RADIO AND TV ECLIPSE AWARDS ANNOUNCED

ABC has picked up its eighth Eclipse Award, garnering honors in the category of National Television Achievement for 1995. "ABC's Wide World Of Sports" earned the award for its depiction of the human drama of the Triple Crown through a variety of special segments and feature stories which were part of its Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont Stakes telecast. It is the network's fifth Eclipse Award in the last seven years. Honorable mention in the division went to a segment of the show "Thoroughbred World," the 1995 Belmont Stakes show produced by ABC's "Wide World of Sports" and a show entitled "Rosemary Junior" produced by "CBS News Sunday Morning." The Eclipse in the category of Local Television Achievement went to John Miglietta for his video portrait of trainer Leo O'Brien. The feature was part of "Stateside," a 1995 series on WNYC-TV in New York which examined the lives of the contemporary Irish in New York and Boston. Honorable mention went to Tony Allevalo for "Hollywood Park Live," Stephanie Croswait of WMAR-TV, Baltimore, for "Preakness Preview" and Julia McEvoy, a winner in 1991 in the radio division, for her story telecast on "The Chicago Racing Report." Racetrack announcer Victor Stauffer, currently calling races at Hialeah, Aksarben and the Woodlands, was awarded the 1995 Eclipse for Outstanding Radio Achievement for *Back in the Saddle*, an audio portrait of Jim Jordan, who made a successful comeback as a jockey after losing a leg in an accident. Receiving honorable mention in the radio category were five-time winner John Asher of WHAS for his story "The Mythical Armada Arrives" and Milton Metz of WHAS for "Derby Backside."

JOURNALISM RETIRED Trainer Wally Dollase reported yesterday that **Journalism** (Publicity) has been retired after suffering a fractured sesamoid in the Nov. 11 California Cup Mile H., in which he finished seventh. The seven-year-old gelding, winner of three graded stakes including the 1993 GII Shoemaker H. at Hollywood Park, retires with 15 wins from 34 career starts for earnings of \$656,420.

Transient Trend was stakes-placed in her last two starts. Her last outing was a third place finish in the GIII Honey Bee H. Nov. 17 at the Meadowlands. The filly saved ground near the back of the pack early in this race, moved out five wide for the stretch drive and took the lead under heavy urging. Her time for the mile and a quarter race set a new track record, besting the mark of 2:03 set by Canadian Factor in 1984. Anthony Jaccino, assistant to trainer Pat Kelly, said Transient Trend will enjoy a respite before continuing her racing career. "She's going South to freshen up and then she'll continue her campaign," Jaccino said. 7-5 favorite INCINERATE (Groovy) ran evenly to be sixth.

Alice Springs (Val de l' Orne {Fr}) will be making the final start of her career in the La Prevoyante. The mare, who has earned \$753,991 to date, is scheduled to be bred in the spring. In her last start, the five-year-old was third to La Prevoyante starter **Danish (Ire)** (Danehill) in the My Charmer H. The field for the La Prevoyante from the rail out is **Caromana** (Theatrical {Ire}), **Nellie Custis** (Val de l' Orne {Fr}), **Alice Springs**, **Mia's Hope** (Rexson's Hope), **Market Booster** (Green Dancer), **Sudana** (Dahar), **Electric Society (Ire)** (Law Society), **Interim (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), **Northern Emerald** (Green Dancer), **Danish (Ire)**, **La Turka** (Turkoman) and **Former Dancer** (Dynaformer). **It's Over** (Stop the Music) and **Librada's Brigade** (Bet Twice) are also eligible.

MALIBU S.-GI, \$150,000a, 3yo, 7f

Score Quick (Northern Score), winner of his last three starts including the GIII Lazaro S. Barrera H. at Hollywood Nov. 23, drilled five furlongs in a bullet :58 2/5 over Hollywood's fast main track Thursday. "He's as sharp as can be," said trainer Mel Stute. "Some people might be overlooking him, but not me." At Santa Anita yesterday, several possible Malibu starters worked five furlongs over a fast main track: **Paying Dues** (Cure the Blues) went in 1:00 3/5; **High Stakes Player** (High Brite) went in :59 4/5; and **Hoopstar** (Basket Weave) went in 1:02 3/5. Early probables for the race also include **Adams Trail** (Fast Play), **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms), **Lake George** (Vice Regent), **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister) and **Placid Fund** (Dixieland Band). Considered possible for the GI event are **Son of a Pistol** (Big Pistol) and **Testimony** (Never Tabled).

Tuesday, December 26, Bay Meadows:

CALIFORNIA JUVENILE S.-GIII, \$100,000, 2yo, 1m

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas reported yesterday that he will run Peter Mitchell's **Prince of Thieves** (Hansel) in the California Juvenile S. Prince of Thieves, who is out of 1994 Broodmare of the Year Fall Aspen and is thus a half-brother to this year's Preakness winner Timber Country, has raced only once before, winning a one-mile maiden special weight by 6 3/4-lengths at Aqueduct Nov. 11. Jerry Bailey rode the colt in his New York debut; Lukas has given the call to Shane Sellers for Tuesday's event. Also considered definite for the race are **E C's Dream** (Incinderator), **Far Easter** (Far Out East), **Jazzmanian Devil** (Jazzing Around), **Mateo** (Lil Tyler), **Mountain Skier** (Baldski), **Scholarship** (Fred Astaire) and **Tricky River** (Tricky Creek). **Avispao** (White Mischief) is a possible starter.

