## RACING WORLD SET TO MEET IN TUCSON

Continuing its 22-year tradition of bringing the racing world together, the 1995 University of Arizona Symposium on Racing begins today at the Loews Ventana Canyon Resort in Tucson. This year's symposium will feature sessions with international themes, an opportunity for participants to use interactive technologies, and the informal closing-day workshops which were well received by last year's attendees. "We tried these workshops for the first time last year, and from the results of our survey they were a success," said Rack Track Industry Program Coordinator F. Douglas Reed. "We discovered a lot of people appreciated the opportunity to participate and interact with others in the industry." The Arizona symposium is the largest multi-breed racing conference in the world, drawing representatives from all seven continents. International racing will be covered Dec. 7, with panels entitled "International Racing Surfaces" and "International Stewards' Round Table." The stewards' round table panel consists of representatives from Australia, Canada, Ireland, Japan and the U.S. Interactivity will be featured at the "Racing Speaks...and Listens" session Dec. 6. At this session, moderated by Tom Dawson of ESPN's "Racing Across America" television series, audience members will be able to connect with panelists using electronic devices called Playmakers. Through an agreement with IWN, the California-based technology company has provided 400 Playmakers for this session. The informal workshops Dec. 8 will focus on issues involving marketing, state-bred special events (such as California Cup and Maryland Million), volume purchases of services, and the Internet. Following tradition, this year's symposium will get underway today with the Turf Publicists of America Mark Kaufman Workshop. Following another custom, it will close Friday, Dec. 8 with the annual banquet and live scholarship auction.

WILLIAM P. KYNE H-GIII, \$100,000, 3yo/up, 9f The William P. Kyne was actually run twice in 1994-and both winners will be back to defend their titles in this renewal. Nancys French Fry (French Legionaire), who romped to a 14-length victory in the Kyne held December 31, 1994; and Slew Of Damascus (Slewacide), who defeated Hill Pass by a length in the stakes on January 8, 1994, are both confirmed starters for the 38th running of the event. Five-year-old Nancys French Fry breezed a sharp five-eighths in :59 4/5 at Santa Anita Monday. "He's doing great," said trainer Vladimir Cerin. The Kentucky-bred finished third to fellow Kyne starter Lykatill Hil (Pilgrim) in a Santa Anita allowance Nov. 12 in his last start. Also expected are Azagal (Arg) (Ahmad {Arg}) and Pinfloron (Fr) (Caerleon): Corslew (Seattle Slew) is a possible starter.

# Saturday, Calder Race Course

WHAT A PLEASURE S .- GIII, \$100,000, 2yo, 8.5f

A probable field of seven or eight is set to go to the gate for Saturday's feature at Calder. Steven Duncker's Beefchopper (Farma Way) makes his Florida debut after taking the Hawthorne Juvenile November 19; purchased by trainer Phil Hauswald for \$72,000 at the Fasig-Tipton two-year-old sale at Calder in February, the colt has won three of seven starts and \$124.213. Also pointing for the race are Cat On Tour (Tour d'Or), three-for-four lifetime, who bounced back from a ninth-place finish in the Foolish Pleasure Breeders' Cup over a sloppy track to take the City Of Miami S. November 11; and Rebelrock (Citidancer), four-for-five, who started his career in claiming races but has taken back-to-back Calder allowances. Other probables include He'sfullafire (Fire Dancer), Fortunate Review (Fortunate Prospect), Unruled (Notebook) and Tour's Big Red (Tour d'Or).

# Sunday, Calder Race Course

BOCA RATON S., \$100,000, 2yo, f, 8.5f

Plum Country (Country Pine), second in the GII Astarita S. at Belmont on Breeders' Cup Day, heads a likely field of 10. Claimed for \$50,000 in late July, the filly won the Susan's Girl division of the Florida Stallion Stakes, and was second in the My Dear Girl division. Logical Reasoning (Lord Avie), a \$180,000 two-year-old purchase at Keeneland in April, shipped to Calder from her Gulfstream barn yesterday and breezed five furlongs in 1:03 3/5. The David Carroll trainee broke her maiden by seven lengths at Churchill in her last start.

