NYRA STAKES CHANGES MAY ELIMINATE TRAVERS FROM ABC SCHEDULE

The New York Racing Association will offer a total of 147 stakes worth \$20,915,000 from the opening of the Belmont Park Spring meet May 1 through the end of 1996, but a change in the schedule could effect television coverage of the GI \$750,000 Travers. Traditionally held on the third Saturday in August, the midsummer classic will be moved to August 24, and a conflict in the ABC Sports schedule could preempt coverage of the event; the issue is still under discussion. Explained Steve Crist, NYRA's director of communications and development, "The problem is that ABC is committed to doing the Little League World Series from 3:30 to 6 p.m. on the 24th. (NYRA President) Kenny Noe has talked to (ABC President) Dennis Swanson several times and he gave us his blessing to run it on the 24th if that's what we thought was the best thing to do racing-wise. He said 'let me look at it,' and didn't rule out the possibility of dropping it into the Little League World Series telecast if he thought he could work it out. We are in no way violating our contract with ABC. The contract with ABC only says that the Travers will be run on a Saturday in August. It's traditionally been the next to last weekend of the meeting, and I think there's sentiment if you run it halfway through the meeting the meeting loses steam and momentum. If it's not on ABC, I'm not going to be surprised if it ends up on ESPN." Other changes in the schedule include purse increases for 27 stakes, including the Brooklyn (\$300,000), Suburban (\$500,000), Alabama (\$250,000), Beldame (\$400,000) and Frizette (\$400,000), and decreases for eight, including the Met Mile (\$400,000) and the Moet Champagne (\$400,000). "It's not like we wanted to reduce the purses of the Met Mile and the Moet Champagne, but we needed to bring up some of the other races...to maintain their pre-eminent positions," said Terry Meyocks, NYRA's vice president of operations. "In all, 27 races have had their purses increased while only eight have been lessened. That's a pretty good ratio. We have made a commitment to races for fillies and mares going long and on the turf...a number of those purses have been raised because they had been lagging behind the purses offered for their male counterparts and to remain competitive with other racing jurisdictions." In addition, the Gill Saranac has been moved to Saratoga; the Tempted and Nashua have returned to

the Aqueduct Fall schedule; and Saratoga's Daryl's Joy has been renamed the Fourstardave. The Roseben, Sagamore Hill and Clarinet King will not be run in 1996. The 1996 NYRA schedule begins with the Aqueduct Winter meet, Jan. 1-March 30, followed by Aqueduct Spring, April 1-April 28; Belmont Spring May 1-July 22; Saratoga, July 26-Sept. 2; Belmont Fall, Sept. 6-Oct. 20; and Aqueduct Fall, Oct. 23-Dec. 29.

BREEDERS' CUP MAY LOSE ANHEUSER-BUSCH SPONSORSHIP

The longtime sponsorship of Breeders' Cup events by the Anheuser-Busch Company, owners of Budweiser, may come to an end. Breeders' Cup Ltd. has overhauled its year-round stakes program for 1996, and is scheduled to announce before the end of this year that an \$11-million National Stakes Program will replace the \$6.1 million Special Stakes and Premium Stakes programs run in the past. According to Breeders' Cup Executive Director D.G. Van Clief Jr., Anheuser-Busch was not asked to participate in the new National Stakes Program, and was instead asked to sponsor a single race on Breeders' Cup Championship Day, an offer which Anheuser-Busch declined.

STROLLING ALONG HUMANELY DESTROYED

Strolling Along (Danzig) was humanely destroyed Thursday in Australia. The five-year-old stallion, who entered stud in 1995 at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky, was flown to Australia for the 1995 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. He was to stand at Australia's Newhaven Park Stud, but suffered from travel sickness and associated complications on the trip down and never made it out of the University Veterinary Clinic. Strolling Along won two races at age two, including the GI Futurity S. at Belmont. At age three he was switched to the grass, a surface over which he took the GIII Lawrence Realization S., also at Belmont. At age four in 1994, the dark bay won the Feb. 2 Noble Dancer H. and the Feb. 20 Gil Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H., both over Gulfstream's main track. He retired with six wins in 19 career starts and earnings of \$450,852.

ARLINGTON STAKES SCHEDULE AWAITS

APPROVAL The Illinois Racing Board has postponed a decision on Arlington International Racecourse's 1996 stakes schedule, but approval of the program is expected at the IRB's January 9, 1996 meeting. The proposed schedule features the return of the GII Arlington-Washington Futurity and GII Arlington-Washington Lassie, and the inaugural Arlington SummerFest, a one-day event including three graded races to be held July 21. The Futurity and Lassie were not run last year due to the track's abbreviated 55-day schedule. The 1996 meet, set for May 12 through October 13, offers 21 graded stakes over the 22-week season; every open stake will carry a purse of \$100,000 or more.

