#### GARY STEVENS TO UNDERGO KNEE

SURGERY Jockey Gary Stevens, winner of this year's Kentucky Derby aboard Thunder Gulch (Gulch), will undergo arthroscopic surgery on his left knee Monday and will miss the final week of the Hollywood Autumn Meeting and the first two weeks of the Santa Anita winter/spring meeting. Stevens, 32, has torn cartilage in the knee and a cyst that has developed on the cartilage that has leaked fluid directly onto nerves around the knee area. "The knee has nagged at me the last two or three years, and it's consistently gotten worse," said Stevens, who had reconstructive surgery on his right knee in 1985. "I've been able to ride with it, but it's time for me to get it taken care of." Dr. Jim Tibone is scheduled to perform the surgery.

TANFORAN HANDICAP CALLED OFF Bay Meadows Racing Secretary Eugene F. Barsotti Jr. announced yesterday that he has called off the GIII \$100,000 Tanforan H., a 1 1/16-mile turf race for three-year-olds and up that was scheduled to be run this Saturday, Dec. 16. "We have rain forecast all week and the turf course is already soaked," explained Barsotti. "We'll be off the turf all week." According to Track Superintendent Robert Turman, the torrential storms that hit Northern California over the past three days deposited more than four inches of rain into the Longden Turf Course. When asked if he considered running the Tanforan on dirt, Barsotti responded, "We ran the main track stakes last weekend." Fans won't have to wait long for the 1996 renewal of the Tanforan, as the race will be run Feb. 24 during the new winter/spring meeting at Bay Meadows.

**DUCHESS OF NORFOLK DEAD** Lavinia, Duchess of Norfolk, the breeder of Celtic Swing and a host of other top-class horses, died Sunday. She was 79. The Duchess, born Lavinia Strutt in March, 1916, married Bernard, the Duke of Norfolk, at the age of 21. Together they raced some of the finest horses seen in Britain over the past 50 years. The Duke, who died in 1975, campaigned major winners Sound Track, Skymaster and Tamino. But it was after the Duke's death that the Duchess achieved her highest honors in the sport, racing stakes horses Man of Harlech, Castle Keep and Sheriff's Star and classic winner Moon Madness. Celtic Swing, who campaigns in the colors of Peter Savill, was trained to victory in last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy and this season's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club by the Duchess' daughter, Lady Herries.

Sunday, Hollywood Park:

HOLLYWOOD FUTURITY-GI, \$500,000, 2yo, 1 1/16m Robert and Beverly Lewis's Hennessy (Storm Cat), the probable favorite for the Hollywood Futurity, tuned up for the Grade I event Monday with a five furlong drill in :58 4/5 at Santa Anita. In his last two outings, the GI Hopeful S. winner finished second in both the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GIII Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup S. In other Futurity developments, the maiden Odyle (Alleged), ninth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile in his last start Oct. 28, breezed five furlongs in 1:02 1/5 Tuesday at Santa Anita. In addition, Kent Desormeaux, who won last year's Futurity aboard Afternoon Deelites, has been named to ride Scholarship (Fred Astaire) in Sunday's edition. Also probable for the race are Tropicool (Carr de Naskra), Exetera (Forty Niner), Ayrton S (Polish Numbers) and Matty G (Capote).

Saturday, Hollywood Park:

HOLLYWOOD STARLET S .- GI, \$250,000, 2yo, f, 1 1/16m Undefeated Advancing Star (Soviet Star), winner of her only two career starts by a combined 12 lengths, breezed a half-mile in :49 3/5 Tuesday at Hollywood Park. In her last outing Nov. 18, the Kentucky-bred filly won the seven-furlong Maker's Mark S. in a quick 1:21 4/5. She will be trying two turns for the first time in the Starlet. "She's such an easy mover and wastes so little energy that I don't think it's going to be a problem for her," said jockey Gary Stevens, who has the mount Saturday. "I have great respect for (trainer) Richard Mandella and he seems to think that distance is not going to be a problem with this filly at all." Also working for the Starlet was Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runnerup Cara Rafaela (Quiet American), who drilled five furlongs in :59 2/5 Monday at Santa Anita. Joining the Starlet field is Cosmic Fire (Capote), second in the GII Sorrento S. at Del Mar in August and most recently winner of a six-furlong Hollywood allowance Dec. 3. Also expected to go to the post are Chile Chatte (Storm Cat) and Wheatly Special (Wheatly Hall).

