OWLANDS Japanese Stakes Results:

FAMILIAR FACES WIN MEADOWLANDS TITLES Jockey Joe Bravo and trainer Danny Lopez

were repeat title winners at the Meadowlands meet which concluded Saturday night. Bravo won the jockey's title at the New Jersey track for an unprecedented fifth straight year with 83 winners -- 32 more than his nearest rival. Jose Velez Jr. Bravo's mounts earned \$1,402,852 for the meet. Lopez won his second consecutive training title with 35 wins from 149 starts. His horses earned \$468,055. The owners' race ended in a three-way tie between Eddie Broome, Ebby Novak's New Farm and Casey Exton's Outlaw Biker Stable, all with 20 wins at the meet. New Farm won the money title with \$379,092. During the 66-day meet, on-track attendance was down 12 percent to an average of 8,491 nightly, while on-track handle was down 29 percent to an average of \$823,443 nightly. The total Thoroughbred handle averaged \$2,235,211, down 13.2 percent from last year. Hal Handel, executive vice president and chief operating officer of racing for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, observed, "Based on this meet, and the trends both nationally and in this region, it is apparent that changes in our product and presentation are needed. Efforts to make such changes will be a major focus as we head into our 1996 harness and Thoroughbred meets."

FOURSTARS ALLSTAR ARRIVES AT

COOLMORE Fourstars Allstar (Compliance), who became the only American-trained and based horse to win a Group event in Europe when he took the 1991 Irish 2000 Guineas, arrived safely at Coolmore Stud in Ireland Friday, where he will stand the 1996 breeding season for a fee of \$6,500. The seven-year-old was sold this past fall by former owner Richard Bomze to Coolmore Stud. "There was much more interest in him in Ireland than in America," Bomze said. "He's a grass horse. Americans want horses who were sprinters or outstanding two-year-olds. In Ireland they are willing to give horses more time. Fourstars Allstar will throw mile grass horses who will perform better when they get older." The New York-bred retired with eight graded stakes wins in the U.S. and 14 victories in 59 career starts for earnings of \$1,573,361. In addition, he was third to fellow Coolmore stallion Lure (Danzig) in the 1993 Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita.
