NEW DATE FOR 1996 BREEDERS' CUP Officials of Breeders' Cup Limited and The Ontario Jockey Club announced yesterday that the date of the 1996 Breeders' Cup Championship at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto has been changed to Saturday, October 26, one week earlier than originally scheduled. NBC Sports, which has televised all 12 runnings of Thoroughbred racing's \$10 million day, is now scheduled to air next year's Breeders' Cup Championship live from 1:30 p.m. to 6 p.m. EDT. NBC was able to accommodate a request by the Breeders' Cup when a change in the Notre Dame football schedule made the October 26 date available. The previously announced 1996 Breeders' Cup date was November 2. "Moving the Breeders' Cup from Standard Time to Daylight Savings Time will allow us the opportunity to start the first race after 1:30 p.m.," said James E. Bassett III, president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "This change will provide an additional half-hour of national television coverage and will also benefit our fans at simulcast facilities across North America. We appreciate NBC Sports' efforts to make this schedule adjustment. Both The Ontario Jockey Club and the Breeders' Cup feel the new date will greatly enhance the quality of the Championship event." George Hendrie, chairman of the Board of Trustees of the OJC, added, "The earlier date means we'll have a much greater chance of warm weather and a more enjoyable day for our fans."

CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING BOARD MEETS

Ralph Scurfield and Donald Valpreto were re-elected chairman and vice chairman, respectively, of the California Horse Racing Board by their fellow commissioners Friday. Scurfield, who was first appointed to the Board in 1991, has served as chairman since September, 1992. Valpreto, a Thoroughbred owner/breeder, has served 4½ years on the Board, the last three as vice chairman. In other business, the Board approved the Bay Meadows license for the first half of a split meet, from Jan. 24 through March 24, 1996, on condition the track achieves alternate methods of compliance with track safety rules, including replacement of the outer rail after the meet. The Board also authorized the distribution of \$515,000 to 86 beneficiaries by Hollywood Park Charities Inc., including \$15,000 to the Don MacBeth Memorial Jockey Fund and \$25,000 each to the Shoemaker Foundation and Winners Foundation.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has saddled three Hollywood Futurity winners, but none have been named champion two-year-old; **Hennessy** (Storm Cat) will try to change that stat. The winner of the GI Hopeful and the Gil Sapling S. has been second his last two starts--the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup--but Lukas feels a win in the Futurity could still mean an Eclipse for his colt. "Should he win Sunday--and he still has to get over that hurdle--I think he'll have the best record of any two-year-old," he said. "I guess the other top candidate would be Maria's Mon. They split their two races head-to-head, but Hennessy has...raced well on the East Coast and the West Coast, he has the most stakes wins and the most earnings."

The four-year-old has been on the board in 12 of her 16 career starts. "She's coming up to the race just fine," said Buzzy Tenney, assistant to McGaughey. "I thought her last race was really strong, considering it wasn't her optimum distance, and the two fillies that beat her (Twist Afleet and Chamosa Springs) are top class going a mile." The \$675,000 yearling purchase will try to give McGaughey his second straight in the race; his Tara Roma took the Ladies last year.

BOLD N' FLASHY TO PARK STUD Bold N' Flashy (Bold Ruckus), a stakes winner in Canada and the United States, has been retired and will stand the 1996 breeding season at Park Stud in Orangeville, Ontario. The six-year-old, a winner of 10 races and \$362,231, hit the board in six of eight starts this year but finished off the board in his last start, the Hollywood Turf Express November 24. Bold N' Flashy, who joins his sire at Park Stud, will stand for a fee of \$2,500 (Canadian), live foal.

SNOWSTORM CANCELS SUFFOLK CARD A storm that dropped three-to-five inches of snow on the Boston area Thursday and Friday caused cancellation of live racing at Suffolk Downs Friday. The track, which was open for simulcasting yesterday, is scheduled to resume live action this afternoon.

EMERALD DOWNS RECEIVES 1996 RACING DATES A new era in Washington Thoroughbred racing will begin Thursday, June 20, 1996 with the opening of Emerald Downs in Auburn, Washington. Racing dates have been granted by the Washington State Racing Commission; Emerald's inaugural 100-day meeting will run through November 4. Emerald Downs, under construction since May, is operated by Northwest Racing Associates with President Ron Crockett the lead investor. "The awarding of our 1996 racing schedule represents an important milestone for the entire industry," said Crockett. "The Racing Commission, Yakima Meadows, Playfair in Spokane, the breeders and horsemen all came together to support Washington racing." Live racing in western Washington was last conducted in 1992, with Longacres closing in September of that year after 59 years of operation. Emerald Downs will be open five days per week, Thursday through Monday, during its first season. Yakima Meadows was granted an extension of their current meeting and will race until June 10. Playfair's request for 1996 dates was tabled until further discussion among the three racing associations takes place.

The New York Racing Association yesterday discontinued transmission of "Race Day Aqueduct" to homes in New York City at 11:31 a.m., only to restore the television broadcast at 1:48 p.m. at the personal request of Senator Joseph Bruno and Mayor Rudolph Giuliani. The signal will continue until a meeting with all concerned parties is held early next week in Albany.

Senator William J. Larkin has been named the chairman of New York's new Senate Standing Committee on Racing, Gaming and Wagering. The Committee will meet for the first time next month.

Local News, Calder

For the first time in Calder's 25-year history, there will be no racing Christmas Day. (The only exception to that was when the 25th of December fell on a Sunday before Sunday racing was legalized in the state of Florida.) This year Christmas falls on a Monday, normally a racing day, and Calder will be closed. There will, however, be racing Wednesday, Dec. 27.

Local News: Finger Lakes

The ban on five Finger Lakes jockeys who had received letters asking them not to return for the 1996 meet has been lifted after a meeting between track management and Peter Bournias, local representative of the Jockeys' Guild, according to a report in today's *Daily Racing Form*. Jockeys John Grabowski, John Davila, Robert Messina, Jorge Hiraldo and Pedro Castillo were allegedly banned from Finger Lakes after refusing to ride because of the severe winter weather Sunday and Monday.

Local News, Gulfstream Park:

Pat Day, sixth on the all-time jockey money-winning list with earnings in excess of \$140,000,000, will ride full-time at the 1996 Gulfstream Park meeting. In recent winter seasons, Day was based at Oaklawn Park. Better climate and opportunities prompted the jockey to make Gulfstream his base of operations this winter, according to his agent Doc Danner.