SOUTHERN HALO ARRIVES AT ASHFORD

Southern Halo (Halo) has arrived at Ashford Stud in Kentucky after standing at stud in Argentina since 1988. The 12-year-old stallion placed in three graded stakes during his racing career and retired in 1987 with earnings of \$344,875. Ashford Manager Barry Simon reports, "Southern Halo arrived in great shape and breeders are very welcome to inspect him. He has already attracted plenty of interest, as you expect with a stallion of his outstanding credentials. How many horses sire 21 graded stakes winners, including 11 Grade 1 winners, in their first four crops?" Southern Halo has sired 31 blacktype winners from 62 foals.

BREEDERS' CUP TO PRESENT HIRSCH WRITING AWARDS AGAIN IN 1996

Breeders' Cup Ltd. has announced it will present the second annual Joe Hirsch Breeders' Cup Writing Awards to a magazine writer and a newspaper writer for stories written about the 1995 Breeders' Cup Championship. The two awards will be presented in the week leading up to the 13th running of the Breeders' Cup, set for Oct. 26, 1996 at Woodbine Racecourse in Toronto. Entries must be published before January 1, 1996 and must be received by January 30, 1996. Last year's winners were Jay Hovdey (*The Blood-Horse*) and Jay Posner (*San Diego Union-Tribune*).

LAUREL SET TO REOPEN Officials at Laurel Park made plans for live racing to resume today following the loss of two race days this week due to inclement weather. "It's a go for Friday," John Passero, vice-president of turf and race courses announced Thursday after morning-long work on the racing strip by his crew and a look at a report from the track's private weather forecaster. "Horses trained for about three hours on it today," Passero said of the track. "As long as it doesn't get too cold again, we're all right."

AUTOTOTE ANNOUNCES YEAR-END RESULTS

Autotote Corporation announced Thursday financial results for the fourth quarter and the fiscal year ending October 31, 1995. Improved operations in the Company's core business segments and acquisitions from the first quarter of 1995 led to a 34.7 percent increase in service revenues from wagering systems in the fourth quarter as compared to last year. Operating revenues of \$153.2 million for the fiscal year increased 2.8 percent, compared to the year-earlier period, with recurring service revenues up 34.1 percent to \$132.3 million from \$98.6 million. Improved operating performance from core business segments, European lottery operations and acquisition-related revenues more than offset a 58.5 percent decline, to \$20.9 million, in equipment and other sales, principally international. The net loss for fiscal 1995 was \$49.9 million, or \$1.72 per share on 29 million shares outstanding, compared to a net loss of \$22.2 million, or \$0.79 per share on 28.2 million shares outstanding, in the year-earlier period, which includes an extraordinary charge of \$4.2 million for the write-off of deferred financing costs.

Five Gulfstream Park stakes races, headed by the \$500,000 Florida Derby, will be televised nationally during the track's upcoming 1996 meeting. The Gill Hutcheson S., which is expected to draw Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Unbridled's Song** (Unbridled), will be aired live from 4:30-5:30 p.m. EST on ESPN February 4; the \$300,000 Donn H., likely seasonal debut for **Cigar** (Palace Music) set for February 10, and the \$150,000 Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. scheduled for February 17, will be shown on ESPN2's "2Day At The Races;" the \$200,000 Fountain of Youth S. will be telecast live February 24 from 4:30-5:30 p.m. EST on ESPN; and ABC-TV will televise the GI Florida Derby Saturday, March 16 as part of "Wide World of Sports."

Gulfstream will present a "Salute to Jerry Bailey" opening day, Wednesday, January 3, honoring the Hall of Fame jockey in special ceremonies preceding the day's card. The rider will answer questions in a special session with the racing fans at the track's North Pad-dock at 11:15 a.m., and all patrons attending the races will receive an autographed photograph of Bailey.

Local News, Hollywood Park:

Wednesday's Pick Six payoff of \$764,489.80 was an all-time Hollywood Park record. Both winning tickets were purchased at the Del Mar satellite wagering facility.

Frank Mirahmadi, who has entertained racing fans throughout the country with his distinctive impressions of well-known race announcers, will call every other race during Sunday's closing day of Hollywood Park's Autumn Meeting. Mirahmadi, whose acclaimed impressions range from Trevor Denman to Mike Battaglia and the late Harry Henson, will alternate races with Hollywood Park's Ed Burgart.

Pharma (Theatrical {Ire}) breezed a half-mile in :51 at Santa Anita yesterday in a prep for Sunday's GI Dahlia H. for fillies and mares over the Hollywood Park turf.

Hollywood Park Charities Inc. has announced the presentation of \$515,000 in donations to non-profit organizations for 1995 with funds derived from charity racing days at Hollywood Park and donations from the racetrack. The 1995 grants, which were distributed to 86 California-based organizations, brought the total sum Hollywood Park has donated to various charities to approximately \$28 million since Hollywood Park Racing Charities, Inc. was formed in 1944. Among the largest endowments for 1995 were \$25,000 each to the Shoemaker Foundation and the Winners' Foundation and \$20,000 each to Centinela Hospital Foundation, International Life Services and Los Angeles Urban League.

Southern California-based jockey Corey Nakatani has been granted a temporary injunction for a five-day suspension that was scheduled to begin this Saturday. Steward Pete Pedersen said he had received notice of the injunction, which was issued Thursday by the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Los Angeles. Nakatani thus will be permitted to ride until a scheduled hearing Jan. 26.