TIMBER COUNTRY HEADS TO JAPAN Timber Country (Woodman), last year's champion two-year-old and winner of the 1995 Preakness, left Stone Farm Sunday for his new home in Japan. The colt, who was retired from racing due to an injury in mid-August, was purchased by the Yoshida family for stud duty at their Shadai Stallion Station in Hokkaido. He has been recovering at Arthur B. Hancock Ill's Stone Farm since his injury. "Timber Country was a good patient," said Hancock. "He's a nice horse with a lot of sense, and now that he's in good health, he's on his way."

# TATTERSALLS DECEMBER MARES SALE

OPENS The first session of the five-day Tattersalls December Sale of Mares, Horses in and out of Training and Stallions was held yesterday in Newmarket. Silent Warrior (Ire) (Nashwan), a three-year-old colt consigned by Ecurie J. Hammond, France, property of Course Investments Corporation, brought a bid of \$409,133 to top the opening session. Purchased by BBA (UK) Ltd., the French G3 winner, a horse out of training, is a half-brother to G1SW Scenic (Sadler's Wells). A total of 208 horses were sold for \$10,149,291 in this sixth session of the Tattersalls December Sale; the average of \$48,793 was up 50.4 percent from 1994, when 172 horses sold for \$5,579,256, an average of \$32,436.

## SEATTLE SLEW COLT TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

MIDLANTIC Classified Facts (Seattle Slew), an unraced two-year-old colt from the Complete Dispersal of Racing Stock of Mr. Israel Cohen, brought a bid of \$260,000 to top the second session of Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic December Mixed Sale, held yesterday in Timonium, Maryland. The half-brother to MSW Fortunate Facts (Sir Ivor) was purchased by Ken Reed, agent. A total of 188 horses, including 23 from the Israel Cohen dispersal, went through the ring Monday, bringing in \$2,436,900; boosted by the dispersal, the gross was up 50.2 percent over last year's second session, when 153 head sold for \$1,621,900. The '95 average, \$12,962, was up 158 percent from last year's figure of \$5,022. In all, 387 horses were sold for \$3,152,800 during the two-day auction for an average of \$8,147.

HARRY'S SECRET JOY TO THORN HILL Crown Stud, Inc. has purchased Harry's Secret Joy (What a Pleasure) to stand the 1996 breeding season at the Hackley's Thorn Hill Farm, just outside Greenville, Georgia. The stallion, a stakes winner and three-quarter brother to millionaire Gate Dancer, joins the seven-horse roster at Thorn Hill; his 1996 stud fee is private.

REMINGTON WRAP-UP The 1995 Remington Park Fall Meet ended Sunday with a 7.2 percent increase in total handle but a 34 percent decrease in average daily on-track attendance. The introduction of satellite wagering and a record number of intertrack simulcasting sites in six states boosted the Oklahoma track's overall handle to \$62,564,841. While the average daily ontrack handle fell 32 percent, to \$620,050, the total ITW handle rose sharply; the \$17,085,331 wagered during the 58-day meeting was up 85 percent over 1994. But daily on-track attendance felt the effects, dropping from 6.516 a year ago to 4,287 in '95. "The decrease in our on-track numbers was expected," said Remington Park Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer David M. Vance. "Our hope is that new business from satellite wagering offsets on-track losses. We're not sure if that is the case at this early date...but once we're able to expand out network with more sites, we feel that it will serve that purpose." Remington's satellite wagering network is expected to expand by another three to five sites for the 1996 Spring Meet, which opens Feb. 2. John Franks earned his first title as Remington's leading owner with 15 victories; his Oklahoma trainer, Steve Asmussen, led all conditioners with 20 wins. It was the third title for Asmussen, 30, who led the standings in 1991 and '92. Remington's all-time leading rider, Don Pettinger, picked up his second riding title at the track, booting home 66 winners.
