INCLEMENT WEATHER FORCES RACING CANCELLATIONS Saturday's live racing cards at Aqueduct, Hawthorne, Suffolk Downs, Beulah Park, Penn National, Charles Town and Philadelphia Park were cancelled due to severe weather conditions including snow, freezing temperatures and high winds. At Aqueduct, light snow early Saturday morning gave way to heavy rains. Bitter cold temperatures and wind gusts approaching 40 m.p.h. forced the cancellation of live racing at Hawthorne. At 12 noon the temperature at Midway Airport (only three miles from Hawthorne) was three degrees above zero. "Because of the combination of frigid temperatures and strong winds, the safety of the jockeys and horses became a factor," said Hawthorne President Tom Carey. "Thus it was in the best interest of all parties to cancel." Racing at all of the above tracks is

scheduled to resume today.

MATTY G MAY SUPPLEMENT TO HOLLYWOOD FUTURITY Double J Farm's Matty G (Capote) worked seven furlongs in 1:25 3/5 under Alex Solis Saturday morning at Hollywood Park, and trainer Ron McAnally said the two-year-old colt might be supplemented to the \$500,000 Hollywood Futurity (GI), to be run next Sunday, Dec. 17. Matty G, who faded to finish fourth in the GIII Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup S. Nov. 19, set splits of :22 1/5, :44 4/5 and 1:08 4/5 in the sevenfurlong race before tiring in the stretch. Supplemental nominations to the 1 1/16-mile Futurity cost \$25,000, with \$12,500 to enter and an additional \$12,500 to start. McAnally, who also plans to send out Verne Winchell's Exetera (Forty Niner) in the Futurity, won the 1993 edition with Winchell's Valiant Nature. Early probables for the race also include GII Norfolk S. runnerup Odvle (Alleged), GII Remsen S. winner Tropicool (Carr de Naskra), MGSW Hennessy (Storm Cat) and GIII

Generous S. runner-up Ayrton S (Polish Numbers).

PEAKS AND VALLEYS ON THE MEND Peaks and Valleys (Mt. Livermore), voted the 1995 Canadian Horse of the Year, could be back in action as early as this Spring. The three-year-old colt, who is currently convalescing at breeder/owner Mrs. Josephine Abercrombie's Pin Oak Stud in Versailles, Kentucky, is healing following his last start of 1995, a sixth-place finish in the Oct. 28 Breeders' Cup Classic. Peaks and Valleys developed severely bruised feet and a broken bone on the bar of the foot of his left foreleg during that race. According to Abercrombie, the colt came out of the Breeders' Cup "three-legged lame;" however he is improving well. "The feet are growing down beautifully," Abercrombie said. "We're very optimistic about them. It may be another three months and he might be in good shape. We've just got to get these problems over with right now so we don't have to fool with them anymore." Abercrombie, who is hoping the MGI winner will be able to begin his four-year-old campaign in late Spring, said she is looking forward to running the colt in next year's Breeders' Cup at Woodbine.

CALDER SETS NEW HANDLE RECORD Saturday's combined mutuel handle (on-track, inter-track and inter-state) at Calder Race Course's Tropical at Calder meet shattered the old record which had just been set last Saturday. A crowd of 7,912 wagered \$1,318,348 on-track, while patrons of inter-track wagering facilities pumped in an extra \$676,147. But it was an incredible \$5,197,843 that was handled through the many inter-state sites that helped to establish the new record of \$7,192,338. The record set last week was \$5,622,304. The total commingled pool on the co-featured GIII What a Pleasure S. was \$798,461. And one lucky Calder fan hit a record-making superfecta on that race: \$38,772.90 on a \$1 ticket.

LOCOCHÓN CAPTURES CLÁSICO DEL CARIBE Mexican-bred Locochón (Mex) (Contempt) emerged a convincing winner in the 28th Clásico Internacional del Caribe, but it was the Dominican Republic's El

del Caribe, but it was the Dominican Republic's El **Incorruptible** who brought a crowd of some 20,000 to its feet and, literally, onto the racing strip with a victory in the Copa Confraternidad at Quinto Centenario Racetrack in the Dominican Republic Saturday. Dominican racing reached record heights as over RD\$3,360,000 was wagered on an eight-race card that featured two international-caliber stakes. The previous high for the recently inaugurated Quinto Centenario was RD\$1,800,000, Candice Stable's El Incorruptible, the leading money-winner at Quinto Centenario Racetrack, responded to the pleas of his fans, rallying from well off the pace to win the \$75,000 (U.S.) Copa Confraternidad. The victory marked the first ever win for a Dominican-bred in the event. Police could do little to contain a throng of self-designated grooms who took to the track to guide El Incorruptible back to the winner's circle. Panamanian-bred Patricio (Pan) (Donzel), the 1993 Confraternidad winner, was second with Venezuela's Mariawaleska third. Verset's Jet (Tri Jet), winner of the 1993 Clásico del Caribe and 1994 Copa Confraternidad, was unable to retain his crown, tiring late to finish fourth. Later on in the program, the \$255,000 (U.S.) Clásico Internacional del Caribe turned out to be a showcase for Locochón, last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in Mexico. With Javier Matías in the irons, the colt pressed the leaders from the start and drew away easily to score the win. Venezuela's Lucky Metal and Clever Dancer (Ven) (Roberto's Dancer) occupied the second and third

During yesterday's fifth annual Louisiana Champions Day, the New Orleans Fair Grounds recorded the second highest overall mutuel handle in its 124-year history. The day featured 11 races restricted to Louisiana-breds, including seven Thoroughbred races, three Quarter Horse events and a match race between a Thoroughbred and a Quarter Horse. The on-track crowd bet \$297,493 and, combined with \$2,641,923 wagered off-track, a total of \$2,939,416 was bet overall. That trailed only the \$2,948,864 bet March 13, 1988 when Risen Star won the Louisiana Derby. In the \$15,000 Match Race, the Thoroughbred mare Athrillforjill (Plain Dealing) swept to a 5½-length victory over the Quarter Horse Lotta Tea.