SummerFest consists of the \$300,000 American Derby, second leg of the Mid-America Triple, \$175,000 Equipoise Mile and \$125,000 Laurance Armour H. "By having three graded races in one day, we have the opportunity to present another world-class event that will generate more interest and more excitement for Thoroughbred racing," said Bill Thayer, Arlington's vice president of racing. The 1996 International Festival of Racing, August 24-25, will continue as the centerpiece of the meet. The six Festival stakes, worth \$2.35 million, are the \$100,000 Newbury H. at 1 1/16-miles on the grass and GI \$500,000 Beverly D. for fillies and mares going 1 3/16-miles on the grass August 24; and the \$100,000 Hanshin H. for the distaffers going a mile on the grass, \$150,000a Arlington Sprint Breeders' Cup H. at six furlongs, GI \$500,000 Secretariat S. for three-year-olds at a grassy 10 furlongs and the GI \$1,000,000 Arlington Million at the same distance August 25. "We have added the Arlington Sprint and increased the purse money for the Secretariat, Newbury and Hanshin to make the Festival even stronger and more competitive than before," said CEO Scott Mordell. The Secretariat, final race of the Mid-America Triple, is now the richest grass race for three-year-olds in the country; the series begins with the GII \$200,000 Arlington Classic June 30.

LEADING SIRE BROAD BRUSH ON ROAD TO RECOVERY

Graham J. Beck's Gainesway announced yesterday that **Broad Brush** (Ack Ack), the Leading Sire of 1994 by earnings, is making a full recovery from recent surgery for colic. Gainesway's Resident Veterinarian Dr. Norman Umphenour said, "We're very happy to report Broad Brush has regained his normal weight, has an excellent hair coat and has returned to regular paddock exercise. He will start the 1996 breeding season on schedule."

TURFWAY ANNOUNCES RECORD STAKES SCHEDULE

Turfway Park will offer a record \$1.6 million in stakes purses during its 1996 Winter/Spring Meet, headed by the GII \$600,000 Jim Beam S. for three-year-olds at 1 1/8-miles, to be run Saturday, March 30. Track officials announced yesterday they have increased purses for three of the races on the Jim Beam undercard. The purse for the six-furlong Queen Breeders' Cup for fillies and mares, ages four and up, has been raised from \$85,000-added to \$100,000-added. In addition, the purses for the Rushaway for three-year-olds at 1 1/16-miles and the Fairway Fun for fillies and mares, ages four and up at 1 1/16-miles have both been boosted from \$60,000 to \$75,000. Turfway Park's 1996 Winter/Spring Meet will run from January 1 through April 4. "With the quality of horses in our backstretch stable area, we look forward to an excellent racing season in 1996," said Richard S. Leigh, Turfway's racing secretary. "Our stakes races will offer many attractive opportunities for top horses stabled here, in the region and throughout the country."

MICHIGAN SIMULCAST BILL PASSED

The Michigan State Senate has approved a bill allowing extensive simulcast wagering at the state's racetracks. The bill will now be sent to Michigan Governor John Engler for his signature; Engler has in the past voiced his support for the measure. The bill, which also calls for the elimination of the state tax on live racing handle, passed the Senate by a margin of 33-2. Thoroughbred racetracks in Michigan include Ladbroke Detroit Race Course and Mount Pleasant Meadows.

AUSTRALIAN BREEDING AWARDS

ANNOUNCED The Australian Bloodhorse Breeders' Association recently announced three awards for the 1994-95 Australian Racing/Breeding Season. **Danehill** (Danzig) was named Champion Sire; **Lady Giselle** (Fr) (Nureyev) was named Champion Broodmare; and **Rave Report** (Aus) (Marsday {Aus}) was named Champion Australian-Based Two-Year-Old Sire. Danehill, a dual hemisphere stallion who stands the Northern Hemisphere breeding season at Coolmore Stud in Ireland, led all Australian sires last season (Aug. 1, 1994-July 31, 1995) in money earned and in number of Group 1 winners with five. Rave Report was second on the list of Leading First Season Sires in money earned, but his two-year-old colt Ravarda (Aus) won four stakes during the season, including the G1 Castlemaine S. Lady Giselle's son Baryshnikov (Aus) (Kenmare {Fr}) won the 1995 G1 Cadbury Australian Guineas.

CHURCHILL BOARD MEETS

At yesterday's quarterly meeting, the Churchill Downs Incorporated Board of Directors declared a regular annual dividend of \$0.50 per share on the common stock, payable January 12, 1996 to stockholders of record December 29, 1995. The Directors also approved \$1.6 million for capital improvements at Churchill Downs and its Indiana race-track, Hoosier Park. In addition to general improvements at both facilities, the \$1.6 million will fund expansion of the Kentucky Derby Marquee Village along the first turn at Churchill Downs, and the purchase of additional track equipment at Hoosier Park.

Local News, Finger Lakes:

According to a report in Friday's *Daily Racing Form*, five of the leading jockeys at Finger Lakes have been banned from riding at the upstate New York track during 1996. John Grabowski, the top rider for 1995; John Davila, number one in 1994; Robert Messina, Jorge Hiraldo and Pedro Castillo all received letters after Finger Lakes' closing-day card Tuesday which asked that they "not return (to Finger Lakes) for the live 1996 racing season." No reason for the ban was given, and it did not involve the track's stewards or the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. The report hinted at speculation that the decision was precipitated by the riders' refusal to ride after the first race Sunday and for the entire card Monday, which caused the cancellation of racing for two of the last three days of the meet.
