PEAKS AND VALLEYS NAMED

CANADIAN HORSE OF THE YEAR For the first time since the inception of the Sovereign Awards in 1975, an American-bred has been honored as Canada's Horse of the Year. Peaks And Valleys (Mt. Livermore), a Kentucky-bred colt owned and bred by Josephine Abercrombie's Pin Oak Stud, captured both the Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old colt awards; Abercrombie becomes the second American in the last three years to own the Canadian Horse of the Year. Winner of the GI Molson Export Million and GI Meadowlands Cup, Peaks And Valleys finished off the board for the first time when sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic October 28; he came out of the race with a severely bruised left front foot but is expected to race again next year. Pin Oak was also the owner and breeder of Canada's top male turf runner, Hasten To Add (Cozzene); completing the list of Sovereign Award winners are: Two-year-old Colt: Gomtuu (Hail The Ruckus); Two-vear-old Filly: Silken Cat (Storm Cat); Three-year-old Filly and Sprinter: Scotzanna (Silver Deputy); Older Filly/Mare and Female Turf Horse: Bold Ruritana (Bold Ruckus); Older Horse/Gelding: Basqueian (Bounding Basque); and Outstanding Broodmare: Sea Regent (Vice Regent). Minshall Farm's Bold Ruritana took the first-ever Sovereign Award for the top female turf horse. In the human categories, Frank Stronach, who campaigned fellow award winner Basqueian, was honored as Canada's top owner for the third year in a row, and Kinghaven Farms earned its ninth award as Canada's top breeder. Daniel Vella picked up his second consecutive Sovereign Award as top trainer. Todd Kabel took home the award for top jockey for the second time as a journeyman and the third overall; and Dave Wilson was named top apprentice jockey for the second straight year.

CONCERN TO NORTHVIEW MGISW Concern (Broad Brush) has been retired and will go to stud in '96 as property of a syndicate at Maryland's Northview Stallion Station. The four-year-old, winner of the 1994 Breeders' Cup Classic, ended his racing career with a record of seven wins, including four graded stakes, and earnings of \$3,079,350; he won his final start, a Fair Grounds allowance, Nov. 24. Owner Robert Meyerhoff will retain a substantial interest in the Maryland-bred; a limited number of shares will also be sold.

TATTERSALLS WRAP-UP The final session of the Tattersalls December Sales was held vesterday in Newmarket, with the two-year-old filly Queen's Music (Dixieland Band) drawing the top bid of \$58,920. Consigned by Whatcombe Stables and sold as a horse in training, the half-sister to group stakes winners Aim For The Top (Irish River {Fr}) and Splendent (Shadeed) was purchased by Brian Grassick Bloodstock. A total of 103 horses sold Friday for \$964,714, up 26.3 percent from last year's final session when 99 lots sold for \$763,748. The average of \$9,365 was up 21.4 percent from the '94 final session average of \$7,714. The 1995 Tattersalls December Sales showed marked gains over 1994. Through the 10 sessions, 1,787 horses brought in a total of \$56,862,716, an increase of 31 percent over 1994 when 1,528 horses sold for \$43,380,630. This year's average of \$31,820 was up 12 percent, from \$28,390 in 1994. Commented Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony, "We have been delighted by the buoyant trade here at Tattersalls throughout the year. Prices have shown improvement at every sale at Park Paddocks, and to end on a high note is especially pleasing. From the opening lots this week there has been strong demand, with at times an almost overwhelming number of buyers packing the ring. Buyers from every continent in the world have yet again emphasized the global appeal of the December Sale and of European bloodstock."

AFTERNOON DEELITES SIZZLES IN A.M. Three-year-old Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) worked five furlongs in an eye-catching :58 3/5 Friday morning at Hollywood, and trainer Richard Mandella said the colt is possible for the GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita December 26. "He's making progress, but if he's not ready, then we'll find something else for him," said Mandella. "He's beginning to act like he's ready, though." A winner of five of seven career starts, Afternoon Deelites has not raced since suffering a slight tendon tear when eighth in the Kentucky Derby.

