SANTAGATA INJURED IN AQUEDUCT SPILL

Jockey Nick Santagata was listed in "critical condition" after he was involved a three-horse accident during Aqueduct's first race yesterday. Santagata was taken to the Emergency Room at North Shore Hospital; according to Dr. Michael Kennedy, he suffered closed head injuries, chest trauma and multiple rib fractures. "We don't have the results of his CAT scan yet," said Kennedy. "But he is awake and alert. He will be admitted to the Trauma Service." The spill occurred after Santagata's mount, Time for Another, broke down and fell at the quarter pole; Gray Dawn Pixie, with jockey Rafael Mojica up, and Calais, ridden by Filiberto Leon, both collided with the fallen horse and went down themselves. Time for Another had to be put down, but both Mojica and Leon and their mounts were uninjured.

HIGH BRITE TO CALIFORNIA High Brite (Best Turn) has been purchased by John Zamora and has been relocated for the 1996 breeding season to Zamora's J Z Stock Farm in Temecula, California. The 11-year-old stallion, who formerly stood at Walmac Int'l in Lexington, Kentucky, is expected to arrive in California Dec. 30 and will stand for a 1996 stud fee of \$3,500 live foal. "We're looking forward to seeing him," said Richard Hayden, assistant manager of J Z Stock Farm. "He'll be a nice addition to the California stallion roster." High Brite, a MGSW of \$1,150,519, has sired seven stakes winners in his four crops to date, including Hyroglyphic, winner of the Dec. 16 \$100,000 Kenny Noe Jr. H. at Calder.

OJC TO RAISE TAKEOUT The Ontario Racing Commission Friday gave approval to the Ontario Jockey Club to raise its takeout for both Thoroughbred and harness racing, effective Jan. 1, 1996 for one year only. The OJC's current rate is 15 percent, but will jump by one percent at all track locations for winter Thoroughbred simulcast racing at the start of the new year. In addition, pending the start of net pool pricing which is expected to go into effect April 1, 1996, the rate will increase by the one percent at all OJC teletheaters on live racing and incoming simulcasts. The rate will jump by three percentage points at remote Ontario locations when net pool pricing starts.
