LAFFIT PINCAY JR. INJURED Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr., who will celebrate his 49th birthday December 29, suffered two broken ribs in a spill at Hollywood Park Sunday and will spend the holiday season on the sidelines. Pincay was unseated from two-year-old Kris's Intention (Kris S.) in Hollywood's fourth race when he was bumped while caught in tight quarters on the first turn. "Other than the broken ribs, he's o.k.," said agent Bob Meldahl. "He didn't have to stay at the hospital; he went home (Sunday) night. The doctors didn't give him a time limit on how long he'll be out, but off the top of my head, I'd say it will be two-to-three weeks."

GERMAN JOCKEY EQUALS EUROPEAN MARK

German champion jockey Peter Schiergen, 30, equalled the late Sir Gordon Richards' European record for number of winners in a season when successful on two mounts at Dortmund Sunday. Schiergen, riding Great Junction and Tschandu to victory on Dortmund's all-weather track, equalled Richards' all-time record of 269 wins which has stood since 1947; he has a fine chance of establishing a new mark when he rides at the final meeting of the German season Saturday. Schiergen heads for Hong Kong December 26 to ride in the colony for a month. He will be the first German jockey to be licensed to ride there, having been granted a guest jockey's license for January.

CALIFORNIA TRAINERS CLEARED IN

SCOPOLAMINE POSITIVES The California Horse Racing Board has ruled that the trainers who were fined for having horses which tested positive for Scopolamine last year were not responsible for the contamination, now deemed accidental, and will therefore have the previous judgements against them expunged from their records. Lewis Cenicola, James Grundy, Mark Hennig, Ron McAnally, Willard Proctor and Bill Shoemaker were fined \$500 each after having one horse test positive, and Richard Mandella was fined \$750 for two positives. The CHRB will make a formal announcement on the cases after all parties involved have been notified. **News cont. p2**

LA PREVOYANTE H.-GII, \$150,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 12fT Trainer Bobby Frankel will send the Juddmonte Farms homebred Interim (GB) (Sadler's Wells) from California for the mile-and-a-half contest. A stakes winner in two of her last three starts, the four-year-old filly travelled to Louisiana Downs to take the GIII River Cities Breeders' Cup October 1, then bounced back from an off-theboard showing in the GII Las Palmas October 15 to take the Waya S. at Hollywood December 2. Frankel said his runner would fly to Florida tonight, and that jockey Corey Nakatani would make the trip to ride Saturday.


Also expected for the La Prevoyante is Michele Zerolo's **Electric Society** (Ire) (Law Society). Trained by John Kimmel for her North American debut, the fouryear-old, a stakes winner in France, makes her first start since finishing sixth against colts in a listed French stakes October 8. The Irish-bred worked over the Calder turf Sunday, going five-eighths in 1:00 2/5.

Other probables are Group or Grade I stakes winners Danish (Ire) (Danehill), winner of the My Charmer in her last start; Northern Emerald (Green Dancer); and Market Booster (Green Dancer); and MGSW Alice Springs (Val de l'Orne {Fr}); as well as Sudana (Dahar), Tambien Me Voy (Orono), Aucilla (Relaunch), Miss Caerleona (Fr) (Caerleon) and Majestic Dy (Dynaformer).

STEEPLECHASING MAKES THE GRADE The National Steeplechase Association vesterday announced a new Graded Stakes Series for 1996. Like flat racing. the series will require a grading system for NSA open hurdle stakes. Nine existing races have been rated as Grade I, II or III for 1996, and nine others will have the opportunity to qualify for grading, if they receive purse increases to \$30,000 and apply to the NSA Graded Stakes Committee before the season begins in March. The five Grade I events, each worth \$100,000 or more. form the centerpiece of the series. The spring schedule includes two Grade I events, Georgia's Atlanta Cup April 6, and the Iroquois in Nashville, Tennessee May 11; Saratoga will host the GI New York Turf Writers Cup August 22; the fall Grade I's are the Grand National in Far Hills, New Jersey October 26 and the Colonial Cup in Camden, South Carolina November 10. In addition to the gradings, the NSA's open division will include a series and bonus system in 1996. The bonus will be funded by nomination fees; plans call for a bonus pool of \$25,000, payable to the first six point-earners. The NSA is looking for a series sponsor, which could increase the bonuses.

NUMBERS UP AT THISTLEDOWN Although on average figures for attendance and handle were slightly lower at the Cranwood Meet at Thistledown which concluded December 11, the track ended the 1995 season showing increases over 1994. Thistledown's 206-day season averaged 4,105 in daily on-track attendance, up less than 1 percent from a year ago, while overall daily handle averaged \$605,007, up 2.2 percent from 1994. Total handle for 1995 was \$124,631,492. and total attendance for the year was 845,534. The 50-day Cranwood meet had a daily average handle of \$563,373, down 4.2 percent from last season. Trainer Shirley Girten saddled 25 winners at the Cranwood Meet, picking up an unprecedented 13th straight Meet title as she completed her sweep of Thistledown's fourmeet season for the third consecutive year with 90 victories. Jockey Michael Rowland also completed a four-meet sweep, taking the Cranwood title with 43 wins and topping the Thistledown standings with 174 victories. Mark Yagour took home Owner of the Year honors after winning two of the four 1995 meets. Overall, Yagour had 36 winners and his runners earned \$268,689. Eustrophia Farms and M.Y. Stables tied for the Cranwood owner title with eight wins each. Rine's Hope (Mogambo) was named Thistledown's Horse of the Year with nine '95 tallies while bankrolling \$46,965. Thistledown opens for the 1996 season March 1.

Prepping for the GIII Tropical Park Derby on the grass January 2, **Old Chapel** (Dynaformer) breezed five furlongs over the Calder turf Sunday, going the distance in 1:01 3/5. The two-year-old took the GIII Generous S. at Hollywood in his last start.

Local News: Florida

John Pendray, who has logged some 60 years as a horseshoer in Florida, has been inducted into the International Horseshoeing Hall of Fame. Sponsored by the *American Farriers Journal* and the Kentucky Derby Museum, the program honors farriers who have made significant contributions to their profession. Bryan Howlett, manager of Tartan Farms, spearheaded the campaign to get Pendray nominated. "John Pendray was an invaluable part of our success at Tartan Farms over the years," he said. "He shod several generations of Tartan-breds, including all of our champions." Pendray also trained several generations of horseshoers, including his sons, grandsons and many apprentices.

Keeneland announced Monday morning that it will distribute contributions totaling \$335,589 for 1995 to charitable, educational and research organizations in the area. Checks were distributed to 57 organizations by Keeneland president Bill Greely and members of his staff during a program in the race course clubhouse. This most recent contribution brought Keeneland's total donations over the years to \$7.2 million. Greely also announced five multi-year commitments including a pledge of \$250,000 over a fiveyear period to the Saint Joseph Hospital Foundation. The money will be used to help fund construction of a health education center to be named in Keeneland's honor.