BILL MOTT HONORED BY UTTA Bill Mott, trainer of probable 1995 Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music), was presented with this year's United Thoroughbred Trainers of America's Outstanding Thoroughbred Trainer Award. The award recognizes "a trainer who has achieved an outstanding training feat with one or more horses." Mott, who also trains 1995 GI Matriarch S. winner Duda (Theatrical {Ire}), will receive the award January 31, 1996 at an awards ceremony and dinner at the Arlington Hotel in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

CONVEYOR TO HIDDEN POINT FARM Conveyor (Sharpen Up {GB}), winner of the 1994 GI Meadowlands Cup, has been retired and will stand the 1996 breeding season at Peter Rosbech's Hidden Point Farm near Ocala, Florida. A winner of 15 of 61 starts for earnings of \$827,498, the seven-year-old last raced Nov. 3, finishing fourth in the GIII Paterson H. at The Meadowlands. He will stand for a 1996 fee of \$5,000 live foal.

GARY AND BETTY BISZANTZ NAMED TOBA OWNERS OF THE MONTH Gary and Betty Biszantz of Rancho Santa Fe, California, have been named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association Owners of the Month for November. During the month of November, Mrs. Biszantz' two-year-old Cobra King (Farma Way) captured the GIII Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup S., defeating GISW Hennessy. Bred by Mr. Biszantz, the colt's dam was selected by Mrs. Biszantz from a Barrett's sale several years ago. The Biszantzes also sent out winners Kinema Red (Diesis (GB)) and Le Silencieux (Ire) (Shaadi) last month. Gary Biszantz purchased his first horse for \$400 at an auction in Pomona, California in 1956--the filly gave the owner his first win. He has owned, solely or in partnership, almost a dozen stakes winners. Mr. and Mrs. Biszantz currently have approximately 40 horses in training with trainers Ralph Biszantz, Mike Puype, Walter Greenman and John Sadler. They recently acquired an 82-acre farm in Lexington, Kentucky, Renamed Cobra Farm, the farm will serve as a nursery for their eight-member broodmare band and as headquarters for their East Coast racing operation, headed by Puype. In addition, the Biszantzes are involved with an overseas syndicate which purchases and develops 10 European yearlings each year. Mr. Biszantz has served on the TOBA Executive, Graded Stakes and Owners Committees.

GOFFS IRELAND SALES RESULTS Visitman, a five-year-old bay mare by Woodman--Visiting Nurse (Cyane), topped Tuesday's Goffs Ireland December Foal and Breeding Stock Sale, held at the Kildare Paddocks in Ireland. Sold as a Horse in Training, the Kentucky-bred mare, who has won four races, all in Italy, was consigned by General Horse Adv. Srl. and purchased for \$38,739 by B.B.A. (Ireland) Ltd. Overall, 130 horses were sold for a total of \$695,284 and an average of \$5,348, down 4.4 percent from last year's average of \$5.595.

TEXAS RACING COMMISSION RECOGNIZES NEW HORSEMEN'S GROUP According to a story in vesterday's Dallas Morning News, a dispute between two Texas horsemen's groups erupted Tuesday in a hearing before the Texas Racing Commission. At issue was whether to allow a newly formed group to represent Thoroughbred owners and trainers in negotiations with track owners over simulcasting and other issues. The Commission currently recognizes only one group-the Texas Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association--as the official representative of all breeds. At the new group's urging, the Commission voted unanimously to instruct its staff to draft a rule that would allow it to recognize more than one organization to represent horse groups. William Heiligbrodt, chairman of the newly formed Texas Thoroughbred HBPA, charged that the other association's governing board is dominated by Quarter Horse owners and trainers who put their interests above those of the Thoroughbred industry.

Trinity's Class 1 license expires in February; a 1994 legal settlement with the Commission calls for the facility to enlarge its race track to a mile, as required by the state's racing rules, by February, 1996 or lose its Class 1 status.