SYMPOSIUM CLOSES WITH A SURF ON THE

INTERNET The 1995 Symposium on Racing concluded yesterday in Tucson, Arizona with speakers in a session entitled "Surfing The Internet" urging racetracks to get aboard the information superhighway. Rule Number One of PC Computing Magazine's Ed Bott's 10 rules of the road? "Set up a web site. Today." Bott took listeners through a stepby-step guide to setting up a home page on the worldwide web. Del Mar's Craig Fravel demonstrated his track's home page, which comes complete with audio race calls of all stakes races. Moderator Scott Finley called the page, "The best racing page in the country-perhaps the world." Said Fravel, "What we wanted to do was get our feet wet and build toward the future," adding that the page averaged 10,000 hits per day this past summer. Earlier in the day, Mark Wilson, president of R.D. Hubbard Enterprises, addressed the legalities of betting on the Internet, and the effect that on-line casinos will have on horse racing. "If this industry gets as big as its promoters are talking about, it's going to have a hell of an impact," said Wilson.

MIDLANTIC MULTISTATE LICENSING

PROGRAM ANNOUNCED In an unprecedented move for the racing industry, four states--New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Maryland--vesterday announced a joint agreement on a multi-state licensing program that will substantially ease the burden of licensing the more than 20,000 Thoroughbred and harness horsemen in the region. Regulatory and licensing personnel from each of the participating states have been meeting with Alan Foreman, executive director of the Thoroughbred Horsemen Associations, since March to develop the program. The Association of Racing Commissioners International will act as the hub for licensing information and will provide the computer support and database: the information will be transmitted by the four states to ARCI, and will be available to them via the Internet. "This program demonstrates that, through collective action, horsemen working with regulators, solutions to many of the industry's nagging problems are achievable," said Foreman. "The willingness of each state to put aside their parochial interests and work for the benefit of the industry should be applauded. The impact and benefits of the program will go beyond licensing and usher in a new spirit of cooperation in the industry. Today's agreement is only the first step."

TWENTY-THREE STAKES UPGRADED The Early Times Turf Classic, granted Grade I status for the first time for 1996, was one of 23 stakes to receive an upgrade during the North American Graded Stakes Committee's annual meeting. The 12-person committee, chaired by Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association trustee G. Watts Humphrey, Jr., gave graded status to 18 races which had previously been listed stakes; 19 races were downgraded for 1996 and six additional stakes, scheduled to be run before May 1, will be downgraded for 1997. It is the policy of the Committee that downgraded races which will be run before May 1 be granted one additional running before the lower grade goes into effect. The Alabama Derby was awarded Grade III status for 1996, pending the outcome of the problems at Birmingham Racecourse which threaten to close the track. "The owner thinks it's a very successful route into Kentucky for the Derby," said trainer Mike Puype, 29, who will have a string in Florida for the first time. "Thunder Gulch's success last year was a big factor in the decision to take this route." As for his training schedule, Puype said, "We'll freshen him up. He'll gallop every day and will have his first breeze at Gulfstream in a week or 10 days."

HOLLYWOOD PARK UNVEILS STADIUM

PLANS Hollywood Park Chairman R. D. Hubbard Friday unveiled the rendering of a proposed 65,000-seat, natural grass football stadium and said that his track is "one-and-a-half to two years ahead of any other site (seeking an NFL team) in the Los Angeles area." The Inglewood Planning Commission this week approved Hollywood's overall plans to build a \$250 million stadium adjacent to the race track, clearing the way for track officials to aggressively lobby the National Football League for either an existing or expansion team to represent the L.A. area. "We're owned, zoned and ready to build," said Hubbard, adding that Hollywood Park is in a financial position to have the stadium completed in time for the 1998 season. "We have what everybody else talks about getting." In addition to being the home for an NFL franchise, the proposed Hollywood Park arena might house a college team such as UCLA, which currently plays in the Rose Bowl; it would be expandable to a capacity of 82,500 for playoff and Super Bowl games.
