother to five stakes winners, including GISW Lieutenant's Lark and MGSW Dove Hunt, has been retired and will enter stud in 1996 at William S. Farish's Huisache Farm near Hempstead, Texas. On the board in six of 14 career starts and an allowance winner at Churchill and Sam Houston, the six-year-old will stand for \$2,000, guaranteed live foal.

PEMBROKE ARRIVES AT HERMITAGE World-record holder Pembroke (Gone West), stakes winner of seven races and \$300,748, arrived at Carl Pollard's Hermitage Farm in Goshen, Kentucky Thursday. The five-year-old, who begins stud duty in 1996, is owned privately and will stand for a fee of \$5,000, live foal.
