NORTHERN SPUR OUT OF HOLLYWOOD

TURF CUP Breeders' Cup Turf winner Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) will be forced to miss Sunday's \$500,000 Hollywood Turf Cup H. (GI) after developing a cough at his Santa Anita Park base. "He's missed two days of training because of a cough," trainer Ron McAnally said Wednesday. "We've treated him with cough medication and antibiotics. It isn't a serious thing, but it means he will miss (the Turf Cup). I don't know what will be next for him, but he will remain in training. We'll just have to wait and see what's out there."

HOLLENDORFER REACHES 2,000 WINS Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, winning with each of his three starters Wednesday at Bay Meadows, became the first Northern California-based conditioner to reach the 2,000 victory plateau. Hollendorfer, who saddled his first winner in 1979, scored win number 1,998 with Balla Balla (Bolger) (\$8 to win) in the third race, number 1,999 with Little Kaper (GB) (Mtoto {GB}) (\$4.80) in the sixth and magic number 2,000 with Cryptomania (Cryptoclear-ance) (\$5.00) in the eighth. A 46-year-old native of Akron, Ohio, Hollendorfer got his start in racing working as a groom at Bay Meadows in the late 1960's. From that humble beginning, he has emerged as Northern California's all-time leading trainer. "I've enjoyed every one of them," said Hollendorfer of his 2,000 wins. "I've had stakes horses, but I enjoy them all." The trainer admits that when he started, he couldn't imagine achieving such a milestone. "I never thought I'd get to 200 when I started, so I feel very fortunate," said Hollendorfer, who in 1983 won only four races while suffering through his leanest year. He is having his best year ever in earnings in 1995 as his starters have brought home \$3,350,598. He insists there is no secret to his success. "Just bearing down and working hard," he said. "That, and having my wife work with me."

HOLLYWOOD TURF CUP H.-GI, \$500,000, 3vo/up. 1 1/2mT Chris McCarron, who had been scheduled to ride Northern Spur (Ire) in the Hollywood Turf Cup, has picked up the mount on GIII Louisiana Downs H. winner Party Season (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}) for trainer Neil Drysdale, Drysdale, who will saddle two in the GI event, said Gary Stevens has the call on Chilean champion Patio de Naranjos (Chi) (Gallantsky). French G3 winner Parme (Blushing Groom {Fr}), prepping for his North American debut, breezed six furlongs in 1:14 4/5 over Hollywood's firm turf course yesterday. Privity (Private Account), winner of the G2 Prix de Malleret at Longchamp in June and one of two fillies pointing for the race along with Hollywood Dream (Ger) (Master Willie {GB}), drilled five furlongs in 1:01 4/5 yesterday over Hollywood's main track. GI winner Earl of Barking (Ire) (Common Grounds {GB}) went the same distance at Santa Anita Tuesday in 1:01 1/5. Trainer Rodney Rash indicated he plans to run French imports Celtic Arms (Fr) (Comrade In Arms (GB)) and Rifapour (Ire) (Shahrastani) in the Turf Cup. Kiri's Clown (Foolish Pleasure), who dueled for the lead into the stretch before fading to sixth in last Sunday's Lure H. at Hollywood, will wheel right back in the Turf Cup, according to trainer Philip G. Johnson. Probables for the race also include Royal Chariot (Strawberry Road {Aus}), Shrewd Idea (GB) (Alleged), Suave Tern (Arctic Tern), Talloires (Trempolino) and Tikkanen (Cozzene).

Saturday, Hollywood Park: VERNON O. UNDERWOOD BREEDERS' CUP S.-GIII, \$100,000a, 3yo/up, 6f

Frank Stronach's Wild Gold (Wild Again) breezed six furlongs in 1:15 4/5 at Bay Meadows Tuesday, and trainer Jerry Hollendorfer indicated the five-year-old will ship to Hollywood Park for Saturday's race. Wild Gold has won four of his last five starts including the \$100,000 Cal Cup Sprint Nov. 11. Trainer Bob Baffert said High Stakes Player (High Brite) will make his stakes debut in the Underwood. The three-year-old colt won his last two outings, both Santa Anita allowances, in wireto-wire fashion. Also expected to go to the post are Nov. 24 Hollywood Turf Express winner Cyrano Storme (Ire) (Cyrano de Bergerac), Forest Gazelle (Green Forest), Lucky Forever (Lucky North), Plenty Zloty (Rinoso), Powis Castle (Rare Brick) and Remarfable (Marfa). Considered possible for the race are Gundaghia (Ole Bob Bowers) and Breeders' Cup Sprint third-place finisher Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor).

