CALIFORNIA CLASSIC CROWN BONUS MAY **BE REDUCED** According to a story in Friday's Los Angeles Times, there is a possibility that the bonus for the California Classic Crown, given to any horse who wins the 1996 Santa Anita H., Hollywood Gold Cup and Pacific Classic, may be reduced from \$3 million to less than \$2 million. Owner Allen Paulson told the L.A. Times that he plans to run his top handicap horse Cigar (Palace Music) in the three-race series even if the bonus is reduced; Paulson also reiterated his intention to race Cigar in the \$4 million Dubai World Cup March 27. "They (the Maktoums, ruling family of Dubai) have promised to fly Cigar from Florida nonstop," Paulson told the L.A. Times. "They want him badly over there. I don't see why we can't run at Santa Anita (March 2) and in Dubai. There's 24 days between races." The reason for the probable reduction of the bonus is the difficulty in finding an insurance company willing to bet against Cigar. "I hear that the bonus might become \$1.8 million," Paulson continued. "I don't want to be greedy. Whatever they do should be fine. But they should remember how popular this horse is. Any track will sell out if he runs. The tracks would make their money back that way."

HOLLYWOOD PARK AUTUMN MEET

CONCLUDES The 30-day, 1995 Hollywood Park Autumn Meeting concluded Sunday. Daily average ontrack handle of \$2,075,291 was down 4.6 percent from last year, when the meeting lasted 34 days. However, total handle from all sources, including on-track, intertrack, out-of-state and separate pool wagering, averaged a record \$9,987,253 daily, up 11.2 percent from last year's \$8,980,998. On-track attendance averaged 9,287 per day, down three percent from the 1994 Autumn Meeting, while combined attendance of both ontrack and inter-track patrons averaged 22,362 daily, down 4.8 percent from a year ago. Alex Solis took the riding title with 31 wins from 168 mounts; Bobby Frankel led the trainers standings with 15 victories from 35 starts for a win percentage of 43.

Afternoon Deelites breezed through his first five career starts undefeated, winning the GI Hollywood Futurity and Gill Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup at two and the GII San Felipe S. and GIII San Vicente Breeders' Cup at three. The dark bay colt then finished second by a head to Larry the Legend in this year's GI Santa Anita Derby before an eighth-place showing in the May 6 Kentucky Derby. Returning from a 7½-month layoff here as the 4-5 favorite, the West Virginia-bred showed his class. After being bumped lightly at the start, he saved ground in seventh down the backside, moved up inside on the turn, angled out into the stretch and unleashed a powerful rally to prove clearly best under a light tap of the whip and a hand ride. "He's an amazing horse," said winning jockey Kent Desormeaux, who has ridden Afternoon Deelites in all eight of the colt's career starts. "You just aim him in the right direction and every question you give him, he answers it. I thought he was much more mature than before the time off." Trainer Richard Mandella added, "I've always thought that as long as he is healthy and sound, he has no limits. It's just a matter of keeping him healthy and sound. What a great Christmas present to have him back. My only concern when we came out of the paddock was, 'I hope his heart isn't beating as hard as mine." Mandella wasn't sure what's next for Burt Bacharach's colt. "The San Fernando Stakes (Jan. 13) is too close," Mandella said. "We won't even give that a lot of thought. Maybe the Strub (Feb. 4)? But who knows? There's no ultimate goal. We just want him back."

PRIME SPORTS TO TELEVISE "SANTA ANITA TODAY" IN 1996 Santa Anita Park and Liberty Sports have announced that they will broadcast and distribute 11 top stakes races from Santa Anita Park weekend afternoons throughout the 1995-96 season. Yesterday's joint announcement came on the opening day of Santa Anita's 87-day winter/spring meeting. Under the name "Santa Anita Today," the 11 shows will be produced for Liberty Sports by Santa Anita Park and will include many of the track's biggest races, including three Grade I events--the March 10 Santa Margarita Invitational H., March 24 San Luis Rey S. and April 22 San Juan Capistrano Invitational H. The series of shows will be distributed by many of Liberty's "Prime Sports" networks throughout the world, including Prime Sports West in Southern California, "We are very pleased to have many of our top races showcased on Prime Sports," said Santa Anita Park President Clifford C. Goodrich. "Prime Sports is the leading sports broadcaster in Southern California and it is a natural home for Santa Anita Park." The half-hour shows will be hosted by veteran Southern California sportscaster Bill Seward and Santa Anita's Kurt Hoover, with analysis by handicapper Jeff Siegel. Santa Anita's track commentator Trevor Denman will call the action. Amy J. Zimmerman will serve as executive producer and director with Michael Ewing producing. In addition to Prime Sports West, "Santa Anita Today" currently has secured commitments to be telecast to over five million subscribers

of Prime Sports Southwest, a Liberty Sports sister network covering Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and New Mexico. Additional significant distribution to Liberty's other regional and international networks is anticipated and will be announced as programming schedules are finalized.

CT OTB DISCONTINUES PHONE WAGERS IN 27 STATES Connecticut OTB has stopped accepting phone wagers from 27 states which have not passed phone-wagering legislation. The organization will continue to accept wagers from major racing states such as New York, Kentucky, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Louisiana. CT OTB was apparently concerned that the organization was not abiding by the Federal Wire Act of 1962 and will continue to accept wagers only from those states which have phone wagering legislation in place.

MARYLAND MILLION NOMINATIONS DUE The deadline for nominating Maryland-sired foals for lifetime participation in Maryland Million racing events is December 31, 1995. For yearlings (foals of 1994) sired by nominated stallions and not previously nominated as weanlings, a fee of \$600 is required by Dec. 31. There are no supplementary nominations to the Maryland Million program. With yearlings for whom a provisional fee was paid in 1994, a final payment of \$200 is due by Dec. 31 to fully nominate them. Dec. 31 also serves as the deadline for foals of 1995--a provisional fee of \$100 or \$250 to fully nominate--and for stallions for the 1996 breeding season. OHIO THOROUGHBRED RACE FUND

ANNOUNCES CUTS Members of the Ohio Thoroughbred Advisory Committee, following input from the Ohio State Racing Commission, announced changes for the 1996 Ohio Thoroughbred Race Fund (OTRF) Program. Expenditures were based upon a projected 12 percent decline in Thoroughbred handle next year, along with a five percent drop in Standardbred wagering. Projected deficits required the adoption of new budget recommendations in order to bring the fund into balance for 1996. Among the cuts in the program next year are a \$200,000 reduction in broodmare awards, a \$50,000 reduction in stallion awards and a \$227,750 reduction in the stakes program by cutting the Best of Ohio Stakes purses by \$125,000. All \$100,000 Best of Ohio purses for 1996 have been reduced to \$75,000. Overall. OTRF expenditures are estimated at \$4.06 million next year, approximately \$1 million less than in 1995.