RACING SYMPOSIUM CONTINUES Some surprising opinions and perceptions revealed in an interactive session entitled "Racing Speaks...and Listens" highlighted the second day of the 1995 Symposium on Racing in Tucson, Arizona Wednesday. A majority of audience members felt there was too much live racing, while a remarkable 85 percent said adding casinos and retail/entertainment centers to tracks was a good idea. At the same time, only 36 percent felt the basic racing product needed improvement in order to combat the sport's ills, while 63 percent felt growth could come from simply marketing the existing product better. An afternoon session called "The Look" focused on the way racing presents its product to the public. Amy Zimmerman, Santa Anita's broadcast manager, urged tracks to upgrade their broadcast equipment to better compete with the quality of offerings from other sports and entertainment venues. "You can't rebuild the wheel with a hammer and a chisel--vou need a rubber factory." said Zimmerman. "Too many tracks are still chiseling away out there." The symposium continues through Friday.

BARRETTS JANUARY SALE EXPANDED Barretts' 1996 January Mixed Sale will be expanded to two days. January 22 and 23, and will be highlighted by the dispersals of Howard B. Keck's horses of racing age, Old English Rancho's broodmares, and consignments of horses of racing age from Juddmonte Farms and Norfields. The Keck dispersal will include 11 horses currently in training in California with Charlie Whittingham. Among them are Cezind (Ferdinand), second in yesterday's \$61,700 Flying Continental H. at Hollywood Park, and five unraced two-year-old fillies sired by Danzig, Mr. Prospector, Nureyev, Pleasant Colony and Sovereign Dancer. Rollin Baugh will act as agent for the dispersal. The Old English Rancho consignment of 44 broodmares from one of California's perennial leading breeders will include the dams of stakes performers Flying Sensation, Made to Perfection, Journalism and Real Cash. Barretts will catalog approximately 400 horses for its third annual January Mixed Sale. Sale sessions will begin at 11 a.m. each day.

TOC DIRECTOR NAMED TOBA PRESIDENT

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association has elected its first full-time president. Drew Couto, currently the executive director of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, was unanimously chosen by a TOBA committee and will take over the position in February. According to current President Ron Kirk, TOBA hopes Couto will heighten the organization's visibility.

EL GRAN SENOR MARE TOPS TATTERSALLS THIRD SESSION Kundalini, a five-year-old bay mare by El Gran Senor--Hatton Gardens (Auction Ring), topped Wednesday's third session of Tattersalls' December Mares, Horses In and Out of Training and Stallions Sale, held at the Park Paddocks in Newmarket, England. Kundalini, the Champion Three-Year-Old Filly in South Africa in 1993-94, is a Group 1 winner in South Africa and a full-sister to North American stakes-winner Pixie Spirit. She was offered as a Horse in Training from Ecurie John Hammond of France, and was purchased by B.B.A. (UK) Ltd. for \$409,133. Overall, there were 198 horses sold Wednesday for a gross of \$11,329,232 and an average of \$55,713, up six percent from last year's third session average of \$52,579. The sale continues through Friday.

ANNOUNCEMENTS SET The Thoroughbred Racing Associations (TRA) has released a tentative schedule for the announcement of the Eclipse Awards for 1995. The racing awards will be announced Thursday, Jan. 11 via teleconference; the Horse of the Year will be announced Friday, Feb. 9 at the Eclipse Awards Dinner at the Hotel del Coronado in San Diego, California. The Eclipse Award of Merit and Eclipse Awards for media will be announced on the following dates: Radio/TV-Dec. 21: Photo-Dec. 28: Award of Merit-Jan. 3: and Magazine/Newspaper-Jan. 4.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC TO HOST CARIBBEAN

CLASSIC Thirteen horses, seven countries and one revitalized racing market combine for the 28th Caribbean Classic this Saturday at the Quinto Centenario Racetrack in the Dominican Republic. The \$255,000 "Clasico del Caribe" has become the forerunner of a coming Breeders' Cup for horses bred in the 12-nation Caribbean Racing Confederation. The race for threeyear-olds is over 1 1/8-miles with colts carrying 118 pounds and fillies 110 pounds. Horses bred in countries that have never won the race receive a 10-pound weight allowance. The annual race, the Caribbean version of the Kentucky Derby, is rotated among the nation's racing powers. With the opening of Quinto Centenario (Fifth Century) Racetrack in April, the Dominican Republic was awarded the race in 1995 for the first time in history. "It is of the greatest importance to the racing industry in the Dominican Republic and the Caribbean racing industry that the Caribbean Classic be held this year at Quinto Centenario. It exemplifies the faith by the Confederation of our growth as one of the leading racing powers," said Donald Drew, president of Galapagos S.A., the company that has the exclusive government franchise to operate the track and OTB in the Dominican Republic. Panama, which is expected to be awarded the 1996 Classic this Friday, will likely have the favorite for this year's race in Panamanian Triple Crown winner Rev Arturo (Pan) (Pumpkin Moonshine).


